Chesham United Ladies F.C. were formed in 1995, quickly progressing through the leagues to the FA National League under the guidance of Sian Williams & Lisa Welling.

The first team play in the fourth tier of women's football in Division One South West where they currently sit 3rd in the league.

The club provide football for females aged 5-9 years old in their SSE Wildcats, and run squads for U11's, U12's, U13's, U14's, U15's U16's, U18's and Senior team as well as small sided teams for those aged 16+.

We also have a newly forming development team for players aged 16+ who will play open age football, with a view to becoming first team players in the future.



MATCHDAY SQUAD

Lucy Bevan

Lucy's the fastest player to ever play for Chesham Utd. Her pace combined with her strong skills on the ball mean that Lucy creates changes by the bucketload.

Lilly Bircham
