introduction



It gives me great pleasure to introduce to you the fifth annual Hampshire FA Grassroots Football Awards held at Southampton FC on Saturday 3rd June 2017 sponsored by the Saints Foundation and powered by AN4 Group.

Hampshire FA receives nominations from its Member Divisional Football Associations (DFAs) and Local Area Referees Committees (LARCs) on an annual basis for the Hampshire FA Service to Football Awards and Hampshire FA Referees' Service to Football Awards. These nominations are reviewed at the March meeting of Officers and DFAs.

Following on from the presentations of these awards, we will present the Hampshire FA Certificate of Commendation to those individuals who have completed a further 10 years' service following the award of either a Hampshire FA Service to Football Award or Hampshire FA Referee Service to Football Award.

We will then present the Hampshire FA Groundsman of the Year Awards sponsored by Fleet Line Markers.

Moving on, we then present the Hampshire FA Respect Awards, recognising one youth and one adult league in Hampshire that have strongly upheld the values of Respect in the county and for their hard work and excellence in implementing The FA Respect programme.

The Hampshire FA Charter Standard Awards are selected by the Hampshire FA Charter Standard working group based on club assessments provided by the county FA's Charter Standard monitors over the course of the season, awarded

to those clubs who have achieved the highest standards.

Each year, the Hampshire FA Disciplinary Committee considers appropriate winners of the Hampshire FA Fair Play Awards. The Fair Play Awards take into account the number of teams in a club and the number of disciplinary points recorded during the season. They also invite feedback from our member leagues before reaching a decision on the winners and we will be presenting awards to clubs who have achieved the highest standards.

We then move into the Hampshire FA Referees Awards which are decided by members of the Hampshire FA Referees Committee in conjunction with myself and the Hampshire FA Referee Development Manager. The refereeing programme in Hampshire this season is sponsored by the University of Portsmouth Department of Sport and Exercise Science.

As the evening progresses, we then welcome presentations for the Hampshire FA Inclusive Club of the Year Award and Hampshire FA Walking Football Club of the Year Award, recognising a club for each award based on their contribution and commitment to developing the game.

The FA Community Awards supported by McDonalds will follow this and nominations are invited in the various categories before a panel from the county sit to consider the winners. The winners are then automatically nominated for the Regional Awards.

We are delighted to present the Southampton Solent University Group Project Awards and to



highlight the fantastic and innovative Football Leadership Programme in partnership with Southampton Solent University which this season has also achieved a UEFA Bronze Award. The Football Leadership programme has had over 450 students delivering grassroots football projects countywide, all designed to sustain, grow and implement effective initiatives to support the grassroots game in Hampshire.

Moving on from the Southampton Solent University Group Project Awards, we then have the Hampshire FA Football Futures Awards. The Football Futures programme in Hampshire is sponsored by Southampton Solent University and we are delighted to present awards to two deserving, young volunteers for their commitment and dedication to volunteering.

We are delighted to announce that this season, Martin Sinclair, England and Team GB Cerebral Palsy Football Player and Saints Foundation SaintsAbility Development Officer, has been inducted into the national FA Hall of Fame. Although Martin will not be present on the evening, we are delighted to be able to present a short video of Martin accepting his award, presented to him by the Saints Foundation on behalf of Hampshire FA.

We end the presentations with The FA 50 Years Long Service to Football Award. A highly prestigious award made to those grassroots heroes who have given an astonishing 50 years' service to the game. This season, we are honoured to make presentations to some very deserving people who have dedicated so much to our national game: Alan Lipscombe, Alan Rosekillly,

Arthur Saunders, Brian Biles, Brian Perrett, Colin Macey, Doug Perry, Geoff Smith, John Stonehouse, Keith Petty, Martin Bishop, Mike Fowler and Owen Lightfoot.

hampshire fa **service to football award**

A Hampshire FA Service to Football Award is made for 25 years' continuous or aggregated voluntary service to the county and each winner is nominated by their local Divisional Football Association. The Awards will be presented by John Benfield, President of Hampshire FA. This season's recipients are:

alan milas

Alan served as an Assistant Manager for Level Sports FC from 1990 through to 1995. Additionally, Alan has served as a Council Member for Bournemouth Divisional FA since 1993 through to the present day and was elected as a Life Vice President in 2010. From 2000 through to 2005, Alan served as Deputy Chairman for Bournemouth Divisional FA and then as Chairman from 2005 through to 2010. Currently, Alan is the Bournemouth Hayward Football League Chairman, a role he has been serving since 2016 through to the present day. Additionally, Alan served as a Hampshire FA Council Member from 2002 to 2004.

alan paul

Alan was the Manager and Chairman of Dexter Sports Youth FC and in 1989-90 Alan joined the Bournemouth Youth Football League Committee representing his club. From 1998-99 through to the present day, Alan has served in the role of Chairman for the Bournemouth Youth Football League. Since 2015 through to the present day, Alan has served as a Council Member of the Bournemouth Divisional FA and Hampshire FA. In 2015, Alan was awarded the Service to Football Award by the Bournemouth Divisional FA.

