As you know, our 19/20 league season ended abruptly in March, in line with the English Football Association's (our Governing Body) direction that all football activity is null and void for the season. We were, however, given authority when football returned, to complete our Cup Competitions. Four competitions on our return to football in September were completed and I am extremely grateful to all those involved for their hard work, which enabled us to finish the 19/20 Season in such good order. Thanking all those Officials, Players, Volunteers and Sponsors who help deliver and playing the 'Beautiful Game' is important. I know too that the Chief of the General Staff, General Sir Mark Carleton-Smith, is disappointed not to be able to thank everybody in person this year. As our President he knows all too well the critical role you all play in our enduring success. We will re-schedule in 2021.

On a more positive note, it is testament to the enthusiasm and dedication of all those within Army Football that we have managed to commence 2020/21 with Corps leagues and unit competitions underway in October. The second lockdown has created further challenges but, with the support and guidance of our team, we will work to ensure that we can continue once we are permitted to do so and create viable, competitive leagues & competitions for all.

So, please look after yourselves, football is paused not cancelled and we will play again when conditions allow, Once again thank you to all, for your continued support to Football in the Army; without you we would not have The Soldiers' Game.

OUR COVID-19 GUIDE TO CORPS AND REP TEAM FOOTBALL OFFICERS FOR ASCB AUTHORISATION OF MATCHES

- Home Team to send Admin Instruction and Risk Assessment for both teams to be sent to the Army FA 14 days before the date of the match.
- Home Team Risk Assessment to include venue match being played at.
- Away Team Risk Assessment for playing away games.
- Admin Instruction for maximum of two days i.e. one Meet and Training Day and one Match Day.
- Admin Instruction to include a maximum number of 22 Players and Staff combined.
- No Training Camps permitted.
- No Friendlies permitted.



CHANGES MAY BE MADE AT ANY TIME DUE TO GOVERNMENT LEGISLATION/GUIDANCE.

This will then be sent to the ASCB Ops Team for approval and authorisation by Director, ASCB ten days before the match.

PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING ASCB DIRECTIVE:

If the event location is subsequently included within a locally constituted lockdown area, or locality, or is subject to additional restrictions directed by the Government or local authority, then you must report the matter to the Army FA/ASCB (opsbranch@ascb.uk.com) and the event will be reviewed and, if it cannot be moved/relocated, then it is likely it will be de-authorised.

Individuals are to seek authority from their CO as to whether they are content for them to participate in a fixture or sporting event if they will be travelling from or through, or are residing in an area or region that is subject to additional COVID-19 restrictions imposed by the Government or local authority.

ASCB will continue to monitor Government guidance.



What Happens if a Player Test Positive for Covid 19.

- If a player tests positive, or if they have symptoms they must self-isolate from that point. The player must contact NHS 111. NHS Track and Trace will pick up from this point.
- The Club can carry on, but be mindful to ensure all the guidelines are strictly followed, on social distancing, hand washing etc. If Track and Trace contact a player, they must provide the details and then if deemed anyone needs to isolate this will be on Track and Trace instruction.
- Match play is not considered "close contact" so no action is needed unless individuals experience symptoms, in which case they must self-isolate from that point as per Government Guidelines.
- The Club are to inform the opposition, match officials and Army Football, if, and when a player tests positive. Both teams are to ensure the CoC of all players are informed.
- The Club is also asked to monitor further positive increases.







We were delighted to be able to maintain a record of completing every Army Challenge Cup competition (outside of the two World Wars and Boer War in 1899/00) since 1889. One of the oldest football cup competitions In the world the prestige of winning the trophy remains one of the highest accolades for an Army footballer.

When lockdown halted football in March there were still quarter final ties to be completed and a decision could have been made not to proceed. We are appreciative of all those teams who were flexible to ensure that the outstanding matches could be played within a couple of weeks in order to determine the final was ready to stage at the end of September.

With the Aldershot Military Stadium out of bounds due to maintenance work being undertaken we were grateful to Chris Fowke and all at Army Rugby Union for permitting the final to be staged at the excellent facilities next door to the home of Armu football.

