Pre-Match Preview: Kevin Green

For Kevin Green's Steyning Town, this season's Sussex Transport Senior Cup run has been an exhibition in giant killings.

"It's been a memorable season to say the least," laughs Green as he looks back on the past few months, "with some incredible nights at our place in both The FA Cup and the Senior Cup.

"Of course, in this competition, there's only one place to start really, and that's our game against Brighton & Hove Albion."

Steyning's remarkable 2-1 win over the Albion was witnessed by 800 of their supporters and set them on a run of form that propelled them to a 5-4 win on penalties over Burgess Hill Town, following a 2-2 draw.

"Having all those supporters down at the Birchwood Ground made it such an incredible night," said Green, "I think I'll always remember seeing the kids chasing after Lewis Dunk when they saw he'd turned up!

"It was an incredible game, and speaking afterwards I remember saying to some coaching mates that work with professional academics, that it was like watching two proper Under-23 sides going at it, the quality on display was that high."

So what would Green put down as the secret to their cup successes?

"To be honest, it's simply down to us having a really good squad this year," he said.

"We've got a great bunch of lads who are, above all else, really committed to the club and committed to the way we want to play." Away from the cup runs, Steyning are matching their good knockout form in the Southern Combination Football League, where they currently sit in third, just a point behind leaders Newhaven.

To compete on so many fronts requires a deep squad, and Green is quick to laud praise on his key men.

"Overall, we've got such a strong side across the board, but in terms of ones who've really been difference makers you've got our captain, Jack Barnes, who's the engine room of our midfield and first name on the team sheet every week," he said.

"Then you have the likes of Tom Chalaye, who we brought in only recently, but has been banging in the goals, and is currently on 20 in as many games for us.

"Defensively we've got Nathan Cooper at the back and then the likes of Harry Shooman, but to be honest I could list off the whole squad."

Of course, next up for Green's men is another formidable test, this time in the form of free scoring Horsham, who've netted 14 times in the competition on the way to next week's Semi-Final.

"We know Horsham as we've watched them quite a few times, and we know how they're going to play," said Green.

"The players won't be phased by it, that's for sure, but we know that we'll have to be at our very best.

"But you never know with these games; nobody expected us to be in the competition at this stage, so we'll be sure to give it a real go to see if we can't push it one step further!"

Pre-Match Preview: Dominic Di Paola



Whilst their remarkable FA Cup journey might have come to an end, the chance to make history in Sussex Transport Senior Cup still awaits them, as they prepare to take on Steyning Town Community at Culver Road next week.

Their journey to the Semi-Final has been an exhibition in clinical finishing, with Di Paola's men racking up 14 goals in the competition so far.

"Whilst the scoreline tells one story, those games in the early rounds did prove a test for us, that's for sure," said Di Paola.

"Going into the Chichester City game, we were coming off the back of our FA Cup escapades, so it was a test for the lads to park those emotions and deliver on the night, so I was really pleased with the way we went about that win.

"Then the game against Eastbourne United, which was played on one of the coldest nights of my life, and in such conditions there's a chance that you don't turn up, but the boys put in another great performance to see us through."

And in terms of the difference makers in the side, who would Di Paola point to?

Every player has played a role in helping this team really push on," he said, "but in terms of these cup games I'd say both Jack Strange in defence and Daniel Ajakaiye have really stood out.

"But across the board each player has really stepped up, because in a season like this where we're shuffling and rotating so much, we've needed each of them to do just that for us."





For Di Paola, this year marks his ninth at the club, a near decade of involvement that has seen its fair share of change at Horsham.

"When I joined back then, the club was effectively homeless, there were no players left, and they'd just been relegated back into the County League," he said.

"But from being where we were to where we are now, having moved into the new ground and starting to get some really big crowds, we've really grown as a club."

Looking to the future though, and next week's Semi-Final clash with Steyning, Di Paola is under no illusions that Kevin Green's Barrowmen will be a tough test for his side.

"They're having a great season, and I'd back them to go on and win that league," he said, "you look at who they've had to beat to get to the Semi-Final, the likes of Burgess Hill and of course Brighton & Hove Albion.

"I know their players, so I know the quality they have, and there's a fair few that are better than their level, so we know it's going to be a tough game."

Yet of course, there's added pressure on the shoulders of Di Paola, as he looks to try and get his side to their first Sussex Transport Senior Cup final in nearly 20 years.

"Personally, I've got to the Semi-Final a few times over the years, so I'm desperate for us to get over the line next week," he said.

"For the club as well it's also a massive chance to make it back to the final, and potentially go on and lift a trophy we've not won since the 1970s.

"But one thing we have in this group is winners, and with that mentality and that experience I back us every day of the week against any opponent!"