david gould

David was a founding member of Westover Bournemouth FC in 1985 and has served as the Club Secretary ever since. David has held the positions of Treasurer and Reserve Team Manager as well as undertaking other domestic duties within the club. Prior to 1985, David was Secretary of Bournemouth YMCA FC and served in the role for 3 years.

dennis challis

For the past 60 years, Dennis has played in the Hampshire, Aldershot Senior, West Surrey midweek and Basingstoke Leagues as well as the Police National, Regional and County Football Leagues. Dennis was also a Match Official on the Football Combination, Hampshire, Basingstoke, Southampton Saturday and midweek, boys and youth Leagues in Southampton and Inter Police Leagues. Dennis has also officiated in Hong Kong which included a tournament to commemorate 100 years of the Hong Kong FA. Dennis has undertaken roles including Assessor Secretary, Assistant Referees Secretary, Referees Secretary and now President of the Sydenham's League (Wessex), which he has held since 2011.

ian shearer

Ian has served in a variety of roles for Sandrock FC since 1991 including Second Team Manager, First Team Manager and as Club President. Additionally, Ian has served in the role of Club Linesman (since 1991) and as Club Secretary (since 2002) through to the present day. Under Ian's management, the club has won various trophies including the Eric Holbrook trophy, were also finalists in the Aldershot Senior Cup and runners-up in the Premier Division of the Aldershot Sunday League. Jenny served as Honorary Club Secretary for Redhill Rangers FC from the period 1987-91. From 1978 through to 2009, Martin undertook a variety of roles for Westover Bournemouth FC including Manager (1978-1985), Chairman (1985-1987) and President (1987-2009). Since 2000, Martin has served as a Council Member of the Bournemouth Divisional FA and was elected as a Life Vice President in 2015. From the period 2005-10, Martin served as the Deputy Chairman of the Bournemouth Divisional FA and eventually as Chairman from 2010-15. Additionally, Martin was a Hampshire FA Council Member from 2007-13. In 2008, Martin was awarded a Service to Football Award from Bournemouth Divisional FA.

mick ryan

Mick had a longstanding playing career from 1962 through to 1985, playing for a variety of clubs including Holdenhurst Lads, Parley Sports FC, Victoria Park FC and Fiveways FC. Mick is currently a Life Vice President for Christchurch FC and is also a Life Vice President of the Bournemouth Divisional FA. Additionally, Mick is Vice Chairman of Christchurch FC and Chairman of the Bournemouth Hayward League Cup Committee. For the past 27 years, Mick has served as a Bournemouth Divisional FA Council Member. In 2007, Mick was awarded the Service to Football Award by the Bournemouth Divisional FA. Currently, Mick is the Deputy Chairman for the Bournemouth Hayward Football League, a role he has been serving since 2016.

miķa buxton

Mike is currently the Honorary Registration Secretary of the Bournemouth Youth Football League, a position he has been serving since 1985 through to the present day. From the period 2008-12, Mike also served as the Bournemouth Youth Football League Referee Appointments Secretary. Terry started playing for Broughton FC in 1962 at the age of 17 before retiring at the age of 40. For the past 35 years, Terry has served as Groundsman for Broughton FC, marking out pitches for male teams, both adult and youth, ensuring pitches are playable and in impeccable condition for training and matches. In 2015, Terry with Broughton FC achieved 3rd place in the Hampshire FA Groundsman of the Year Awards.

robin osborne

Robin has been a member of Bournemouth Divisional FA Council since 1991 and a member of the Hampshire FA Council since 1995. Robin was elected Life Vice President of Bournemouth Divisional FA in 2006 and also for Hampshire FA in 2010. From 1991 to 2001, Robin served as Auditor then Treasurer of the Bournemouth Divisional FA. Robin was elected as a Director of Hampshire FA on Incorporation in 2000, becoming Finance Director in 2001, Deputy Chairman in 2013 and Chairman in 2014, a position which he still holds. In addition, Robin was a Committee Member of Christchurch FC from 1996 to 2001 being Chairman from 1997 to 2001.

hampshire fa referees service to football award

graham swinfield

Graham has been involved in football as a Player, Club Secretary and eventually was involved in management. After taking up refereeing, Graham refereed in Spain as well as coaching for an U18 youth side. Graham has refereed numerous cup finals and has also been an assistant referee. Graham enjoys refereeing and sees tough games as a challenging but rewarding experience, especially when getting crucial decisions right.

roger hatcher

Roger began refereeing in 1991 and after achieving the Level 5 qualification, began serving as an Assistant Referee on both the Hampshire and Wessex Leagues. Roger was the Assistant Referee for Southampton Divisional FA's Saturday Senior Cup Final in 2003 as well as Southampton Divisional FA's Sunday Senior Cup Final in 2012. Roger thoroughly enjoys refereeing and regularly referees local matches still to the present day.

