International Clearance request for a player who is of Asylum Seeker or Refugee Status in England



International clearance is required for any player from the age of 10 and upwards who is seeking to register for a Club in England and has previously been registered for a Club abroad (including the other Home Associations), or who is a foreign national seeking to register for the first time in this country. Players who are in England as asylum seekers or refugees (either over 18, or under 18 (with or without parents) must also receive clearance before they can play. These specific cases must be made to FIFA directly, through The FA, on behalf of Clubs. Below is a list of documents FIFA require to consider each case. A full detailed list of the required documents is set out within the guidance notes, available on The FA's website TheFA.com

If there are documents which the Club, Player and/or Parents or local authorities cannot provide, a written and signed statement must be provided in its place.
