

The team originally entered the league as OUP Veterans in 2015 and finished mid table in the first year. They then won promotion to the Veterans Premier Division in 2016/17 season by finishing second in the league. It was a brief stay in the Veterans Premier Division top flight as they were relegated in their very first season. In the summer of 2018, they changed their name to Marston Saints Veterans as there was no longer an OUP football club and there has been always been connections to both clubs. Some of the players actually go back all the way to Summertown Stars of the early 90's where seven or eight of the Veterans squad started playing youth football together. They progressed from Summertown's youth team to OUP in the late 90's and the majority of current squad has played either Saturday or Sunday football for OUP or has played for Marston Saints throughout the years.