hampshire fa **certificate of commendation**

anthony white

Anthony has been involved with Hartley Wintney FC for over 40 years. As a Committee Member, Anthony ensures the upkeep of the grounds and the clubhouse and continues to support charitable events with the focus on the local community. Anthony is excited that the club has been promoted to its highest level since it was founded 120 years ago. Anthony is proud to be associated with Hartley Wintney FC.

brian ford

Brian joined Four Marks FC as a player until 1974 and in 1975, undertook the role of Manager. In 1981, Brian stepped down as Manager but continued as an active Committee Member marking the pitch and undertaking ground maintenance. In 1987, Brian became Manager for a second spell and led the club into senior divisions winning a series of league cups and making Hampshire Cup Final appearances. In 1994, Brian became General Manager and was eventually elected as Chairman. Brian became President of Four Marks FC in 2001 and prepares the pitch for match days still serving to the present day.

clifford platt

Clifford became a Referee in 1972, achieving Class 3 and eventually Class 1. Additionally, Clifford completed a course to become a Referee Instructor. Clifford delivered courses in Bournemouth and joined a team to visit Referee Societies to provide demonstrations within Hampshire & Dorset. Eventually Clifford became a Referee Assessor and was elected the Bournemouth Sunday Referee Appointment Secretary. Clifford continued refereeing and became the Hampshire County Youth League Appointment Secretary for 5 years before serving on the League's Committee which he still continues to serve to this day. Clifford is still actively involved in refereeing and has been for the past 45 years.

david miller

David passed his referees' course and was promoted to Level 7 (1981), to Level 6 (1997) and eventually to Level 5 (1999). David has been a referee for senior and junior football for 36+ years and has even refereed at the Old Dean Court and Vitality Grounds. A few years ago, David achieved the Sunday Referee of the Year Award presented to him by the Bournemouth Hayward Football League. To the present day, David continues to referee for the Bournemouth Youth League and for consecutive seasons, topped the list of officiating the most amount of games per season despite not holding a driving licence and cycling to his appointments.

ian birch

Ian moved to Hampshire 32 years ago having previously refereed in Kent, Surrey and Birmingham. Ian qualified as an FA Referee in 1971 and in 2002 became an FA Referee Assessor, serving for 13 years. Ian currently serves on the Portsmouth Divisional FA Council as a Member (since 2002) and on the Portsmouth RA as a Vice President. Ian is currently the Meon Valley Sunday Football League Assistant Secretary (since 2015) and serves as a Member on the Hampshire FA Disciplinary Panel (since 2002). From 2002-07, Ian served on the Portsmouth LARC as a Member.

ken morris

Ken started out as a player in 1955 for Wootton FC and played for several other teams over 18 years. In 1973, Ken became a registered Referee and in 1982 was elected as the IOW Sunday Referees' Appointment Secretary. Other roles include Secretary of the IOW Saturday League and Chairman of the IOW Divisional FA until 2004 when Ken then became their President. Ken is a Vice President of Hampshire FA and has served for 27 years.

rodney whala

Rodney started as a Referee in 1970 and achieved Class 1. Rodney served on the Hampshire League Panel and was also a Hampshire FA Council Member for several years, serving on the Discipline and Cup Committees. For 40 years, Rodney was a member of the Andover Saturday League Committee, served as Chairman for a short period and is currently a Life Vice President. Rodney became a member of the North Hants Divisional FA Council 35 years ago and is now a Life Vice President. For several years, Rodney was also the Referee Appointments Secretary for the Andover Area.

isle of wight saturday football league

In 1898, the Isle of Wight Saturday Football League was officially sanctioned and played on the Island under the IOW Divisional FA. In 1974-75, the responsibility moved to the Isle of Wight Saturday Football League. The Isle of Wight Saturday Football League is a Respect league and has 48 teams and 5 Divisions. The Officers & Management Committee are passionate about ensuring administration runs smoothly and actively supports and endorses The FA's Respect programme.

The Isle of Wight Saturday Football League were selected for a Hampshire FA Respect Award as they ensure a warning notice is put up before every match detailing sanctions for dissent and abusive behaviour whilst at the same time promoting the values and setting high expectations for all members to comply with in line with The FA's Respect programme.

testway youth football league

Testway Youth Football League was established in 1988 and covers the area from Bishops Waltham to Fordingbridge, Lyndhurst to Vernham Dean, Basingstoke to Winchester and West Harnham/Salisbury to Andover. The league caters for U7's through to U18s and has 49 clubs, with 186 registered teams. Testway Youth Football League has been a full supporter of the Respect campaign since its inception. All clubs in the league have taken on and embedded the Respect ideals and values as implemented by the league, of which include fair-play and equality in all aspects of the game.

The Testway Youth Football League have been awarded a Hampshire FA Respect Award for their sterling support of the Respect Match Delegate initiative. The league regularly request county FA staff to be present at their committee meetings to promote Respect whilst the management committee fully endorses The FA Respect programme and ensures all club members fully comply.
