actively looking for support from all BCFA staff members. Operational plans window is due to open, and planning starts in April, RK opened up this for discussion to see if there is anything needed to be discussed in areas of IAG if not already considered. As DEI fits within all of our roles, organically all of our operational plans will be shaped to support DEI. VM says the LGBTQ+ is still an area of work we need to be more involved in and is confident to work with confident and sustained partners and organisations to tackle this instead of clubs. MR also plans to incorporate into his operational plan to work with Birmingham United Football Club in four of the more deprived areas across Birmingham that will be recreational sessions for under sixteens as a tactic to form future youth teams at the club. 3 MR Male Pathway Updates 14:20 Central Development League has paused for Ramadan but have there has been some faith based Just Play recreational sessions in Coventry. The ESOL division which will be entering the Birmingham FA Education League is also currently on hold as only two colleges have committed currently, this



is Dudley College and Halesowen
College. Dudley College is going to
support recruitment internally through
the college networks. MR confirmed both
colleges are looking into delivering
referee courses to support these
individuals with further opportunities.

MR highlighted Birmingham United are interested in delivering refugee programmes in partnership with Active through Football funded by the Football Foundation.

Female Pathway Update

VM is having a focus on pushing Wildcats recreational centres to clubs.

Girls Development League is just waiting on the venue to look at an April to June little league format whilst recruiting teams into this. There are currently eight teams playing within five clubs with a four-person committee.

The Birmingham Deaf female programme unfortunately has not been successful to run due to a breakdown from the deliverers but is confident to establish something with the club in the future and is looking to collaborate with other partners to support a similar project.

There is a new role within the female pathway at BCFA - Women's Community

Football Officer. The deadline for this role is the 21^{st of} April 2025.

VM expressed her admiration for the amazing work of the Birmingham County Walking Football League for their amazing work getting 234 female players with fourteen teams across two divisions, the work involved in this has been fantastic and the outcomes evidence this.

RK is looking to restructure the pan disability landscape due to committee issues which we will be looking to recruit a new resolute and inclusive pan disability league committee and establishing a disability working group. There will also be a change in the mental health league to explore a new direction of delivery.

RK has been working with the BCFA Referee Development Officer to deliver disability upskilling workshops for match officials which will be delivered on Wednesday 26th March in Coventry and Wednesday 2nd April at the BCFA HQ.



The first face to face Coaching Disabled Footballers workshop since COVID is also to be delivered on Thursday 3rd April 2025 at President Kennedy School in Coventry and the link is live and was shared with the BCFA Football Development Team to share with local clubs who may have interested coaches.
