NEWPORT PAGNELL TOWN



Newport Pagnell Town Football Club was founded in 1963, initially as Newport Pagnell Wanderers, playing on Bury Field Common. In 1964 they entered the North Bucks League and won Division 3 in their first season.

In 1972 the club moved to the new facilities at the Willen Road Sports Ground and changed its name to Newport Pagnell Town.

In the 2016-17 season the club reached the last 8 of the FA Vase before losing to a strong South Shields team (the eventual winners of the competition) in front of more than 3000 spectators on Tyneside. In recognition of this achievement the club was presented with a Town Award by Newport Pagnell Town Council, and in the Milton Keynes Sports Achiever of the Year 2017 awards Newport Pagnell Town Football Club's first team received the Team of the Year award.

A further award in 2017 was a Berks & Bucks FA award to the club chairman, Steve Handley, for his contribution to grassroots football. In 2017-18 the club finished third in the UCL Premier Division, missing out on promotion by just three points. A good season for the youth section included winning the Berks & Bucks U15 county cup and also a very encouraging season for the club's first girls team, the U12 Swans.

From small beginnings in 1963, Newport Pagnell Town has become the highest placed non-league club in the Milton Keynes area, and is a FA Charter Standard Community Club, with a youth section of around 30 teams in addition to its senior first and reserve teams, a successful Sunday Mens team, a ladies senior team and a Disability team also know as Bobicats!

116 Exiles FC started life in the early 1980's under the name of Waitrose 116, playing in Reading in the Waitrose league. The club was formed by now Chairman and life member Roland Loizou, a 45+ year employee.

The games were far and wide, so the decision was made to join a local friendly league, but having lost the use of the private pitch owned by the partnership and due to staff leaving Waitrose, the name was changed to 116 Exiles FC as many of the players who left, still wanted to play for the football team and managed to win the lan Roberts Shield in a final replay 6-o.

After 2/3 seasons in the friendly league a spot came available to join the renowned Reading & District Sunday League Division 6. Slowly but surely, we progressed to the Senior Division and in the Season 10/11 we were running 4 teams. We are currently running 2 teams in Division 1 & 3. Many of the players over the years have worked at Waitrose/John Lewis and the club prides itself on the enjoyment of playing Sunday League football, with an excellent social and family feel to the club, with 10 members of the same family having played over the years and a Grandfather, Father and Son playing in the same game. We have also attracted an ex Northern Ireland international player and twin brothers who went on to play in an Austrian league.

The progress in this competition started with a 3-4 win away v Winnersh Rangers, 2-4 win away v Brothers Utd, 2-7 win away v Maidenhead Cosmos, 3-1 win home v Give Back FC and the semi final away v Chilton FC 2-2 at full time, winning 3-4 on penalties. Our 1st team are also in the League Cup semi final.

Chairman Roland Loizou is approaching his 74th birthday and commented how proud he is of all players, past and present on reaching the Berks & Bucks FA final for the first time in the clubs history. This one is for you Roland.
