

Berks & Bucks FA Female School-Club Link

Providing a pathway for girls to play Football



Background

- A school-club link is a formal agreement between a school and a community club that creates a mutually beneficial partnership between the two. The link provides a pathway for young people from school football to community football, engaging them in football as participants, volunteers, coaches and/or officials.
- School-club links help create a channel of regular and effective communication between schools and clubs and by creating these strong relationships this can encourage regular and lifelong participation in sport, reducing the drop-out rates associated with young people
- A strong school-club link will also provide structured activity for pupils to participate regularly whether that is in coaching sessions, competitions or leadership opportunities.
- As a result of the school-club link, more young people will hopefully take part in football; either as a player, coach or official therefore increasing young people's enjoyment and participation in lifelong physical activity.



Programme Outline

- Process initiated by EOI Form circulated to Clubs and Schools
- Those not already familiar will be introduced
- Joint application submitted by School and Club co-operatively
- Applications assessed and accepted links will be required to attend online introductory session further detailing programme and opportunity to ask any questions and gain clarification
- Formal Link forged between 1 School & 1 Club bound by an SLA
- Travel time from School to Club will not exceed 20 mins
- BBFA to circulate Marketing Materials to Advertise Link Both School and Club <u>MUST</u> advertise Link



Criteria

Schools:

- E Appropriate facilities where session delivery is possible
- E Sign up to GFSP programme and pledge to ensure Girls have equal access to Football by 2024
- E All Have Knowledge of Exit Routes (Wildcats/Clubs)
- E Have a Safeguarding Policy in place, as well as a

Designated Safeguarding Individual or point of contact for any issues and communicate this clearly with the club.

Must fulfil 1 of the 3 desirable criteria below:

- D School to offer facilities for Training/Matches
- D Willing to use Link to increase and sustain football provision (incurriculum/extra-curricular)
- D School willing to undertake CPD (FA Playmaker/FA PE Qualification) as part of the upskilling process

Clubs:

- E-Working Towards or be England Football Accredited
- E Coaches must have an in-date DBS, and Level 1 (I2CF)
- E Club will be able to provide a team OR Recreational Programme for players to progress to/have the ability to create one
- **E** Have a Safeguarding Children Policy which is shared with and accepted by the School, as well as a clear individual responsible for the welfare of the Children, which should be communicated to the school as a point of contact for any issues.

Must fulfil 1 of the 4 desirable criteria below:

- **D** Club can provide coaching and refereeing opportunities for those who wish to explore this
- **D** Club will have a recreational programme running for those not ready for immediate transition into organised team Football.
- D Will provide session delivery either in School or bring school to club
- D Provide facilities for School Festivals



Benefits

Schools:

- More active & healthier Pupils
- Raised school community profile attract new pupils
- £400 funding to share with club
- Strengthen Football offer and continued pathways for young people via exit routes
- Develop student life skills beyond school and encourage lifelong participation
- Increased standard in school teams
