The earliest record found of Corsham Football Club is 1878 with the club becoming affiliated to the Football Association in 1893. Over the years, the team has often been referred to as the Quarrymen due to the high level of quarrying in and around Corsham.

Justin Flowers was promoted to first team manager for the 2018/19 season following the surprise resignation of first team manager Jamie Harrison, who has accepted a higher position at Yeovil Town Academy. Justin Flowers has been at the club since he was 16, playing in our U18's, Reserves and 1st team, and is one of the club's most decorated players. More recently he has managed the reserve team where he has also been very successful. He is assisted by Phil Golding; Graham Learmonth and his ever-faithful physio Stuart Joslin make up the first team management line-up.

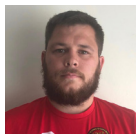
"This is a competition with a lot of history. Corsham Town have won this competition five times in the past and we would love to add to that.

Tonight's game will be our toughest test so far and as a squad we will be ready to test ourselves against them.

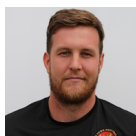

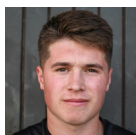
DAVE CARDUS: Goalkeeper

Great stop stopper and quick off his line. Been in superb form since getting into the team.



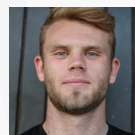
ADAM CLATWORTHY: Goalkeeper

Fantastic all round keeper. Unfortunately has been injured so far this season but his eagerly awaited comeback isn't too far away.



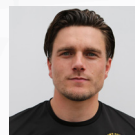
COREY HARBOUR-BURGESS: Fullback

Club captain. Huge calming influence on the squad. As calm and composed as they come. Reading of the game second to none.



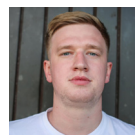
ALI MAYOH: Centre back

ALEX HILLIER: Centre back

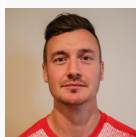
Solid and reads the game so well. Can also play in midfield. Protects the defence superbly. Also fantastic in the air.



NICK CHANDLER: Midfielder

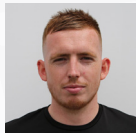
As solid and brave as they come. Loves a dangerous header or tackle. Protects the defence brilliantly. Leaves everything on the pitch.

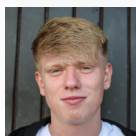
JAMES GARDNER: Midfielder

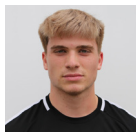


ZAC HILLIER: Midfielder

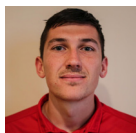
EDDIE SWAIN: Winger

Justin has been a prolific scorer over his long career. Goals has come at every club which includes Andover, Gosport, Salisbury and Oxford.



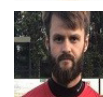
George Bennett. Age – 24. Position – Midfield

Pacey wide man who joined the club from Verwood. Another former Salisbury Development player.



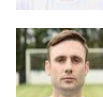
Danny Field. Age – 30. Position – Defender

There are few from the area that can match Eddie on his day. Fantastic dribbling ability and scores crucial goals in crucial games.



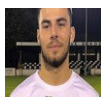
George Plank. Age – 24. Position – Defender
