Who gives up their own time to go above and beyond for your club?

Tell us who makes a difference as volunteers. Those who make an impact on match days or behind the scenes.

Those who are supportive and positively contribute to football in the community for the enjoyment of others.

The judging panel will review the applications based on the following criteria:

The volunteer must have made a significant contribution to football in their community

The volunteer may have taken steps to improve the standard of their volunteering through sports/football courses

The volunteers should act in a responsible and professional manner and be seen as a role model in their community.

RISING STAR Of the year

Who is dedicated to helping make grassroots football enjoyable for everyone?

Your rising star nomination should be for someone who has made a real contribution to football in the community. Someone who is a role model, who acts responsibly, and encourages and supports others.

Your nominee must be under 25 years of age on the closing date of the nominations.

THE SPIRIT OF GRASSROOTS FOOTBALL AWARD

2021 winner Cara Wall

We're looking for those special individuals, club, league or group who see grassroots football as a place to positively impact the well-being of all. It is the forefront of their thinking.

Do you know somebody who raised the bar in lockdown and through the pandemic – perhaps they created a befriending hotline? Did they put together a virtual event to connect their players and raise money for a charity? Or is the well-being of players embedded in your club – do you listen to players allowing them to make a difference to their own club? How about an incredible Welfare Officer who goes above and beyond to make sure the experiences of the players and volunteers is a great one?

The award is to recognise how they've developed support to make sure their community stay happy, healthy and connected.

This is more than just playing, but about the power of football to support mental health, positivity and building a football family.

It's for those who think about the whole player and volunteers as developing people rather than just producing players or winning matches. Supporting each other in a safe, fun and fair environment on and off the pitch. This could be in response to COVID 19, or as a continuation of what they already do.
