Deliver good quality learning sessions that deliver content in a dynamic and inspiring manner.

Key accountabilities as a licensed tutor:

- Deliver FA Education in the manner intended and in line with the FA Principles of Practice.
- Demonstrate high expectations of yourself and learners ensuring a positive learning experience for all.
- Maintain correct and timely records of learner attendance and achievement.
- Provide individualised support for learners, as designed by the course, to maximise learner potential and drive progression.
- Commit to continual professional development, supporting quality processes and maintaining an individual Tutor Action Plan.
- Maintain mandatory training requirements, ensuring they are in date at all times.

Completion of FA Tutor Training (GTT or DDT) or a paramedic with Health and Care Professions Council commitment to complete in the 2017/2018 season. (HCPC) Experience of delivering to adults in an education setting. a Health Care Professional or Allied Health Professional Understanding of the FA Learning Cycle. (MCSP/SOST/BASRAT – Level 4 or above). Competent use of learning technology. a nurse with the Nursing and Midwifery Council (NMC). a doctor with the General Medical Council (GMC).
