U18S YELLOW ARMBANDS FOR REFEREES

A THIRD OF OUR REFEREING WORKFORCE IN HAMPSHIRE ARE UNDER THE AGE OF 18



In conjunction with the Respect programme and the We Only Do Postitive campaign, Hampshire FA are launching yellow armbands for all Under18 Referees.

Aimed at supporting young referees in Hampshire, this new initiative will see yellow armbands introduced for all referees under the age of 18. We are keen to support all referees in the game, but it is important to remember that those who are under the age of 18 are still children. The yellow armband will aim to remind everyone

that the referee is still subject to the children's safeguarding legislation, and should therefore be protected, encouraged and treated with the utmost respect.

UPCOMING SAFEGUARDING VISITS

The FA seeks to build a safe, enjoyable and inclusive environment for all children and young people, whether they are players, young referees or qualified coaches. To help guide those working with children and young people, The FA provides courses in safeguarding children. Sometimes these are required as part of a qualification e.g. for coaches and referees, however there are courses suitable for everyone, whatever their role. Over the past few months we have begun conducting our Safeguarding visits to random selected youth clubs during training sessions and match days. During the visits we will make sure the named manager /coaches have in date FA CRC and ask the officials, parents and players a series of quick questions to ensure their Safeguarding responsibilities and knowledge are being met.

This is a good opportunity for our team to be at dubs and grounds across the county to see first hand the great work all of our volunteers undertake week in and week out.

SIN BINS ACROSS GRASSROOTS FOOTBALL

The FA announced that temporary dismissals, also known as sin bins, will be introduced across all levels of grassroots football in Hampshire from the start of the 2019/20 season. The mandatory rule change will be implemented up to Step 5 of the National League System and Tier 3 and below in women's football. Sin bins of 10 minutes will be issued by referees as a sanction for dissent in adult football, and will apply to all levels of grassroots football. Shorter sin bins will apply across youth football.

The FA successfully piloted sin bins during the 2017/18 season, and then extended this to a total of 31 leagues throughout the 2018/19 season as part of its commitment to improve the match day experience for all. After gathering positive feedback from players, referees and coaches, sin bins will now be rolled out across all leagues at grassroots level in a bid to increase participation and to continue improving match

HAMPSHIRE FA COACHES COMMUNITY

The Hampshire FA Coaches Community has been established to offer greater support to the Grassroots game across the county. The

Coaches Community has been split into 4 geographical areas; South West, Isle of Wight, North Hampshire and the South East.

Ultimately, Hampshire FA want to offer greater support to the grassroots game, join up all Continual Professional Development and have accessible support. There are formal and informal options available. The formal is with the county Coach developer and FA coaches in a coaching/classroom set up. The informal opportunity gives the community the freedom to discuss and research any areas you would like to problem solve within your coaching journey.



Hampshire Women's Football Pyramid 2019/2020








Hampshire Men's Football Pyramid

SAFEGUARDING

Hampshire FA have an ongoing duty to ensure the game is a safe, positive and enjoyable experience for the millions of children, young people and adults who regularly play, watch, coach, referee and volunteer.

Hampshire FA offer a range of safeguarding services and training to help create a safe and enjoyable football experience for everyone. We ensure safeguarding requirements are met as a requirement of club affiliation and we support clubs to maintain these standards. This includes making unannounced safeguarding visits to clubs.

HOW WE HANDLE REPORTED CONCERNS

CONCERNS WITHIN YOUR CLUB

If you are concerned about your child or another child in your club, you would normally contact your Club Welfare Officer (CWO) in the first instance. You should be given the contact details of the CWO at the start of the season. If you do not know who your CWO is, speak to a coach in your club and ask for their details. The CWO will normally deal with cases of poor practice and behaviour within your club.

SUPPORT FOR WELFARE OFFICERS

As you know, RESPECT is The FA's direct response to a clear message from the grassroots game. We must improve standards of behaviour - on and off the field. Parental behaviour is one of the main reasons why young players drop out of the game. Poor behaviour by coaches, parents and players has also seen a number of officials drop out each season. The role of the Club Welfare Officer (CWO) is to deal with poor practice cases within their club, give advice and guidance as well as being the lead on CRC's within the club. CWO's should always report more serious welfare case to the FA via the Designated Safeguarding Officer.

ADOPT SOUTH

STONEHAM LANE FOOTBALL COMPLEX

Hampshire FA is proud to announce that they have been appointed as operators of the £9 million Stoneham Lane football complex facility, now fully operational with over 17,000 registered users for the whole site so far and 30,000 visits since the site was opened.



Stoneham Lane Foot all Complex is a part of the Parklife project which is an FA initiative to ensure the income generated is put back into funding grassroots football within the local area.

Hampshire FA's chief executive Neil Cassar said: 'The Parklife Programme is an exciting opportunity to transform the football





'The site on Stoneham Lane will address issues we currently have on capacity for youth football and the overall quality of pitches.'

'We will continue to work with partners in order to deliver the hubs that are currently in development as part of a drive to ensure football is sustainable in this area.'

The FA and Sport England require the data generated from registrations and the reception turnstiles to analyse trends and participation. Furthermore, registration is compulsory to meet our safeguarding requirements, we need to know you have consent and or are fit and well to participate in activities within the club. Each registration will be sent a unique QR code that will give them access via the turnstile.

STONEHAM LANE FOOTBALL COMPLEX BACKGROUND

The Council embarked on this project back in 2016, when it agreed with developer of the new North Stoneham housing development, Highwood Homes, to undertake the delivery of the grass football pitches and associated facilities being provided at the Monks Brook playing fields to replace those being lost at Stoneham Park and Jubilee Playing Fields as part of the North Stoneham housing and community development.

The Council engaged with the Football Association, Sport England and the Premier League to secure £4.9 million grant funding from the national Parklife scheme to significantly enhance the facilities being provided at the site, to deliver a state of the art football hub for the local

community to benefit from.

The Parklife Football Hub programme aims to create a sustainable model for football facilities based around artificial grass pitches on hub sites. Parklife aims to deliver Hub sites in key football communities nationwide, by providing multiple floodlit 3G football pitches, which are accessible to the local football and wider community. The Hubs aim to encourage physical activity and enhance the playing experience for all ages and abilities, whilst reducing the games reliance on local authority subsidy to maintain grass pitches in wet winter weather conditions.



PARTNER NETWORKING EVENT HELD AT THE FACILITY

What is being provided?

Stoneham Lane Football Complex consists of 1 full-size & 2 enlarged floodlit 3G artificial grass pitches together with an eight changing room pavilion, clubroom and cafe. There will also be 4 well maintained junior and senior grass pitches ready for next season!

The new facility will become a central venue for the Eastleigh and District Mini Soccer League (EDMSL), and will provide over 130 local teams in the Under 7 and Under 10 age groups the opportunity to play on state of the art 3G pitches every week without being thwarted by cancellations due to poor quality grass pitches and the English weather.

Paul Taylor, Chairman of the EDMSL said, 'We have a lot of cancellations due to inclement weather and poor pitches and to now be able to play every week on 3G pitches will be great.'

The hub will also be the new home of thriving local club AFC Stoneham who have over 25 teams and whose men's first XI play in the Wessex League. Chairman Mark Stupple said: 'We are excited to move our whole club of 500 plus players and coaches into our new home where all of our teams will train and play matches. The move to an outstanding new facility will allow our club to grow and develop further ensuring that we fulfil our aspirations both as a grassroots community club and Wessex League team.'

The facility will be available to local clubs to hire for training and matches throughout the year, as well as becoming a key venue for coach education courses in Hampshire.


