St. Albans City Youth F.C<br>2019 Boys Small Sided Tournament<br>Competition Rules

1. The competition shall be known as the 'St. Albans City Youth Small Sided Competition' and shall be affiliated to the Hertfordshire County Football Association. Entry is by invitation only and the competition will be conducted in accordance with the rules, regulations and bylaws of the Football Association.
2. The competition shall be designated as for the under 12, under 11, under 10, under 9 , under 8 and Under 7 age groups. Age qualification dates are as follows:

> Under 7 Boys who were under 7 years old on 31 August 2018 Under 8 Boys who were under 8 years old on 31 August 2018
> Under 9 Boys who were under 9 years old on 31 August 2018
> Under 10 Boys who were under 10 years old on 31 August 2018 Under 11 Boys who were under 11 years old on 31 August 2018 Under 12 Boys who were under 12 years old on 31 August 2018

No team shall include players with an age differential of more than two years. The entrance fee is shown on the application form and shall be forfeited by any team withdrawing after the closing date.
3. All competition players shall be deemed to be registered members of the club they represent at the time of the competition. Each registered player shall only play for one team.
4. In case of members still attending school, the first loyalty of each member is to his/her school. If the school requires a member of an affiliated club to play for the school at any time, the club or competition must without question whatsoever release him/her to play for the school. All members still attending school must first obtain clearance from their Head Teacher, in accordance with Football Association Rules. As it is the right of parents to determine whether or not a boy/girl plays in Sunday football registered by County FA's, Head Teachers' permission is not required for such registered activities played on Sundays.
5. The Laws of Association Football will apply except where provided for in the PLAYING RULES.
6. The competition will provide all match balls. The under 7 ' $s, 8$ 's \& 9's will play with a size 3 and the under 10 's, 11 's and 12 's, with a size 4 .
7. Each team shall appoint an adult as a manager. The manager shall be responsible for the team being registered by the correct time as notified by the competition organisers and being available to play on the correct pitch at the notified time.
8. The competition shall provide each participating club with a copy of the competition and playing rules and a copy of their sanction to play the competition from the Herts. County Football Association. No club or team shall be allowed to play unless it is in possession of the above copies.
9. Any protest arising from eligibility or qualification of players, or the interpretation of rules, or any other matter not covered elsewhere in these rules shall be referred to the Organising Committee whose decision shall be final in all matters (subject to rule 10).
10. In the event of any dispute concerning this competition, appeals can be logged with the Hertfordshire Football Association Ltd. In accordance with the rules of that body.
11. Each team is expected to have a qualified first aider in attendance together with a suitable first aid kit.

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## Playing Rules

1. Under 9's to Under 12's a maximum of six (6) players will form a team that will consist of a goalkeeper and five (5) outfield players. Under 7's and 8's a maximum of five (5) players will form a team that will consist of a goalkeeper and four (4) outfield players
2. Three substitutes may be used in any match from those registered prior to the start of the competition. A player who has been substituted during a match becomes a substitute and may in turn replace another player at any time, subject to the substitution being carried out in accordance with Law 3 of the Laws of Association Football.

## 3. There shall be no offside.

4. A player who is sent off for misconduct shall not be permitted to take any further part in the competition. The player may be replaced for subsequent matches but not in the match that they were sent off in. Registered referees shall control all matches and any misconduct shall be reported to the appropriate county FA.
5. The competition shall be played on a league basis, three points for a win, one for a draw. The team finishing first in its' group in the under 9's \& 10's and first and second in the under 11's \& 12's will qualify for the knockout stage. If two or more teams finish with the same number of points, goal difference will determine the winner. If goal difference is the same, the team that has scored the most goals will be the winner. If still equal, kicks from the penalty mark will decide. In the knock out stage, if the score is equal after normal time, extra time will be played. If the score is still equal after extra time, kicks from the penalty mark will decide the winner. The under 7's and 8's tournaments are non-competitive, therefore, groups of teams will play each other on a round robin basis.
6. Duration of matches will be ten (10) minutes one way. There will be no half time In knockout ties, six (6) minutes extra time will be played if necessary in the same direction. Players in the under 9 and 10 age group may not play for more than one hour in any one day.
7. Kicks from the penalty mark. Any five of the players who are on the pitch or in goal at the end of play may take a kick for their team. If after both teams have taken five kicks the score is still equal, sudden death will apply. Should a team consist of less than six players at the end of play, the opposing team will reduce the number of players taking penalties to the same number. ( his rule only applies to the u 9 - u 12 age groups $\}$.
8. All teams must provide two playing strips. In the event of a clash, the first named team will change. All players must wear shin pads or will not be allowed to take part in the tournament.
9 Studded boots are not allowed unless the competition organisers rule that they are appropriate for the ground conditions. At the start of a game, ends shall be decided by the toss of a coin. Play starts by the referee dropping the ball on the centre mark between a player from both teams who are no less than one metre from the centre mark. The game shall be restarted in the same manner after a goal has been scored.
9. Until a free kick has been taken, the opposition must be at least two metres from the ball.
10. A goalkeeper cannot kick the ball. However, they can make a save or stop the ball with their feet. When in possession of the ball in open play, a goalkeeper can only throw the ball out. Also, a 'throw out' replaces a goal kick. The throw cannot be an over arm action. (ie: javelin or bowling action) A goalkeeper cannot go outside the ' $D$ ' area. If a keeper kicks the ball, throws the ball over arm or goes outside the ' D ' area, an indirect free kick will be awarded to the opposing team at the nearest point on the edge of the ' $D$ '. A keeper can pick the ball up from a pass back.
11. All players are allowed inside the ' $D$ ' area.
13.Retreat Line Rule for under 7, under 8, under 9 and under 10 players. When the goalkeeper receives the ball the opposition players must retreat to their own half until the ball is in play. The defending team does not have to wait for the opposition to retreat and has the option to restart the game before should they choose to. The ball is in play when the goalkeeper rolls it out of the penalty area..

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
