CLAIMING FOR STORM DAMAGE

With all the joys of proper winter weather on the way, it's important to know what to do to get ready for a storm and how to make a Home Insurance claim if damage does occur.

In early 2022, storms caused havoc in the UK, with three large storms (Dudley, Eunice and Franklin) being named in just one week in February. These led to some of the highest wind speeds in the UK in more than 30 years.

To help protect your home and family, make sure you create an action plan that you can follow in the event of a storm or flood. This should include a place of evacuation, items you should move upstairs in case of flooding, and emergency contact details for your utilities.

You should also check what cover your Home Insurance gives you. Storm damage is usually covered under the Buildings Insurance section of your policy, but definitions over what constitutes a 'storm' may differ slightly. It's also a good idea to make sure your property is well maintained before stormy weather comes along to prevent any complications.

Unless told to by emergency services, do not get rid of any damaged contents in your home. These will need to be assessed as part of your claim, so evidence may be needed. If you have any questions about the storm damage cover provided in your Home Insurance policy, you can talk to our dedicated Personal Insurance team. 
