Pre-Match Preview: George Gaskin

It's been a Sussex Transport Senior Cup run to remember for George Gaskin's Littlehampton Town, as his side made history by knocking out last season's winners, Worthing.

Indeed, the feat is made even more remarkable by the fact that many of players that Gaskin credits with his side's good form this season were Worthing loanees, and thus unable to feature in the game.

"We've been really lucky to have some of the most talented young players in Sussex play for us this season, thanks to Worthing and then manager, Adam Hinshelwood," said Gaskin.

"It was very much a game where we knew we'd have to really dig in and defend our goal as best we could, and then just look to make the most of any chances.

"Thankfully we were able to do just that, and personally, I felt that was one of our best performances and wins, even taking into account our day out at Wembley the other year."

Yet the Marigolds weren't done yet, proceeding to then knock out last year's runners up, Bognor Regis Town, 6-I in the Quarter-Finals.

"That was an interesting game, and we definitely didn't expect that result." said Gaskin.

"But whereas with Worthing, we knew we'd need to defend deep and hit when we could, we went for a more aggressive man-to-man approach against Bognor, and backed ourselves!

Of course, it should be pointed out at this point that Gaskin isn't alone in the dugout, having shared the duties with fellow coach Mitchell Hand.

"That season I really hit a good stretch of form though upfront and was scoring a lot of goals for us, so for a while it was Mitch on the sidelines, which I know was a lot for him at the start.

The joint manager relationship is of course a rare one the higher you go up the pyramid, so what's the secret for it working so well for Gaskin and Hand?

"Obviously it helps that we're really good mates and had been for a long time before we took this job on together," said Gaskin.

"But the fact that we've been so successful together, especially considering the standard of our league, shows that we've managed to get that balance right."

For Gaskin, it's their confidence and team spirit that he sees as being the key difference, come next week's Semi-Final clash against Hastings United.

"When we've had cup runs in the past, and when we got promoted, it was that team spirit and that togetherness that really helped us," said Gaskin

With that in mind, just what kind of test is Gaskin expecting against Chris Agutter's side?

"Like us they've had something of a season of two halves," said Gaskin.

"But on our day, I fancy us against anyone, so we'll just have to maintain that confidence.

"We know our players and what they can do, it'll just be a case of if they can go to that extra gear and make that step up, which they're proved they're more than capable of doing this season."

Pre-Match Preview: Chris Agutter

For Hastings United, it's been a somewhat turbulent season, with former manager Chris Agutter returning to dugout following the departure of Paul Barnes back in October.

Yet, despite this, a Sussex Transport Senior Cup Semi-Final clash against Littlehampton Town awaits. However, even on the pitch, the road to this point in the competition was hardly a smooth one.

"Under Paul [Barnes] we did well to come out of our tie against Three Bridges with a 4-3 win," said Agutter, "and then since I've come in, we've just had the boring games!

"Crawley Down Gatwick in the Third Round was one of those games where, if we didn't get an early goal, they'd look to sit deep for the duration, which proved to be the case.

"So, after winning on penalties against them, our Quarter-Final clash against Eastbourne Borough proved a similar story, just with atrocious conditions being the key factor in that one."

Of course, for Agutter the fact that, after only five months back at the helm his side are both on the cusp of a place in a final, and still chasing down a play-off spot, is testament to the hard work the team have put in.

"When I arrived, I was told that the expectations were very much to stay up," said Agutter.

"For me, the issues lay in the fact that at the start of the season, the club had started to drift away from local people.

"But as it stands, we're way ahead of schedule and the season has definitely gone far better than I expected, with both the Senior Cup and the League."

With this remarkable uptake in form clear for all to see, what would Agutter put the turnaround down to?

"It's been a combination of factors, but what's really helped has been putting faith back in some of the younger local lads," said Agutter.

"The consequence of that has been that supporters can then see local, homegrown players coming through, and they know they're Hastings based.

"When supporters have that connection and know that the players will be fighting for the shirt, win, lose or draw, they get behind them more.

"They're like a 12th man for us, and in so many games this season they've made away games feel like we're playing back at the Pilot Field."

With the supporters well and truly connecting with the team once again, the performances of certain players has certainly come to reflect that in Agutter's eyes.

"Players such as Adam Lovatt and Davide Rodari have really kicked on another gear these last few months," said Agutter.

"They've had a chance to come back, and they're now almost the senior statesmen in the team, even though they're still in their twenties."

To reach the final, many of Agutter's players will have to park memories of last year's Semi-Final, in which they went out on penalties to eventual winners, Worthing.

"It's an opportunity to get to a cup final, and at this time of the season the majority of teams aren't playing for anything, so for us it's just an exciting time," he said.

"So, we'll just look to prepare for the game as best we can and, like with every game, give our all to go that one step further this year."
