

Yellow Card Offences – Referee to Report Violent Conduct, Serious Foul Play etc – Referee to Report Racist/Sexist/Homophobic or any other discriminatory language or gestures– Referee or Club to Report.

How to report

Club Secretary to email - <u>Discipline@Sheffieldfa.com</u> They will send you a form for all statements to go on.

Be prepared to attend a Personal Hearing if required! (U18s May be required to attend)



Referees

Define

Poor overall Performance or Conduct.

How to report

Email sheffieldfa.com to receive link to 'Referee Reporting Form'. This is to be filled out by Club Secretary or Manager who was present at game. Statements from other people may be attached to this.

If the complaint is due to performance, please give timed, detailed examples where Referee is wrong in law.



RESPECT

Define: "Have due regard for (someone's feelings, wishes, or rights)"


Reporting Respect

There is only <u>one</u> method to report RESPECT issues regarding opposition teams.

Full Time or Matchday RESPECT scores.

If you see behaviour that you believe is below the threshold expected, please ensure this is reflected on the scores as well as adding comments with specific info e.g names/roles/specific language or behaviours





None of the above

A Referee who gives a one off decision that you disagree with, does not constitute a overall poor performance (last minute penalty for example).

Being beaten by a team 8-0 by is not a respect issue.

Embedding RESPECT- Club Values & Rules

Scenarios Time!

- 1. During the weekend fixtures club officials have witnessed the U11 manager consistently questioning the decisions of the referee- the behaviour emboldened the players who also began to moan at the referee.
- 2. A parent from your team has reported that another parent from your club is continually encouraging players from your club to be aggressive and foul opposition players.

Do your current Players/Spectators/Coaches? understand the behaviours expected of them?

Do you know your clubs current process for managing respect complaints made against members?

Do your members understand how to report respect issues?



Code of Conducts



- . Have fun; it's what we're all here for!
- · Celebrate effort and good play from both sides
- Always respect the Referee and coaches and encourage players to do the same
- . Stau behind the touchline and within the Designated Spectators' Area (where provided)
- · When players make mistakes, offer them encouragement to try again next time
- · Never engage in, or tolerate offensive, insulting or abusive language or behaviour
- . I will make myself familiar with safeguarding practices & review guidance on physical contact (5.6) & Acceptable Behaviours When Working With Young People (5.7) documents on the safeguarding section of EnglandFootball.com

I understand that if I do not follow the Code,

- · Issued with a verbal warning or asked to leave
- · Required to meet with the club committee, league or CFA Welfare Officer
- . Obliged to undertake an FA education course
- · Requested not to attend future games, be suspended or have my membership removed
- · Required to leave the club along with any dependents and/or issued a fine





I understand that if I do not follow the Code.

- · Be dropped, substituted or suspended from training



Club Constitution/Rules

Most Clubs have something similar to the below in their constitutions.

"(b) The Club Committee shall have the power to expel a member when, in its opinion, it would not be in the interests of the club for them to remain a member. An appeal against such a decision may be made to the Club Committee in accordance with the Complaints Procedure in force from time to time."



Club Process Example (To be added to constitution/rules)

Parent/Spectator breaches

Step 1: Warning and reminder of COC/Rules

Step 2: 1 game club suspension

Step 3: Multiple game club suspension

Step 4: Expelled from club

Youth player breach

Step 1: Coach to speak to player and guardian to outline the issue

Step 2: Club to request player and guardian complete respect e-module

Step 3: Player respect report

Step 4: Reduced playing minutes

Step 5: 1 Game suspension etc etc



Matchday Process Example

Parent/Spectator breaches

Step 1: Warning and reminder of COC/Rules

Step 2: Ask to leave the spectator area for the remainder of the

match

Youth player breach

Step 1: Coach to speak to player and remind player of expectations.

Step 2: Player to be temporarily substituted

Step 3: Player to be permanently substituted






- 3. Clear operating procedures to deal with RESPECT issues
- 4. In house respect reporting platform
