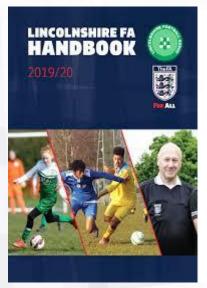

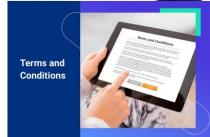


# WHAT DO WE ALREADY HAVE IN PLACE THAT WE CAN USE?









#### EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT This contract is an agreement between the two following parties, the Employee: and the Employer Employee: the teache Date of Birth: Phone Number Academic degree: Bachelor of Arts Date conferred: Address: Phone Number The employee will teach and train students at the educational institute and time designated by the institute and shall develop educational programs for students. During the term of this agreement, the employee must follow and strictly comply with the employer's policies and guidelines This contract is valid for one year, starting from 2008. The employee must inform the employer on whether she/he would like to renew the contract of not one (1) month prior to the end of the one (1) year of service and contract will be renewed by mutual agreement. 1. The number of regular teaching hours will be 120 hours per month, which is approximately 30 hours per week for 4.3 weeks. 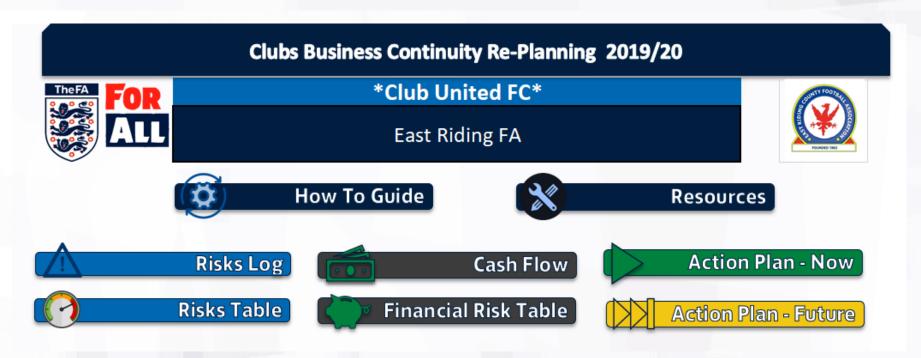

#### **TOP TIPS**

- Try to not just think about the here and now, but the future too. What impact will these uncertain times have on next season and beyond?
- Complete this with all relevant committee members/trustees/board of directors (in line with the government guidance). It will not only help to share the workload, but different risks can be assigned to individuals based on their skill sets/expertise.
- Avoid duplicating any work unnecessarily. You may already have documents which you can look to draw information from which maybe able to compliment this document.
- If your plan has identified several risks both operationally and financially try
  not to panic. The process is designed to highlight areas with a clear action to
  explore ways to mitigate those risks. Speak to your county FA for further
  support and guidance.

#### **BUSINESS CONTINUITY PLANNING - GUIDANCE NOTE**

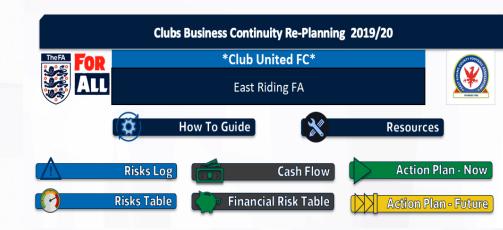
#### WHAT IS A BUSINESS CONTINUITY PLAN?

It is important to work out what will be affected and how your club/organisation will cope in emergency situations. Emergencies are rare but can have a very disruptive effect and can feel overwhelming. A Business Continuity Plan (BCP) is an action orientated plan that can help you prepare for, or respond to, emergencies and help your organisation to continue to operate during challenging times.

#### WHY DO WE NEED ONE

Preparing a BCP will help you think through the impact of an emergency on the every-day running of your club/organisation. It will also help you plan for different ways of working so that you can:

- · Avoid ad-hoc or knee jerk responses being taken
- Understand the risks and impact of an emergency.
- Have a framework in place that is agreed and ready to use.
- · Cope with the emergency
- Decide what your most important activities are and what you need to deliver them
- Safeguard your operations as far as possible.
- Continue to meet the priority needs of your members/customers as far as possible (this may not be possible if social distancing/lockdown rules apply).
- Respond and recover as quickly as possible.
- Build your resilience.

