In attendance on Tuesday evening, we had our Disability Football Ambassadors and Disability Coach Mentors, sharing their vast experience and knowledge with the 13 clubs in attendance from across the region. Clubs engaged in a self-assessment of their current position, before identifying where they want to get to and what they can do to create a positive environment to engage people with disabilities. ENGLAND TALENT DAY

On Friday 23rd February, we will be hosting an England Talent day at St John Fisher Voluntary Catholic Academy for players aged 7-16 eligible for the Para Talent Pathway.

The event is for players with hearing impairments, visual impairments and players with cerebral palsy (and are ambulant). FA England Talent Days are utilised as a player's first engagement with the Para Football Pathway and as the first selective environment in the player pathway. The programme will identify and signpost players to the 'right' environment at that point in time and seeks to feed the subsequent Regional and National levels of the pathway. The Para Football player pathway runs ALONG SIDE any football that players already participate in, so does not compromise or replace any current involvement in the game.

Players do not have to be playing within the disability pathway, in fact, up to 75% of players on the Para Talent Pathway play within mainstream football. For further information, including how to nominate a player click on the link below

This FREE virtual workshop will provide expert advice and resources on how your club / league can support LGBTQ+ players and supporters. Football v Homophobia and Just Eat have teamed up to launch Allies United – an initiative designed to support grassroots football clubs in enabling more inclusivity in the grassroots game. Just Eat research reveals that over 70% of people from the LGBTQIA+ community would not consider playing football, with barriers cited as concerns about homophobic and transphobic language used, a lack of feeling welcomed and there not being enough conversation around LGBTQIA+ allyship.
