### A Brief History of Colne FC





Colne F.C. were formed in January 1996, by a group of like-minded people under the wing of now Life President Dave Blacklock. The enthusiasts combined their strengths and knowledge of non-league football, and arrangements were made for a new club to use the vacant Holt House Stadium, once used by the Dynamoes in the North West Counties Football League Division Two.

Season 2003/04 brought the glory days to Colne with a string of successes. In the League, Colne had to play catch up after a successful cup run, but ended the season ten points clear in Division Two. Colne then completed the double by winning the Division Two Trophy 1 – 0 over Great Harwood.

The season was capped by an amazing run in the FA Vase for a North West Counties Football League Division Two club - they progressed all the way to the semi-finals, (via an incredible 1 – 2 away win at AFC Wimbledon) before being defeated over two legs 4 – 3 on aggregate to AFC Sudbury.

Colne created moe history in 2015/16, winning the NWCFL Premier Division with 100 points and also reached the Final of the League Cup.

2018-19 brings a new era for the club with the formation of the NPL West Division. Manager Steve Cunningham has recruited a new back room staff and again will be looking to challenge at the top end of the table.

### A Brief History of Bamber Bridge FC

Football in Bamber Bridge can be traced back as far as the late 1800's. However, the present club was established in the summer of 1974 when the old Bamber Bridge club amalgamated with neighbouring outfit Walton-Le-Dale. The new club played at the King George's Playing Field and the early years were marked with a high degree of success on the local football scene.



In those early years Bamber Bridge won the prestigious Lancashire FA Amateur Shield in 1981-82 and were finalists in 1980-81 and 1989-90.

A big claim to fame for Brigis when the club entertained the Czech Republic International team in a friendly game prior to the Czech's opening game against Germany in the European International Championship Finals in 1996. The successful Czech side had used Irongate for some of their preparations for the tournament in which they eventually finished as finalists.

Recent seasons have seen succes for Brig. In 2016/17, they won the Integro Final, beating four Premier teams on the way to lifting the coveted Trophy.

Bamber Bridge achieved promotion to the Northern League Premier Division last season after winning in the playoff final with a hard fought 1-0 win over Prescot Cables. In front of a crowd of 1628 the only goal was scored in the second half by local boy Chris Marlow.
