Competition History



This is the 24th Final of the Hertfordshire FA Under 14 Girls Cup

The Under 14 Girls Challenge Cup was introduced in the 1997-98 season, reflecting the growth in girls playing across the county. This was the first time there had been County Cups specifically for girls in Hertfordshire and was introduced alongside Under 12 and Under 16 competitions, with cups for the 'odd' age groups being added from 2005-06.

The inaugural winners were Bushey Rangers who defeated Wormley Youth in that first final, however it is Watford Ladies who have been the most successful club in this competition, securing four wins in a seven year period from 2000 onwards, with a fifth added in 2022.

Hitchin Belles will be looking to add their name to the trophy for a second time, having previously won back in 2004. Victory today would see them become the fifth club to win this competition more than once, joining Garston Ladies, Harvesters and Stevenage Borough Juniors alongside Watford Ladies on the list of multiple winners.

Today's match will be 35 minutes each way, with kicks from the penalty mark if necessary. Teams are permitted roll-on/roll-off substitutes.

Recent Finals

The COVID pandemic caused the 2019-20 season to be cut short, with winning semi-finalists Watford Ladies and Garston declared to have shared the competition. The Under 14 Girls Cup was not run in the subsequent season before returning in 2021-22.

The club was founded by Roger Spicer in 1999 with the acknowledgement of Hitchin needing a girls football club. Within the first decade the club grew organically and quickly became one of the largest all female football clubs in the county.

At Hitchin Belles we aim to provide a caring, family environment where girls can develop their skills and enjoy football. Players are encouraged to challenge themselves, as we play competitive football with enjoyment and development at the forefront.

To continue our high standards it is crucial that all of our parents, carers, and supporters buy into the club's ethos, as they continue to positively represent Hitchin Belles.

Hitchin Belles has continued to thrive over the years to grow the female pathway. With a home ground at The Priory School we have expanded to over 450 registered players across 30 teams, making us one of the largest all female football clubs in England.

Club Profile

Hertford Town Girls

New beginning for a rapidly growing girls club in the east of the County



In 2015, after a successful tournament for their school, eleven girls signed up to create a first girls team within a local grassroots club. This team progressed brilliantly over the next two seasons, but the number of girls wanting to play football continued to grow rapidly.

After a successful Girls Football Week in November 2017, with forty girls now wanting to play, it was clear a new structure had to be put in place to develop girls football in the local area. It was then that a decision was made to start a new, girls only football club.

Meninas Football Club was formed and continued to grow rapidly. The club was founded on the principles that all players should 'Try - Learn - Improve - Enjoy' the game of football and be supported in doing so and the approach today is no different.

Changing from Meninas to Hertford Town Girls Football Club this season has given the club a clearer pathway from youth through to adult, offering players a direct route to the Hertford Town Women's team, regional football and state of the art facilities.

Give us your analysis of the season so far...

We introduced six new players to the squad this season but fortunately it took the girls very little time to gel together. So far scoring a total of 55 goals in fourteen games across all competitions and only conceding eight.

A tight defeat on the opening day only motivated the girls to lift the standards every week at training and the performances on matchdays have been a joy to watch.

Katlyn, Marlee and Alice have scored nearly half of those goals between them, while Mia, Ava and Holly have contributed enormously from the middle of the pitch. Annie and Brooke provide the team with natural width and constant energy up and down the pitch.

Bella and Tilly have competed brilliantly and offer a huge amount in defensive positions, built round the outstanding partnership Emily and Sienna have formed. Demi and Georgie continue to push one another to higher standards every week.

Do You Know How to Help Keep Your Child Safe in Football?

Safeguarding is about creating safe environments and preventing children from experiencing harm or abuse. Put simply, safeguarding refers to measures we take to protect our children - and keep them safe and well. Whether that's your kids, the opposing players or even the referee, every young person has the right to enjoy football.

The FA offer a short Safeguarding for Parents Course designed to help you to make an informed choice about the football setting you enrol your child in. It starts by explaining the importance of safeguarding in football and the child-centred approach the game takes.

It will then guide you through questions you should ask to ensure the club or venue where your children play has the correct safeguarding policies, people and practices in place. The course also highlights signs that should concern you – and how to report these concerns.