7 Regiment RLC, based in Cottesmore were the victors with a convincing 4-0 victory versus Minley based 3RSME ensuring that they lifted the trophy for the third time in six seasons. The highlight of the day was the third goal as **OWEN KARAU** caught goalkeeper Dean Love off his line from close to the left hand edge of the halfway line. It was the goal that sealed the victory after early first half goals from **MATTHEW GREEN** and St Lucian **RAWLINS FERDINAND**. 7 Regt captain and Army player **SEAN WOOLLEY** netted a late fourth goal before lifting the cup.

Karau was also awarded the Man of the Match, chosen by Forces TV's commentator for the day Jon Knighton and Guest Summariser, Army FA Ambassador Sgt Yvette Kemp.

A new football venue in Bicester Garrison hosted two outstanding 2019/20 Cup finals for the Army FA in September. A football pitch converted in seven days saw the Womens Corps Edwards Challenge Cup Final (covered on page 12) followed by the mens Minor Unit Final as The Armoured Centre created history lifting the trophy for the third successive season in a 3-0 success v 34 Field Hospital.

New Trustee Lt Col Alex Atherton provided the post match congratulations before captain WO2 Danny Sumner lifted the trophu.

With the winners being based in Bovington and 34 Med travelling from York the Army FA were keen to find a suitable location as near as halfway as possible. Bicester provided the perfect fit.

An even first half saw both sides created chances but changes made after the interval by Armour manager Sean Everiss paid dividends as a comprehensive performance saw goals from Danny Hulme, Mark Greenhalgh and Garry Roberts put the contest out of reach for the medics. Roberts' strike from all of 25 yards sealed the match.

Speaking to Forces TV afterwards captain Sumner said, "On the coach on the way to the match we looked at the trophy and noticed that no team had won it three times in a row. To achieve this makes us immensely proud and created a touch of history. We'd like to be back next year to defend the trophy again."

IT'S SAPPER TIME!

In a reverse of the 2018/19 final **ROYAL ENGINEERS** were the winners of the delayed 2019/20 Woolwich Cup Final beating Royal Signals 2-1 in Aldershot.

The match was one of the targeted competitions selected by the Army FA for completion as Covid-19 halted football in March. Despite the structural work being undertaken to the Aldershot Military Stadium stand and a six month gap since a match had previously been played at the home of Army football tremendous flexibility all round enabled the match to be played.

Signals started stronger and Army keeper Luke Cairney proved busy between the sticks for the Sappers.

After soaking up plenty of pressure the Engineers did take the lead when Sam Atkinson saw his acrobatic strike creep over the line from Jay Hubbard's free kick. Hubbard extended the lead after taking advantage of a quick clearance from Cairney to Dan Stonemans who lined the ball from the right into the path of Hubbard who slotted home from close range. The previous six time winners of the trophy were in command at the interval.

There was drama after the break when Signals were awarded a penalty. Cairney made a fine save from Kevin Cameron's kick only for the referee to award a re-take having deemed Cairney of moving off his line. It was duly converted. Cairney stood firm after the goal with a string of fine saves which was enough to see the Sappers through to victory.



Cpl Craig Stevenson, RE captain told Forces News afterwards, "This is absolutely brilliant. I've been fortunate to lift the trophy before, and it's just nice to do it again. Signals won it last time so it's nice to get it back into our trophy cabinet".







2020/21 MASSEY TROPHY



The original plan of completing four of the 2019/20 cup competitions by the end of September had proved successful with the Major and Minor Units Cups plus Men and Womens Corps cups.

This was always with the intent of being able to embark on the 2020/21 campaign in early October. To this three Massey Trophy matches were lines up on 2nd October. With the latest lockdown commencing on 5th November it will have an effect on the Massey and Woolwich Cup planning moving forwards. Indeed 10 league and cup matches will be cancelled during the lockdown period with a potential issue of an additional seven matches in December, dependant on government, FA and ASCB directive. Once the Army FA is aware of the guidance we will look at how to address this situation moving into 2021.

It was, of course, good to get some corps football back up and running. Nine matches were eventually played before Lockdown 2. On the opening day Infantry put aside their disappointment of last season's competition being "null and voided" with a comprehensive 5-0 victory v RLC at the Aldershot Queens Avenue 3G facility. Cpl Adam Wakley netted a hat-trick. Last season would have been concluded with a winner take all final day match v Royal Engineers. The recently crowned Woolwich Cup winners for 2020 have started the season with a 2-0 success at home to REME in Chatham

followed by a 1-1 draw at the RLC new home at the 4G Tilsley Park in Abingdon. REME recorded their first win of the season with a 3-1 success v Royal Signals at Beversbrook Sports Facility in Calne.

