NEWS MAJOR AND MINOR UNIT CUP FINALS REVIEW



Congratulations to **1 Yorkshire Regiment** who scored two goals in the final seven minutes of normal time to retain the Army FA Challenge Cup beating 3RSME in the 118th final in Aldershot. After a goalless first half Minley based 3RSME opened the scoring on 48 minutes through LCpl Lee McCombie. An open second half saw chances at either end but the drama happened in the final stages. Pte Ross Amner levelled on 83 minutes with a lethal strike. With the game heading towards injury time excellent work from Amner and Cpl Darren Clark set up Pte Marcus Barnes who fired home into the roof of the net. Amner was presented the Man of the Match by Pam Howson from 34 year sponsors Towergate Insurance as the winners received the prestigious trophy from the Home Command Sergeant Major.

INAUGURAL CORPS CUP FINALS SUCCESS



The inaugural Corps Cup Finals Day in Aldershot last month resulted in success for the RLC and Royal Engineers. The opening Women's Edwards Challenge Cup Final was viewed by a healthy number of Corps Colonels and a brace from Sgt Tracey Montgomery (ATR Grantham) was sufficient to record a 2-0 victory for **Royal Logistic Corps Women** v REME. The cup winners netted 10 goals in the competition without their net being breached.

A pulsating Woolwich Cup Final saw **Royal Engineers** come from behind and avoid a last minute scare before defeating AGC 7-2 after extra time in a match that was a credit to men's corps football.

Hat-tricks from Sgt Jay Hubbard (23 Engr Regt) and Spr Dan Stoneman (3RSME) plus Spr Sam Atkinson (33 Engr Regt) was enough to see the trophy head back to Chatham for a fifth time in seven years. It didn't tell the whole story though as the AGC equipped themselves superbly over the initial 90 minutes. Cpl Dan Kodi (1 Yorks) opened the scoring on seven minutes whilst Cpl Corey Pearce (1 Sig Regt) levelled matters midway through the second half.

Brigadier Martyn Gamble addressed both sets of players before the trophies were lifted by the respective captains.

DINGER STEPS DOWN

After a successful three year period leading the Army Men Representative team WO1 Simon "Dinger" Bell (Front row, second right) has stepped down as Head Coach.

Appointed in the summer of 2015 "Dinger" previously coached the Royal Engineers steering them to win the Woolwich Cup three times. He had been previously involved at Army representative level as Assistant Coach between 2010 and 2012 and won the Inter Services and South West Counties Cup as a player between 1996 and 2002.

Upon arrival as Head Coach "Dinger" led the Army to the Inter Services for three consecutive seasons. Previously they had not won the competition since 2007. Indeed the most recent competition in March saw the highest scoring since 1927 whilst the 7-3 win versus Royal Navy, the highest aggregate score for an Inter Services fixture in 59 years.

In addition success was also achieved winning the Southern Counties Cup twice. Upon announcing his departure WO1 Bell said, "I would like to thank all the staff and players who I have worked with over my three seasons as Army Head Coach. Every single one of you, whether you have been in for three days or three years has contributed to the success of the team over this period. I wish you all great success in the future and know you will give my successor the same support you gave me!



"The staff at the Army FA have been first class and have supported my vision throughout and without this I would have struggled, thank you!

"I would also like to thank the Royal Navy and RAF Senior Men's football teams for their kind words over the years and ensuring that the standards of Services football are always maintained.

"I am now going to dedicate my time to my own personal and professional development in the crazy world of football. To quote Joe Namath "If you aren't going all the way, why go at all?"

"It has been the absolute highlight of my career in the Army and a journey I will never forget. Thank you".

The Army FA extends its warm appreciation and places on record its recognition to the superb contribution WO1 Bell has made during his tenure as Head Coach. We wish you well "Dinger" in the future.

REFEREES ANNUAL AWARDS AND RAFA DAY



The Army FA Referees RAFA Training Day in Aldershot followed by the Annual Awards Dinner at RMA Sandhurst was a huge success.

