Our Club has come a long way since its inception and now boasts more than 300 boys & girls aged 4-17, training on Saturdays and playing matches on Sundays.

Downley Dynamos Junior Football Club was established in 1994 by Andrew Ottaway, who wanted to teach his sons how to play and enjoy the sport from a young age. In 1997 the club was formally registered with the FA, and an U9s team was entered into the Wycombe and South Bucks Mini Soccer League for the very first time.

Today Downley Dynamos is as popular as ever, and we have teams in all age groups coached by a wealth of enthusiastic parents. So popular is the club that we even have parents returning to train younger age groups once their own children have moved on into adulthood.

Our committed aim at Downley Dynamos is to help every young player become the best footballer they can be. We follow the FA's 'football for all' ethos, and we pride ourselves on providing a safe and fun environment for children of all footballing abilities to enjoy the game. At the same time, we recognise that some players will achieve more in footballing terms than others and we fully embrace these talented players, encouraging them to excel within a culture of inclusion.

Enjoyment of the game and long-term player development are the two main goals. The key to achieving this is an acceptance by all coaches, parents and players that at a young age, winning every game of football is not the most important thing. NEWPORT PAGNELL TOWN



Newport Pagnell Town Football Club was founded in 1963, initially as Newport Pagnell Wanderers, playing on Bury Field Common. In 1964 they entered the North Bucks League and won Division 3 in their first season.

In 1972 the club moved to the new facilities at the Willen Road Sports Ground and changed its name to Newport Pagnell Town.

In the 2016-17 season the club reached the last 8 of the FA Vase before losing to a strong South Shields team (the eventual winners of the competition) in front of more than 3000 spectators on Tyneside. In recognition of this achievement the club was presented with a Town Award by Newport Pagnell Town Council, and in the Milton Keynes Sports Achiever of the Year 2017 awards Newport Pagnell Town Football Club's first team received the Team of the Year award.

A further award in 2017 was a Berks & Bucks FA award to the club chairman, Steve Handley, for his contribution to grassroots football. In 2017-18 the club finished third in the UCL Premier Division, missing out on promotion by just three points. A good season for the youth section included winning the Berks & Bucks U15 county cup and also a very encouraging season for the club's first girls team, the U12 Swans.

From small beginnings in 1963, Newport Pagnell Town has become the highest placed non-league club in the Milton Keynes area, and is a FA Charter Standard Community Club, with a youth section of around 30 teams in addition to its senior first and reserve teams, a successful Sunday Mens team, a ladies senior team and a Disability team also know as Bobicats!