In Division 2 Royal Artillery, who won six of their seven matches last season prior to the March suspension, have commenced the season in good form. A 2-1 success versus RAC was followed up with a 2-0 win at Army Medical Services. RAPTC opened their campaign in new surroundings at the Aldershot Army Rugby Stadium. An entertaining affair saw goals from Sgt (SI) Glass (2), WO2 (QMSI) Baily and SSgt (SSI) Crossett confirm a 4-0 victory v AMS.


12 Regt RA Gnr Ornelas scored a fine header for Royal Artillery in a 6-0 win at the Int Corps.

2019/20 INTER SERVICES CANCELLATION AND 2020/21 DATES

Every effort was made by the three Single Services and UKAF to complete the 2020 Inter Services that was halted due to COvid-19 in March after the Army Men had defeated RAF (1-0) at Shrewsbury Town FC whilst the Womens match produced the reverse at Cosford.

Extensive planning and discussions ensured that new dates were confirmed for early and late November for the completion of the Royal Navy v RAF and Army v Royal Navy matches.

Ironically on the opening day of Lockdown 2 the Army and Royal Navy were due to be concluding the mens tournament in Aldershot.

Once Prime Minister Boris Johnson announced to the nation that a new Lockdown would be enforced in England commencing on 5th November further discussions continued via Zoom and the only conclusion to be reached was the cancellation of the tournament.

The statement issued said, "Regretfully, the UK Armed Forces Chairman and the three Single Services have cancelled the 2019/20 Inter Services competition because of the inability of the competition to complete due to Covid-19 restrictions.

Further to the RAF v Army fixtures (Men and Women) that were played back in March 2020 it was hoped to complete the Men's competition this week with the Royal Navy v RAF due to be played on Monday and the Army v Royal Navy playing on Thursday whilst the Women were due to play w/c 30 November 20.

All options have been investigated to complete the competitions (Men and Women) and the decision

to cancel has not been taken lightly. Previous 2019-20 Inter Services results will be expunged. The three Single Services will plan the 2020/21 Inter Services competition in the New Year.

The U23s Inter Services was completed in February 2020 and is unaffected."

UK ARMED FORCES COVID-19 UPDATE

The Chairman of the UK Armed Forces FA, Air Cdre Simon Harper OBE MA RAF provides an update with regards to the UKAFF situation following the second national lockdown:

Since lockdown in March this year, UKAFF has worked tirelessly to resume football in a safe, timely and COVID-19 compliant manner. In close consultation with the UK Sports Board, single Service Sports Boards and single Service FAs, as well as the Head of Establishment with our partners at HMS Temeraire, we have led the work to revise and re-write Safety Management Plans, Risk Assessments, and create a pathway to resume football.

Our plans have been highlighted as best practice across the football community and I am incredibly proud that we have focused on what matters most – the safety, well-being and health of our players, coaches and officials. This has been a long, difficult and at times frustrating process and I recognise the exceptional work undertaken by so many.

By setting the example and leading the way, we have proved that it is possible to deliver football safely and the fact that the RN, Army and RAF Rep Teams were able to play some football until very recently is in no small part down to the work of UKAFF.

As a result of the lockdown measures in place across the UK, and the decision to instigate a second national lockdown across England from Thursday 2nd November, I have taken the very difficult decision to cancel all UKAFF activity for the foreseeable future and, with colleagues from the RN, Army and RAF, cancel this year's Inter-Service competitions; while I regret having to make such a decision the COVID-19 situation has made it inevitable. Your patience, professionalism and commitment to UKAFF has been both inspiring and humbling.

We will continue to work hard to re-start UKAFF activity as soon as it is safe and practical to do so. There is nothing better than representing UKAFF and your country. I look forward to seeing UKAFF on the pitch as soon as possible and ready for a busy and important 2021.

It has been a difficult opening to the season for Women's football, as experienced by every section of Army Football. The cancellation of the 2019/20 Inter Services was confirmed in early November and, in line with the second lockdown, no football was permitted between 05 November and 02 December. All postponed fixtures will be re-scheduled by my Director of Football, Maj Mark Normanton in consultation with the Army FA. However, bearing in mind the number of matches (both male and female) which need to be rearranged, all of whom bid from the same pool of Referees, we need to organise this centrally to avoid clashes. Dates will be promulgated in due course.

