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Schools' Competition National Football Framework



The following framework sets out the English Schools' Football Association (ESFA) and The Football Association (The FA) framework for inter-school football competitions from Key Stage 1 to 4. The framework offers a variety of engaging options for all young people including young people with disabilities. These include:

- Mini-soccer at Key Stage 2
- The use of 6v6 or 7v7 for development purposes at first phase of Secondary School
- Transition to 9v9
- 11-a-side at Year 6 and above
- Futsal (5-a-side), an exciting new game to the majority of English Secondary Schools.

This framework builds on the schools competitions provided by the ESFA District and County Associations up and down the country. It is integral to the coordination and development of schools' football competitions that Schools' Football Associations must be engaged in the implementation of any new aspects outlined in the framework. All schools' competitions must be registered and sanctioned by the District Schools or County Schools Associations. In addition, Schools' Associations provide 11-a-side representative school football. For further information please contact:

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Competitions

The ESFA is the governing body of schools' football and is responsible for the organisation and development of schools' competitions and festivals for primary and secondary aged boys and girls. The FA works with ESFA to support high quality, administered and coordinated inter-school football competition programmes for all young people.

The District and County Association run a programme of national competitions from U11 to U19. The Associations, as well as providing locally coordinated competitions also provide opportunities for young people to have the experience of playing at a higher level by representing their district or county team.

England School Boys – U18's

The ESFA run a school boys U18 team who play against Northern Ireland in the Centenary Shield, Scotland and the Republic of Ireland.

Player selection

The ESFA selection committee watch players from around the Country between August and October. At the end of October County trials and matches take place so that in November four squads of 16 players are selected from the regions of the North, Midlands, South West and South East. County borders are flexible to give the strongest candidates the best chance of making the squad. 32 players are selected for a training weekend in December at Lillleshall. After that weekend 20 players are selected to represent English schoolboys

Coaching Staff

All coaching staff hold the UEFA 'A' licence and are full time teachers. The FA provides the squad Doctor for the season.

Bursary programme

The ESFA runs a bursary programme for teachers employed in the education sector to attend FA Coaching and medical courses. Application forms can be obtained from the ESFA HQ in Stafford 01785 251142 or from www.TheFA.com/grassroots/footballinschools.
