Manager's Comment

We began the season strongly in the Uhlsport Hellenic Premier League, suffering just one defeat by mid-October. This promising start had us believing that a genuine challenge for honours was on the cards. However, a difficult spell around January—marked by poor form, injuries, and suspensions—saw our momentum stall and playoff hopes fade, eventually ending the campaign in 9th place. To compound matters, the league's scheduling meant we played our final four fixtures in just eight days by April 5th, leaving us with a four-week break before today's final—far from ideal preparation. Further suspensions and player absences mean we're missing several key squad members, but the team is united in its aim to secure a first trophy in nine seasons.

Our route to the final has been a true test, with every match played away from home. The campaign began in early December with a youthful side earning a well-deserved 3-1 win at Newent Town. A late-February quarter-final at Longwell Green ended in a solid 3-0 victory. In the semi-final, a tense 0-0 draw with Slimbridge went to penalties, where long-serving keeper Ben Mitchell's crucial save helped us win 5-3. Notably, 18-year-old Ollie Bradbury—top scorer in the competition with three goals—has been a standout from our thriving under-18s, who topped the Southwest Counties Youth League and now face a playoff and cup final against Bridgwater.
