





REFEREE ARMBAND INITIATIVE

The armbands act as a visual reminder to Coaches,
Players and Spectators that the Match Official is
New to Refereeing or a Child.

The team were last season's Under 15s West Cumbria Youth League Champions.




Manager Malcolm commented "We are excited to be part of the County Cup final this year and I'm sure all the lads will enjoy the day and occasion."


