

Competition History



This is the 23rd Final of the Hertfordshire FA Women's Senior Challenge Cup

Our Women's Cup was introduced in the 1999-2000 season, reflecting the growth in Women's football in the county. Great effort has been put into the development of the female game over many years and we are proud to have reached the stage where we have now been able to add a second Women's competition, making this our Senior Cup.

The first winners of this competition were Berkhamsted Town Ladies, defeating Welwyn Garden City Ladies 2-0. For the next decade Watford had something of a stranglehold on the cup, winning in eight seasons out of the next nine.

Arsenal's second-string then had a run of three successive victories, before Stevenage established their period of dominance in this competition, winning five of the last seven finals. Royston have featured in three previous finals and will be hoping to add their name to the trophy for the first time today. Watford will look to add to their impressive tally of previous cup victories, with the Development team having won in 2016 and 2019.

Today's match will be 45 minutes each way, with kicks from the penalty mark if necessary. Teams may use five substitutes from a list of five provided to the referee before kick off.

Recent Finals

The COVID pandemic caused the 2019-20 season to be cut short, with winning semi finalists Stevenage and Watford declared to have shared the competition. The Women's Cup was not run in the subsequent season before returning in 2021-22.

Club Profile Royston Town

Ambitious side looking to continue on its upward trajectory of recent years



The team began life in 1998-99 playing under the name of Heath Sports and were managed by Graham Phillips (who at the time was also secretary at Royston Town). Heath Sports changed their name and became part of Royston Town Football Club in 1998 and were consistent in the Eastern Region Women's Football League.

Lewis Endacott was appointed manager of the team in 2013. That season was the start of a successful period where we finished runners-up in the ERWFL Division 1, reached the final of the County Cup and secured some silverware by winning the League Plate. In the 2014-15 season we finished runners-up in the league again for a second season running, whilst retaining the League Plate and finishing runners up in the League Cup.

Whilst there was no cup success in 2015-16, we improved our league campaign by winning the ERWFL Division 1 and gained promotion to the ERWFL Premier Division. Since then we have established ourselves as a competitive side finishing runners up in 2021-22, narrowly missing out on promotion. Having missed out by the finest of margins in last years County Cup, we would love to take it one stage further and lift the trophy this season.

Despite a slow start in the league, losing the first two matches away at Bowers & Pitsea and Haringey Borough, we have had a great season so far. We then picked up good points with a convincing win against Kings Lynn Town and a deserved point away at Luton.

After defeat to high flying league leaders Real Bedford we went on an impressive ten game undefeated run in the league, winning nine games and drawing one. In the Women's Senior Cup we defeated holders Stevenage in the quarter-finals and then eventually beat Harpenden Town 4-0 in the semi-final in order to reach the final hurdle.

Watford FC Women Development forms an integral part of the wider club and has a proud history of developing young players who have later gone on to first team football either with Watford or other clubs.

We bring players through from our Emerging Talent and Player Development Centres and they are given an opportunity to compete not only in the FA Women's National League Reserve Division, but also in County Cup competitions such as this one.

The Women's First Team currently plays in the Barclays Women's Championship having been promoted from the FA Women's National League Southern Division in the 2022-23 season.

Your analysis of the season so far...

It's been a positive first season for Head Coach Renee Hector. Results have been a little inconsistent at times, but the ability of the group is very high and our performances in Cup Competitions in particular have been really pleasing – reaching not only the Senior Cup final but we are also in the Quarter-Final of the Combined Counties Floodlit Cup.

Safeguarding is about creating safe environments and preventing children from experiencing harm or abuse. Put simply, safeguarding refers to measures we take to protect our children - and keep them safe and well. Whether that's your kids, the opposing players or even the referee, every young person has the right to enjoy football.

The FA offer a short Safeguarding for Parents Course designed to help you to make an informed choice about the football setting you enrol your child in. It starts by explaining the importance of safeguarding in football and the child-centred approach the game takes.

It will then guide you through questions you should ask to ensure the club or venue where your children play has the correct safeguarding policies, people and practices in place. The course also highlights signs that should concern you – and how to report these concerns.


