WYCOMBE WANDERERS FC



Founded in the 1989, Wycombe Wanderers Ladies (now Wycombe Wanderers Women) was launched as apart of a 'football in the community' scheme.

Prior to a men's home match in 1989 v Runcorn, the ladies side put on a 6 aside exhibition match to help promote women's football. They then began their first season by competing in the Greater London League. Since then, they have played within the Thames Valley League set up for many years. Nicknamed the Chairgirls, the club for many years have run 3 teams, firsts, reserves and u18s.

The Chairgirls have previously won the League cup back in May 2011. On that day, they secured a 1-0 win over today's opponents, Moretonville. The following year, Wycombe Wanderers u16s side won the Berks & Bucks League and then also became runners up in the Berks & Bucks Cup.

A couple of years later, the firsts won the league cup following a win against Milton Keynes City Ladies. After finishing second in Division 2 North, the 2013/14 season started with a promotion in division 1. Also coming up that year, was another cup final followed by a win in May 2014.

The most recent silverware for the Chairgirls came in 2019. Wycombe Wanderers took on Caversham AFC Swans in the Berks & Bucks Youth Girls U18 County Cup Final at Adams Park and won 5-1.

MORETONVILLE JUNIOR FC



Moretonville Junior Football Club (MJFC) was established in 1969 to provide football for young people in Buckingham and the surrounding areas.

The club caters for age groups from under 6 to 18 for boys and girls. The younger age groups train and play on a non-competitive basis in line with FA guidelines. We currently play in the MKDDL & Beds Girls Leagues.

Girl's football was introduced at the Club almost 20 years ago when a team from the local Grammer School joined. We currently have over 100 girls registered; with a new Wildcats programme due to start shortly. The club is one of the largest in the North Bucks area, with over 500 registered players across 34 teams. We are affiliated to the Berks & Bucks Football Association and an FA Accredited Club. The club links into adult football via Buckingham Athletic and Buckingham United, as well as links with other clubs further afield.

After forming a link with Buckingham University, we moved to our current grounds in September 2002. Then after further negotiations to obtain a long-term lease, lots of form filling for grant applications and many, many hours spent fundraising, our current clubhouse was completed in 2017.

In 2021 we became a registered Charity. MJFC is run completely by volunteers; the chairman, committee, coaches and a host of other people who help out do so through a shared passion to bring the fun of football to all participants regardless of their background or ability.

Liv Metcalfe

Signed for the club last season and has fitted in seamlessly. Has played mostly in defence. Really strong positionally and always looks to keep possession with passes quickly into the midfield.

Holly Watson

Also signed for the club last season and continues to progress. Has also shown great versatility in playing a number of positions.

One of our most improved players.

Esme Lambros

Fantastic attitude, she never stops running and always gives everything on the pitch. Can play in many positions on either right or left.

Sophia Dickmann-Pena

Whether playing in midfield or attack, she never stops running and doesn't give the opposition any time on the ball. Scorer of a huge number of key goals.

Ruby Smith

Definitely our most improved player over recent seasons. Technically very good and always willing to learn. Works hard going forward and back and has developed some nice tricks recently.

Faith Ridley

Very skilful player, regardless of position and has even volunteered to be our back up goalkeeper.
Weighs in with spectacular goals, often from distance.

Celine Ray

Has made a number of outstanding saves this season and her distribution is excellent. First season with the team and has fitted in superbly. Also scored a goal in the semi-final.

Esther Evans

A very creative central midfielder, she works incredibly hard, provides goals and assists. Very good in possession. Links the defence and attack and always supports both areas.

Naomi White

Central defender, is always difficult to beat and brings the ball out from the back very well. Technically strong and can also play in midfield, scoring some key goals this season.

Issy Flack

A goal scoring machine. Scores from anywhere and always does it with a smile on her face. Very brave and often gets challenged heavily, but always gets back up.

Lauren Murray

Been transformed into a right back and has flourished in that position. Superb pace which helps on the attack and also in covering her position and fellow defenders.

Excellent passer.

Eve Braddock

The brains of the team. Is able to see and then execute forward passes that can unlock a defence. Always looks to attack and get the team on the front foot.

Scarlet Carter

An enigma. Can win a game single-handedly and then ask if we have won at the final whistle. Tremendous skill and pace. Scorer of spectacular goals only.

Lottie Swinson

Quick and skilful – she scores great goals and is always making intelligent runs off the ball. Works hard across the front line and will not give defenders any time or space.

Chloe Dicks

Top scorer last two seasons. Very skilful player and comfortable with both feet. Very good close control and ability to take people on. Can also play in midfield, where her passing ability also comes to the fore.
