## EVERY PROJECT MUST:

1. Be based on local community football needs and identified via a Local Football Facility Plan
2. Benefit community clubs and leagues
3. Be accessible at peak times for community football

<sup>2</sup> Investment levels for the future without Wembley sale, from The FA, Premier League and DCMS, is expected to be £54m per year, so £540m over 10 years and £1.1bn over 20 years.

<sup>3</sup> Total net proceeds from a Wembley sale is expected to be £590m. Approximately £45m would be invested each year (excludes matched funding), with remaining funds earning an average 5% rate of return. With interest, total of £920m would be available for investment over 20 years, totalling £1.5bn with 40% matched funding.

<sup>4</sup> Estimated costs are as follows: 3G pitch £850,000; changing pavilion £750,000; grass pitch £70,000.