We attempted to arrange training camps for both the Women's Senior and Amazons Development teams and, despite both being in advanced stages of planning, they all had to be postponed due to the pandemic. Thank you to everyone involved, I really appreciate your efforts and know how frustrating this has been but we now need to look for suitable dates in the New Year to run the camps.

Without volunteers within Army Football we would struggle to achieve what we do. LT COL SANDRA HODGSON has been an integral part of Army women's football since attending trials in the late 1990's. From initially playing Sandra, after a discussion with current Football Development Manager Steve Stone, completed her Level 1 and 2 badges in quick succession and became Army Head Coach in 2006 enjoying a successful nine years in the role experiencing regular victorious Inter Service competitions.

After handing over to her Assistant, W01 Mags McAteer in 2015, Sandra moved into the role of Team Manager and continued to work tirelessly behind the scenes to enable Women's football. Unfortunately, the combination of her current involvement with the Covid-19 Taskforce and the fact that she is retiring from the Army next year has forced Sandra to make the big decision to step down from her role. She will be missed; I have never known Army football without Sandra!

Also stepping down after years of dedicated service to Women's football is **WO2 HELEN LEE**. Helen made her debut for the Army in 1998 as a 17 year old before going on to represent the Army over 50 times. When she retired in 2014 Helen joined the administration team as the Secretary and even though I have only had the pleasure of working with her for a short period I have been incredibly impressed by her dedication, organisational skills and passion for the game. As she is also nearing retirement she has quite rightly made the hard decision to hand over the reins in order to concentrate on her resettlement. She has made a big impact on the development of Army Women's football and like Sandra will be hugely missed.

We are also saying goodbye to **SSGT LEE CARTER** who left the Army in Sept. Lee got involved with football after being asked by Mark, my Director of Football, to give him a hand with some admin for a game. After that he became an integral part of the team and even though he is not a footballer, Lee enjoys enabling others to do what they love and I am hugely grateful to him for the support he has given to football within the Army.

And finally, for the REME Team Manager SGT PETE SHAW the delayed Edwards Challenge Cup Final in September was his final match after serving REME football as a player/coach and manager for 23 years. In addition, the RA are losing WO2 RON EUGENE who has been their female Coach for four years after representing both the Gunners and the Army as a player. Good luck to you both as you leave the Army and thank you for everything you have given to the beautiful game!

All of the above will be formally recognised at the appropriate time when Covid-19 rules become more flexible. Their dedication, energy and passion for the game has enabled and developed female football in the Army and we are forever grateful for their tremendous contribution over many years.

In summary, I just want to say thank you to everybody who continues to hard work to enable our female officers and soldiers to play football. It is not easy in the current climate and I know it is hugely frustrating to see all your hard work and efforts come to nothing when we have to postpone games, cancel training and stop friendly matches but unfortunately this is the nature of the beast at the moment and one we just have to deal with. Please rest assured that myself, my Director of Football and our new Inter Corps League Secretary Capt Caz Mantell will work alongside the Army FA staff to try and assist wherever we possibly can.











It was good to see the Army FA Football Development Centre back in use in September and October for FA Level 2 Blocks. Unfortunately the proposed Block 3 module in mid November was another Covid-19 casualty. In line with the suspension of grassroots and non- elite football, face to face coach education courses will also be cancelled until post December 2nd.

In order to comply with FA and Government guidance stringent stipulations were put in place by Football Development Manager Steve Stone and Administrator Gill Jones to ensure the course, with a reduction in numbers of a maximum of 12, could go ahead after receiving the required authority from the ASCB.

There are currently many changes occurring within the FA Education Department that will effect how courses are operated in 2021 and we will update and advise as soon as we are in a position to do so.







FOOTBALL DEVELOPMENT

As you may now be aware the FA have decided to take all courses in house and change the delivery format from March next year. The new coaching pathway is still being developed but will look something like:

FA Playmaker (on line) - FA Safeguarding (online) - FA EAIF (on line) - Level 1 certificate (on line) - UEFA C Licence (part on line) - UEFA B Licence (Format TBC) - UEFA A Licence (Format TBC),

There may still be some form of specialist qualifications in Youth football, Goalkeeping, and FUTSAL but as yet not confirmed.

Any learners who are still to complete qualifications are termed "in flight learners" and the FA are in the process of putting together a plan to get these learners through the course they are registered on.

