



St. George's Park Environmental Policy

St. George's Park is owned by the National Football Centre Ltd, a private limited company wholly owned by The FA Group. St. George's Park will be the training home of the 24 England teams, and a national coach education, development and sports medicine centre for football, sport and business. The 330-acre St. George's Park will be a national home for English football, set in the geographical heart of the country near Burton-Upon-Trent. It will be a world-class training facility, providing a national home for coach education – in time producing more and better players, bespoke training facilities for teams, individual players and athletes and a training home for the 24 England teams.

The scope of this Environmental Policy for St. George's Park includes all activities at the site, and is part of the wider Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) remit for The FA Group.

A key value of St. George's Park is its commitment to leadership in environmental sustainability. St. George's Park is therefore committed to managing the environmental impacts of activities at the facility. Implementing, documenting and maintaining an Environmental Management System (EMS) will allow detailed analysis of environmental impacts and the establishment of benchmark performance data against which objectives, targets, management plans and procedures can be set to monitor and improve environmental performance over time.

St. George's Park will review, monitor and measure environmental performance across the facility. Impacts will be managed from key areas relating to energy, fuel and water consumption, waste management, transport, sustainable procurement, marketing and communication, and biodiversity.

St. George's Park will engage with and influence its stakeholders to ensure continual improvement in environmental performance. Stakeholders include partners, sponsors, suppliers, contractors and the local community visitors, staff and tenants based at the site. St. George's Park will expect all tenants and internal stakeholders to adhere to the principles of this policy.

St. George's Park is committed to continually improving its environmental performance and the prevention of pollution as well as complying with all environmental legislation and any other requirements to which St. George's Park subscribes. Innovation, aspiration and education in sustainability will also be encouraged in this leading learning environment.
