GUIDANCE NOTE ON INVESTIGATIONS

WITNESSES AND STATEMENT DRAFTING



This guidance is designed to help you to consider what the appropriate questions to ask witnesses are - and to provide tips on some of the key information that statements & reports should ideally include.

Guidance on the drafting of witness statements

- a) Statements should record **exactly** what words, actions or conduct an observer witnessed, or had reported to them. These words should be recorded within direct speech marks.
- b) Witnesses should confirm whether they heard, saw or **heard AND saw** the particular incident take place.
- c) All witness statements should be recorded in **separate documents**.
- d) The witnesses should seek to **give a description** of the alleged offender(s) (e.g. hair colour, height, shirt number, field position e.g. striker, tattoos, any other distinctive characteristics, names / nicknames if known).
- e) Witnesses should confirm whether they are **willing to attend** a disciplinary hearing, if necessary.
- f) Witnesses should **sign their statements** (in the case of children, they should be countersigned by an appropriate adult)
- g) Witnesses should **date** each statement they make.
- h) Each witness should record details of what capacity they were involved in the case (e.g. player, coach, parent of child X, spectator). Whether they have any affiliation to either team or a Participant; (this could be relevant as to the credibility and independence of their evidence).
- i) All Witness Statements should be collated by the Club Secretary who will be the direct contact to the County FA for the case and sent to <u>discipline@cheshirefa.com</u>

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Example questions for witnesses

- Did you hear or witness any abusive or improper comments and / or behaviour?
- ✓ If so, *exactly* what comments or behaviour did you witness? (a word for word account of any abusive language is best and should be placed in direct speech marks " ... ")
- Did you witness the incident first hand, or was this reported to you (if so, by whom)?
- ✓ If the matter was reported to you, please confirm who reported it to you, when, where and what you were told.
- Please estimate your distance from the alleged offender(s) on each occasion?
- Did you have a clear an unobstructed view of the alleged offender when he or she made the comment?
- ✓ What were the conditions like during the match (e.g. windy, rainy, fine, poor visibility)?
- Was the incident reported to the referee? If so, when and by whom?
- Was any action taken as a result of this? If so, what action was taken?
- Can you provide a description of the alleged offender(s) (e.g. hair colour, skin colour, height, build, shirt number, clothes including boots, tattoos, field position, other distinguishing features)?
- ✓ What was the reaction of the person subjected to the abusive language / behaviour during and / or after the incident (e.g. sad, angry, no expression?)
- ✓ How was this displayed (e.g. was the person crying, arms raised, red faced, balled up fists, shouting, did the incident affect the Participants performance if so how?)
- Did anyone else witness the incident? Is so, can you provide details of any witnesses, (including a description where appropriate)?
- ✓ Was the matter reported to the police? If so, can you provide contact details for the police officer handling the case?
- ✓ Is there anything else you would like to let us know about this matter – (e.g. any history between the parties)

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