This may give us an opportunity to develop our own coaching support/mentoring/education



It has been a similar story for Army Referees due to Covid-19 restrictions so far this season. Indeed, it will be more than a calendar year by the time we are able to resume referee courses. Two courses were cancelled towards the back end of 2019/20. We aimed to resurrect two courses in Catterick for October and November but decided to cancel which, in hindsight, was a wise decision due to lockdown 2. We will be looking at announcing new dates by early 2021.

The ramifications of having approximately 80 personnel interested in becoming a referee and not being able to attend courses is severe. It will have a knock-on effect for a period as we have less officials entering into our system and, ultimately, after completing their first five matches to reach Level 7 then embarking through the promotion process.

Encouragingly, though, 40 Army officials have applied for promotion within their specific level and we are currently administering their packages which is, of course, a tall order due to the stop/start

element to the season due to Covid-19. The FA have revised the criteria in recognition to this which is supportive. Already two officials, Dan Bishop (6/5) and Barrington Ellison (7/6) have already completed their initial package allowing them to be considered for the next level.

There are challenges within the Tutor system with the FA revamping their own criteria with regards to Referee courses moving forwards. We will be in a better position to know how this effects the Army FA by the early part of 2021.

With four delayed cup finals of 2019/20 being played in September and October it was the appropriate opportunity for officials to be recognised with appointment to those matches. It was not an easy process and all officials had to comply with the Covid-19 regulations. This included three officials for the Army Challenge Cup Final, played at the Aldershot Army Rugby Stadium in September, travelling down from Catterick in full kit, arriving at the stadium by taxi and masks in tow!

We have 180 registered officials currently and we have been blessed with some excellent civilian appointments so far from the FA Youth Cup through to the FA Cup. Cpl Dec O'Shea (REME), the youngest soldier to referee the Army Cup Final as a 26-year-old in 2017, officiated in the Emirates FA Cup 1st round tie, shown on BBC Digital, between Banbury Utd and Canvey Island. In the FA Vase Army FA stalwart Major Rim Rimmington MBE (RLC) celebrated his 60th birthday weekend by being appointed to the FA Vase 2nd qualifying round tie between Fleet Town and Shrivenham. Rim successfully completed his referee course in 2009, just short of his 50th birthday, progressing through to a Level 5 Referee.

WO1 Ash Allen (RAPTC), who refereed the 2018 Army Challenge Cup Final, has been appointed to the England Under 18 v Coventry City U23 friendly at St Georges' Park in November. It has also been encouraging to view the progress of former Army officials too. Declan Ford (ex REME), who refereed the 2006 Army Cup Final, has recently completed 300 professional matches and officiated in the FA



Cup tie between Hull City and Fleetwood Town; he is in his 15th season as a Football League official whilst Rob Dabbs (ex Int Corps) was 4th official at the recent FA Cup first round tie at Torquay Utd which saw a bizarre 6-5 win for visitors Crawley Town. It is also great to see another ex REME official, Kenwyn Hughes, progress. Coming up through the Army ranks he has been appointed to the English Football League list this season and officiated in the FA Cup 1st round at the tie between Scunthorpe Utd and Solihull Moors.

2021 will be a big year for Army Referees as we rise to the challenges that Covid-19 has provided.







Black History Month takes place every October. The British Army supports the annual celebration of the role of black people in our nation's story.

During the month coverage was provided highlighting the experiences of the many black soldiers who have served in our ranks and telling the stories of some of those who are currently serving through the British Army website.

One of those featured was Army Mens footballer **Captain Mo Sabo (27 Regiment RLC)**. Mo was taken to English Football League club Northampton Town FC to learn about Walter Tull, one of the first black professional footballers and Army officers.



Ironically Walter was born in Folkestone just two weeks after the formation of the Army Football Association in April 1888. His father, Daniel, was the son of a slave arriving in England from Barbados in 1876. He married Alice Palmer and had five children. Alice sadly died and Daniel, after remarrying and the arrival of another child, died from heart failure in 1897. Walter and his brother Edward were farmed out to a Methodist Orphanage in Bethnal Green.

