# A Brief History of Old Mancunians Bluefi





Old Mancunians AFC were formed by Old Boys of The Manchester Grammar School in 1906, joining The Lancashire Amateur League (LAL) in the same year and starting a strong association which lasts to this day.

Their most notable triumph occurred in 1907 by entering the Beerschot Cup held in Belgium and defeating the also newly-formed Ajax 6-0 in the semi-final.

Despite this, it took OM almost 100 years to gain promotion to the Premier Division of the LAL, being crowned Division 1 Champions in 2004. OM made their only LFA Amateur Cup final appearance in the following season and the current squad are determined to emulate that achievement.

Following a 7th place finish in 2016/17 & 4th in 2017/18, Old Mancunians set their sights on finishing in the top three at the beginning of 2018/19. The season started brightly with back to back wins, but four points from the following five games saw OM slip down the table. The last of those five games, a 5-1 away defeat, was the catalyst the boys needed and since then have turned their season around, going un-

beaten for four months and winning twelve games on the bounce

# A Brief History of Elton Vale

Formed in 1957 when a team from Bury Gas Works had their sponsorship withdrawn by their employers.

Searching for a base two stalwarts of the emerging side, Ray Farrell and Vinny Cohen approached the local Workmens Club (Elton Fold) and arranged to use the cellar as a changing room. The connection with the "Fold "endured for 45 years and is still shown on the club badge.



The club played in the Bury Amateur League for about 8 years and were generally successful in the League but narrowly missed the elusive champions accolade. They did bring their first silverware home in 1961 in the form of the Kenyon Cup.

After a series of ups and downs the club have never hit the heights in the league and their best finish was 6th place in the Premier League. There have been three promotions and three relegations and the ignominy of once having to apply for re-election.

During this time they moved as part of the Sports Club we were 'lodging' with to a new facility at Elton Vale Road hence a new name for the football team in 2002. Lots of people have asked why they don't have regularly successful teams at such a fine facility. The answer is they don't really know.

The one success at first team level apart from the multiple promotions was lifting the Murray Trophy in 2014. They think things are turning for us and this run in the Amateur Cup is a confidence booster. All the semi finalists are there on merit from some 140 starters so lets look forward to an entertaining game.
