A Brief History of Leigh Foundry





Foundry FC are a re-established as of 2009 with the Club originally competing in the old Leigh League from the Foundry Arms Public House. Dootsons Park was called home.

Since the resurrection in 2009 Foundry has remained in the Wigan and District Amateur League having glimpses of success. You could say they are the nearly men.

The club's first two seasons saw back to back promotion from Division three

firstly as runner up. The following season again as runner ups just missing out on the title this time by three points.

The club then reached the Final of 2011/12 Colin Silcock Cup. The Club change hands and renamed Leigh Foundry FC for the 13-14 season, relocating to Siddow Park where they remain to date.

As seasons passed the Club floated mid table and reached various 1/4 and semi-finals but it wasn't until 16-17 season where the Club enjoyed its long anticipated success in winning the Colin Silcock Cup. They reached the Northern Cup Final and narrowly missed out on pens. That campaign also saw the Club promoted to the Wigan Prem as runner ups by a painstaking 3 points (yet again).

The Club had a relatively successful season in the Prem finishing 4th.

A Brief History of Newburgh Harrock United

Newburgh United was originally formed in 1952, and has played in several leagues since its formation. The current team is a continuation of a youth team started back in 2004. Today's squad still boasts members of that youth team in it's ranks.



Newburgh United have been ever present members of the Wigan & District Amateur League since 1982, the current team joined the League in the 2009-10 season. Then due to changes within the club Newburgh United amalgamated with the club's Sunday team Harrock, becoming Newburgh Harrock United in 2011, and replaced the previous first team in the Premier Division for 2010-11 season.

The club has a strong base of new players acquired over the last few seasons and is backed by improving facilities at their home ground thanks to Gareth Jones at Pleasant View GM.

In the previous 2-3 seasons under the joint management of Lee Butler & Eric Tyrer, the club had narrowly missed out league and cup honours including last season where despite finishing the league campaign unbeaten we lost out on the title by 1 point, however the club did secure a cup double winning our divisional cup against current Lancashire Cup holders Winstanley St Aidans just a week after beating this years Lancashire Cup quarter finalist Pemberton in the Wigan & District Amateur Leagues premier cup competition the Laithwaite Shield.