After winning the FA Amateur Cup with Clapton neighbouring Tottenham Hotspur took an interest in Walter and he eventually signed for a £10 signing on fee and maximum £4 per week wage. Verbal abuse from opposing crowds, however, affected Walter's form and he spent much of his time in the reserves. Herbert Chapman, who went on to be one of the most influential and successful managers of the 20th century, signed Walter whilst managing Northampton Town in 1911; Walter went on to make over 100 appearances for the Cobblers.

The declaration of war saw Walter enlist with the 17th Middlesex Regiment in December 1914. Promoted to L/Sgt Walter was involved in the July 2016 Somme offensives. In March 1917 he was commissioned. On 25 March 1918 he was hit in No

Mans Land in Favreuil, France and died instantly from a bullet in the head.

In July 1999 Northampton Town FC erected a monument in Walter's memory outside their Sixfields Stadium. It reads:

"Through his actions WDJ Tull ridiculed the barriers of ignorance that tried to deny people of colour equality with their contemporaries. His life stands testament to a determination to confront those people and those obstacles that sought to diminish him and the World in which he lived. It reveals a man, though rendered breathless in his prime, whose strong heart still beats loudly. This memorial marks an area of reflective space as a Garden of Remembrance."



The approach road to Sixfields Stadium is called Walter Tull Way. 28 year old Capt Sabo, who also plays football for Isthmian League South Central division club Westfields FC, was joined by Historian Alex Churchill, to learn more about the history of Walter, as a footballer and officer. He said, "Walter Tull was a great man in Black History. He paved the way for future black officers to join the British Army.

"What I have learnt most about Walter Tull that I can apply and use going forward is very much leadership by example and that resilience. For Walter, obviously starting out as a soldier, he deployed out initially very much leading by example and it was that performance and bravery and everything else that then earnt him the recommendation to become an officer and literally lead by the front during the war.

"For me it is really important that we understand where we have come from, to use that and appreciate where we are today plus how we use that and learn lessons from that going forwards. "It is slightly mixed emotions for me in that anything that raises awareness of black history and encourages people to learn about black history is fantastic and that is what black history month is there to do but the fact that there is a dedicated black history month, I think says that we are probably not doing enough at the minute, whether that is in schools or through other means to learn about that black history which is a shared history for everyone."

COVID-19 UPDATE FROM COL DAVID JONES

INTRODUCTION

I have been involved in football in the Army Reserve as a representative player, player / coach / manager of Unit teams, Army FA Trustee and Chairman of Army Reserve Football for many years and so I have seen the highs and lows. However, Covid 19 has brought unprecedented challenges to football and to our nation, as a whole.

Covid 19 and the restrictions that surround it is causing "Football in the Army Reserve" some significant issues. Although a green light to return to football and football training was provided pre Lockdown 2, as authorised by Army HQ and Army Sport Control Board [ASCB] there are some issues evolving that puts football in the Army Reserve at real risk and the individuals and teams participating.

CURRENT SITUATION / ISSUES AND CONCERNS

CONTEXT

Army Reserve football is a different beast than our Regular component, focused on weekend based activities and geographically nationally spread in all four countries of the UK, with potential cross border travel. These potential movements are causing unacceptable risks and also with recent regional lockdowns; different nations approaches has resulted in some real difficulties to co-ordinating efforts. Therefore, there are real challenges, at all levels.

ARMY RESERVE CHALLENGE CUP

We have made the draw for the 20/21 Season Challenge Cup however teams are already struggling to set up the matches due to restrictions, as AR football is a national organisation. Feedback from teams in Wales and Scotland have indicated that they cannot play at the moment, teams in England are struggling due to local lockdowns and

concerns that they cannot fulfil the additional steps required for COVID-19. We are already into October, only one fixture is confirmed and that is between two UOTC sides, Exeter and Oxford, and as we know universities are to the forefront of the Covid challenge. Two teams have already had to withdraw - referencing COVID as the reason. So going forward the Challenge Cup is facing difficulties, with the number of teams reducing and possible further national / regional restrictions on the horizon in the coming days the environment is not looking promising and the restrictions may add even more difficulties. There is reputational risk and creditability to Army Reserve football and Army FA as a whole, if the competition continues.

REPRESENTATIVE TEAMS

We are planning to get the Men's representative team in for an initial weekend in Dec 20 and have five fixtures lined up for the New Year, including the Army U23s, Infantry Corps Team and ICARUS. The Women's representative team is yet to confirm their fixtures however they are expected to start again in the early part of the New Year. Although I feel we can apply the necessary steps to keep the players safe when they are in our care I am concerned that calling players in from all corners of the UK, problematic and if an outbreak was to occur could lead to further scruting. However, we still have potentially some flexibility with representative football and we can push the initial games in the New Year later in the season and potentially shorten the season with games in the latter part of 2021.

