BINFIELD FC



Having first played football during the reign of Queen Victoria in 1892, Binfield FC spent their early seasons in the Ascot & District League, with their highest honour being the Fielden Cup win in 1924. In 1980 the club moved to their current home at Hill Farm Lane which set them on the path to where they stand today.

In 2001, Binfield merged with Binfield's Junior club, Binfield Forest FC and in doing so significantly increased membership. FA Charter Community Club status was achieved in 2007 and in 2013 the club were awarded Berks & Bucks FA and South East Regional FA Charter Status Community Club of the Year. Off the pitch facilities at Hill Farm Lane continued to be developed allowing the senior team to progress and gain promotion in May 2021 to the Isthmian League.

During the 20/21 season the Moles also enjoyed a fantastic cup run reaching the final of the FA Vase. Having first entered the competition in 2008/9 season, at the 13th attempt and despite playing every round away from home they reached final at Wembley. Unfortunately, it wasn't to be and the match ended in a 3-2 defeat.

The junior section of the club has continued to expand with 35+ teams playing every weekend across the East Berks Football Alliance and Surrey Youth League. A thriving Soccer School is also held on Sunday mornings where several of the U13 team playing today began there football at Binfield.


Play Your Part