60 Referees and guests attended the evening event which saw a variety of presentations made by FA Premier League Referee Martin Atkinson, who had spent the afternoon with the officials from all levels of the game.

The most prestigious award for an Army Referee is the Dobsons Trophy. It is awarded for the Referee who has made the most significant contribution to Army Refereeing over the course of the season. For the first time in its 29 year history the award was shared.

The winning recipients were UK North and Womens Appointment Secretary Sgt Si Thorburn (Royal Signals) and UK Midlands Appointment Secretary WO2 Bri Slinn (REME).

The Le Breton Trophy is for the Level 7 Referee who has shown the most potential and commitment during the course of the season. This was also shared by Capt Dicky Halloran (Infantry) (UK South) and Cpl Tom Maher (RLC) (UK North). Additional presentations of recognition of service to Army Football were also made to two individuals soon to leave the Army SSgt Dec Ford (REME) has served the Army FA with distinction since 1995.

A Football League official he has been a committee member for 13 years, refereed the Army Cup Final in 2006 and responsible for the introduction of the Referees' Academy with an immense contribution.

WO1 (RSM) Mark Hounsell (RLC) won the Dobsons Trophy in 2014 and has played a significant contribution since qualifying in 2007.

Further presentations will be made in due course to recognise WO2 Andy Moore (AGC) who stepped down this season after an excellent contribution in UK North.

Andy also qualifies for the Meritorious Service Award. Capt Martyn Day (AGC((SPS) also stepped down this season from Army Refereeing responsibilities after qualifying in 1979. A committee member in three spells between 1996 and 2005 Martin also referees the Army Cup Final in 1995. Cpl Phil Trask (RLC), whose final match was the Reserve Cup Final last season, will also be recognised for 25 years outstanding service.

Chairman Lt Col Pete Conn (RE) is also stepping down as Chairman.

Having served the committee since 2005 he has been Chairman since 2012 and also an Army FA Trustee during that period.

He received a presentation from Martin Atkinson in recognition of his immense contribution.

The RAFA Day saw a variety of training and classroom modules including RLC Head Coach Capt Sean Birchnall (RLC) providing an excellent insight from a Coaches perspective and a Q and A Martin Atkinson who refereed the 2011 FA Cup Final and is a FIFA official.

The day, as always, commenced with the Referees annual Mitchell-Dennis match which is always a feisty affair. A good day had by all!

GAMES OF REMEMBRANCE 2018

The Army men's and women's teams will both be taking part in the 2018 *Games of Remembrance* later this year to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the end of the First World War.

The teams will play their opposite numbers from the German Bundeswehr, with the matches taking place on Thursday 8th November in Nottingham. The Women's match will kick off at 12.00 noon at Meadow Lane, the home of Notts County, and the Men's match at 7.00pm at The City Ground, home of Nottingham Forest.

The *Games of Remembrance* will be high profile commemorative events with a major ceremonial element provided by the Army as well as fan zones, celebrities and VIPs and they will raise money for military and local charities here and in Germany.

Details of how to get your ticket will be published soon. But in the meantime, there's a chance for your team to get involved in the commemoration. We want YOU to film a video tribute to one of those who lost their life in the Great War.

Simply follow the instructions opposite and post your video to our Facebook page: Games of Remembrance 2018.

To make your video really stand out, you may want to:

1. Chose interesting back drops for the video. Memorials, impressive locations etc.

2. Consider what you do with your football teams in their football kit - perhaps focus on players who joined your Regiment or Corps.

3. Consider whether you could do the film in combats (ie in front of a tank) with the scarfs of your teams around your necks - this will allow you to focus on players from a certain team that joined up.

And remember - all videos need to comply with Facebook guidelines.

"This is a fantastic opportunity for everyone to get involved in commemorating the centenary of the end of the First World War," said Major General Mitch Mitchell MBE, Chair of the Army Football Association. "The Games of Remembrance 2018 will bring military and civilian communities closer together to build a legacy between Football Club, Community and Country through commemoration. Football, and these matches, can capture the imagination of all our commemorative efforts. A Film Tribute – using social media – can get our message of commemoration out to a huge audience; please help make this message go viral!"


