POWERS & RESPONSIBILITIES OF A CLUB REFEREE

Club Referee

- SCORY Rule 23(b) "where an official referee isn't appointed, the agreed individual has the full powers, status and authority of a registered referee"
- FA Handbook Reg 13 "Referees must submit a report to the relevant Affiliated Association within two days of the Match (excluding Sundays) stating the cautionable, sending-off offences and/or extraordinary incidents"
- Review of the Refereeing pages on Norfolk FA.Com currently under review
- Youth referees can only officiate age groups below their current age, for example:
 - 16 yr old can referee U15s & below
 - 14 yr old can referee U13s & below



Responsibilities

The referee:

- enforces the Laws of the Game
- controls the match in cooperation with the other match officials
- acts as timekeeper
- keeps a record of the match and provides the appropriate authorities with a match report, including information on disciplinary action and any other incidents that occurred before, during or after the match
- supervises and/or indicates the restart of play
- Player Safety











THE FA REFEREES COURSE

The FA Referees Course

- Usually: Friday 6pm 9pm & Sunday 9am 5pm
- £125 Includes all training modules, Equipment and 1st Season Referee Registration.
- Covers Mini Soccer, 9v9 and 11v11
- To qualify: referee 5 Matches








- Module 4: Offside.
- Module 5: Managing Restarts and Set-Pieces- covers restarts and set-pieces, including goal kicks, corner kicks, throw-ins, free kicks and penalty kicks.
