




WHAT DO YOU NOT ENJOY?



"North Riding always are checking up on refs and they seem to always listen to refs and give young referees especially to voice their opinion."

"My mentor has been to several of my games and gave me advice, and I learnt a lot from my courses that has helped me become a better referee"

"If I need support they are a phone cal away and provide me with help and any questions"

"Yes and No, yes because I feel like I can turn to my Mentor for advice and help. No because let's say there is a game been played and I make so mistakes and then the parents get a bit angry and the only thing from stopping them from coming on to the pitch is a bit of string, not like that as ever happened."




WHY DO YOU WEAR OR NOT WEAR IT?