A WAY FORWARD

Following a period of consultation, we have agreed on the following approach, which has now been endorsed by the Army FA.

ARMY RESERVE CHALLENGE CUP 2020/21

Decision to cancel the 2020-21 Army Reserve Challenge Cup.

ARMY RESERVE CHALLENGE CUP 2019/20

Due to Covid restrictions from Mar 20, we still have one remaining semi-final to play and final remaining to play. Decision we will try and play the one remaining semi-final and final of 2019/20 AR Challenge Cup during the season. Potentially looking at the games to be played at the tail end of the current season, during the Apr – Jun 21 period. The situation will continually be reviewed, with a decision made nearer the time.



REPRESENTATIVE FOOTBALL

Decision that representative football will be put on hold, with the early planned activities being pushed further into the season but this situation will be continually reviewed / monitored, depending on conditions. However if the current situation / perceived future lockdown conditions continues there may be a high probability that no games will be played this season.

I understand for many the above decisions will be very disappointing but much is out of our control and we have a duty of care to you all and the wider community. I believe going forward grass roots football across the nation will be impacted even further by Covid and at this juncture we are only trying to manage future expectations, as early as possible.

We will keep you all updated of any developments.

So sorry for being the bearer of bad news and please do not hesitate to contact me, if I can be of further assistance.

FOOTBALL OFFICERS

UPDATE FROM JENNY PAYNE

Whilst we are taking an enforced break from playing the game, I thought this would be an ideal opportunity to get on top of the administration side of the game and to refresh you on a few points.

AFFILIATION

 It is a mandatory requirement that if you play any football, at any level, including friendlies, then you must be affiliated. Please contact me if you need help with the process.

PLAYER REGISTRATION

2. It is now also mandatory that every player you play are registered fully through the WGS. Therefore, can you all please go onto your WGS and ensure that you have fully registered your players and submitted them for league approval. This has to be done for each and every player including all new players before they are eligible to play for you. Instructions attached Annex B.

DISCIPLINE

3. When you receive a discipline notification you are advised to go into the discipline tab in your WGS and acknowledge the charge straight away. This will avoid you incurring a late response fine. You then have 14 days to pay, if you do not pay with in the allotted time frame you will incur a late payment fine.

As the ASCB offices are closed the option to pay by phoning me is no longer available. Your players can, however, phone you and you can carry out the payment transaction online via your WGS, this is why it is important that your players are registered and you have acknowledged the charge, without this first being done WGS will not give you the option to pay online. Example attached.

If for any reason you can not pay online we do have a BAC's option:

- With regards to your players receiving match suspensions, if you get into the habit of using the matches Tab in your WGS and add all your matches, the suspensions will automatically count down for each qualifying match played. If you do not do this then the only way suspensions will be cleared is if you inform me after each game and I clear it manually.
- When filling out your team sheet for the referee pre-match, can you please fill it in with your players names as they appear in WGS. The officials do not have extensive access to your team on WGS so can only search with the info you have provided on the team sheet. i.e. if Joe Blogs is written on the team sheet as Joey Blogs, when the referee submits his match report on WGS, the system will search for Joey not Joe and therefore not find him. The only option left to the referee is to assume Joey is a new player to your team and create a new account. A complete headache for me and for you.



We were delighted to sponsor the match ball at the recent National League match between Aldershot Town and Notts County on Remembrance weekend.








OUR HERITAGE TOMMY LAWTON

Tommy Lawton was one of the greatest forwards ever to wear the England shirt. Despite missing out on his "prime" years due to military service during World War 2 he managed 246 goals in 420 senior appearances including Chelsea, Everton, Notts County, Brentford and Arsenal. He scored 22 goals in 23 matches outside of the war years for England and 24 goals in 23 appearances during the war. On Christmas Day 1940 he played for Everton v Liverpool in the morning and then for Tranmere Rovers v Crewe Alexandra in the afternoon.

Tommy joined the Army in January 1940 and was a PTI for the Army Physical Training Corps in Aldershot. He played for the Shots during the war scoring 66 goals in 43 games including six in a 9-2 win v Luton Town.