### **SPORT ENGLAND COMMUNITY EMERGENCY FUND**

This new fund aims to help community sport and physical activity organisations who are experiencing short term financial hardship or the ceasing of operations due to the ongoing coronavirus crisis. This includes football clubs & leagues.

- Grants from £300-£10,000
- Applications from 01 March to 31 July 2020
- Applications processed in 7-10 days
- All other Govt support must be exhausted...



#### FINANCIAL NEED MUST BE DEMONSTRATED

- The expected financial impact over the next three months, including the impact of any actions you can take to reduce this
- The minimum expenditure you will have to meet while activity isn't happening
- Any immediately available, unrestricted funds you have in reserve.

Note: applicants will not be penalised for having reserves but you need to say how you're going to use these as well as the funds you're applying for.

#### What can be funded:

- Rent
- Utility costs
- Insurances
- Facility or equipment hire
- Core staffing costs (including casual workers) that cannot be met elsewhere by other government funds
- Retrospective losses dating from 1 March, 2020.

#### What cannot be funded:

- Activities or costs which are already covered by other government funding, including rates
- New activities or events please see our other funding programmes for this
- Capital works
- Costs beyond the end of July 2020
- Players wages or salaries

#### **Business Rate Holiday**

Business rates not to be paid for 2019/20

#### **Small Business Grant Funding**

£10K grant for clubs who receive small business rate relief or rural rate relief

#### Cash Grants for Leisure (clubs)

£10K grant if rateable value <£15K £25K grant if rateable value >15K<51K

#### Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme

Grant 80% PAYE salary up to £2,500/month for 3 months
Plus payment for Employer NI contribution +
Min. automatic enrolment employer pension contributions

#### Self-employment Income Support Scheme

A grant to self-employed individuals or partnerships, worth 80% of their profits up to a cap of £2,500 per month

#### **Statutory Sick Pay Rebate**

Able to reclaim Statutory Sick Pay (SSP) for staff sickness absence due to coronavirus for up to 2 weeks

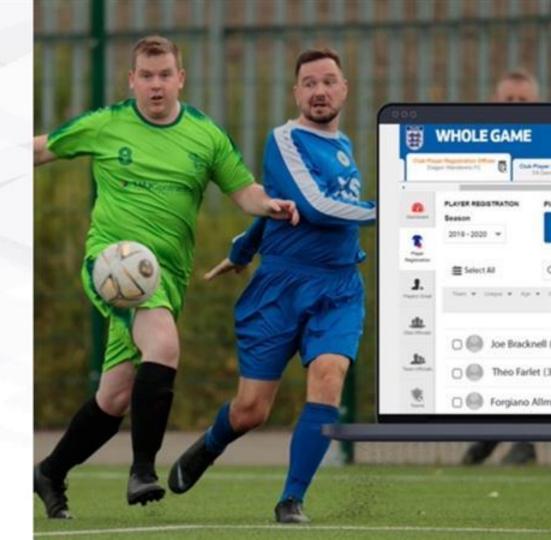

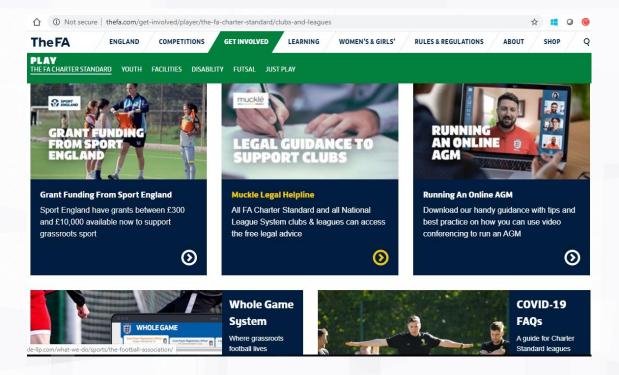
