Main report findings



- A consensus that racism exists in grassroots football in London
- Football is still perceived as a predominantly white institution, especially in relation to positions of power and influence
- People from diverse ethnic communities have to taying 'white spaces' and there is a lack of lived experiences
- Institutional racism exists and manifests itself in a lack of representation across coaching and other senior roles across football
- Racism manifests it 2 to 5 training & Development ple, racial stereotyping and perceptions of unfairness / inequality
 - There is a lack of clarity across London FA members on who to report to and how to report instances of racism and discrimination

- Opening on 16th May 2022
- Clubs will have a designated affiliation lead to support them through the journey.
- Club affiliation guide and checklist to help guide clubs through the process.
- Early bird discount ends on 31st July. Late affiliation fee will be imposed from 1st August 2022 if not at ready for review.

Club Affiliation Overview



- For the sixth season running, we have not raised our affiliation fees.
- Public Liability Insurance will also be staying the same.
- Prior to the start of the COVID-19 pandemic, our insurance provider increased Personal Accident Insurance for both Youth and Adult teams slightly.
- Throughout the pandemic we were able to negotiate a 23% reduction in these costs; however, we can now confirm they have returned to pre-pandemic levels.




Player Registration Updates

Player Registration Overview



- Online consent lasts for five seasons, so should be a simple process for clubs to submit their players to the league.
- Offline consent only lasts for one season, so clubs will need to complete this process again.
- Clubs can submit players to your league from 5th July 2022.
- Player photos; please make sure when submitting your players, it is an actual head and shoulders shot.
- We strongly encourage all clubs to access their Club Portal (<u>clubs.thefa.com</u>) account and detach any players that are no longer part of your club.


You can now add/remove your team officials through the Club Portal (Clubs.thefa.com) by using the 'Officials' tab instead of doing this in WGS as in the past.

Club Portal- DBS Glitch



*When trying to add a coach through Club Portal, if it doesn't allow you to assign them as a Club Coach, select the 'Community Coach' option found in the Football Development drop down. This can occasionally happen even if the individual has an in-date DBS on their FAN.

Once this has been completed, the system will then update to see whether a DBS can be found. Replace the coach as Community Coach and add as 'Club Coach'.
