

One day whilst having a cup of tea, the Referee Development Officer was sat close by. He was worried he didn't have enough referees, so he persuaded Walter to do some referee training.




Walter was very keen and loved the idea. He completed a referee course and was officially a referee.

He wanted to do the best job possible so the boys and girls he refereed could enjoy a safe game.






Walter was then asked to referee his first game.


Walter was keen to keep up refereeing and managed to do lots more games; he was getting very good. He refereed all the way to the end of season.


On Monday morning when Walter arrived into work all his friends were smiling at him, and saying "well done!" His boss said he would be surprised when he got home.

The game is being played at the Zoo's pitch and kicks off just after feeding time!






The very next morning Walter arrived at the office.


He went straight to the stationery cupboard and got some colourful pens and paper and made some posters.





Walter made sure the posters told the truth and celebrated what is wonderful about Grassroots football.


- Please do not swear at referees, we are still learning.
