



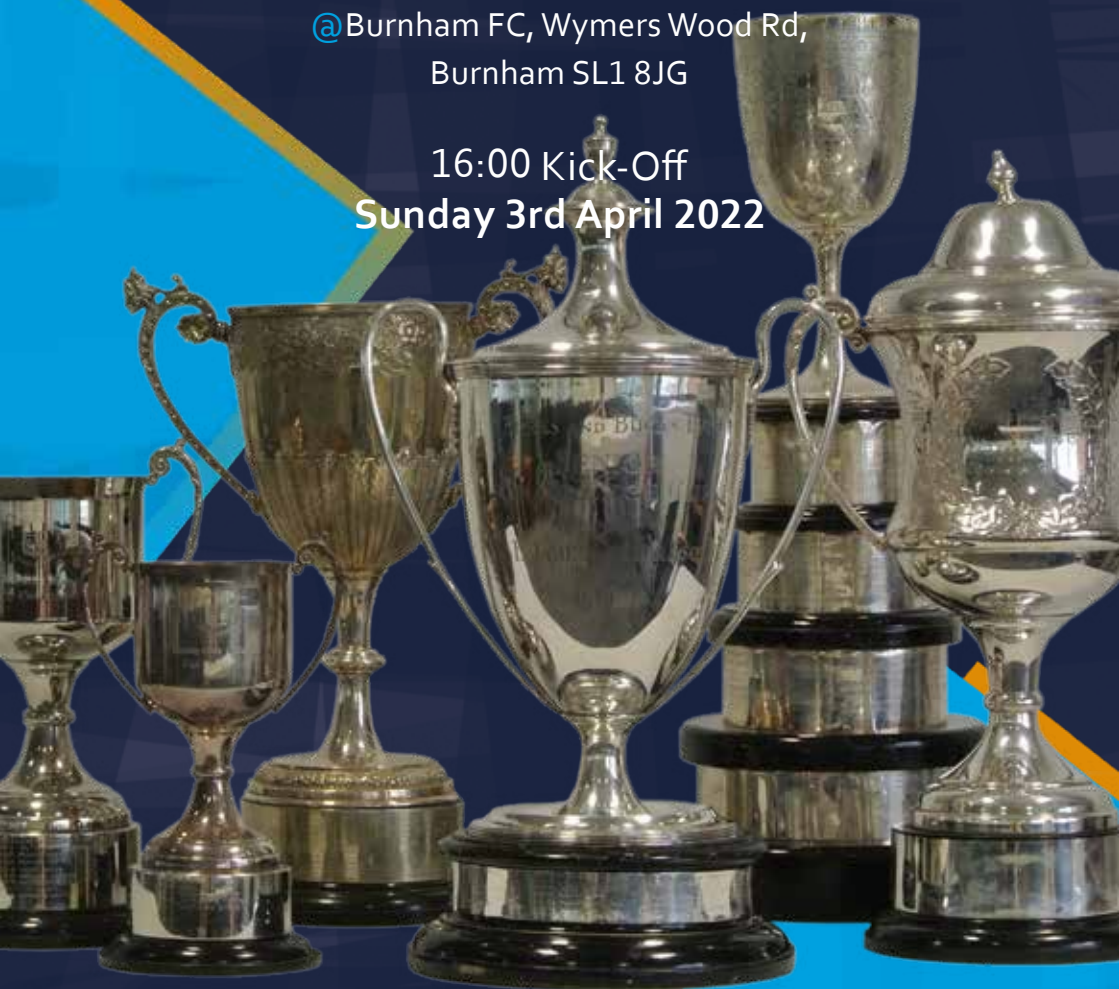

DIDCOT TOWN



Didcot Village FC and Northbourne Wanderers amalgamated to form Didcot Town Football Club in 1907.

Season 1953/54 will always go down in history of one of the clubs finest. Entering the Hellenic League in its inaugural year Didcot Town claimed the title-winning 22 of their 30 matches and scoring an impressive 107 goals in the process. The newly won Hellenic shield was soon proudly on-show in a glass case at the Marlborough Club, which the footballers used as their HQ.

They sold their Station Road ground and moved to their new Loop Meadow Stadium at the turn of the 21st century. The move to the new ground had a significant impact on the club's playing fortunes. In fact, the club established itself as one of the most consistent performers in the Hellenic Premier Division over the next seven years, never finishing outside the top seven. Along the way silverware was lifted in the form of the Berks & Bucks FA Senior Trophy (2001 and 2003), the League's Supplementary Cup (2003) and the Challenge Cup (2004).

Season 2004/05 ended up as arguably the most successful in the club's history so far following a memorable 3-2 win in the final of the FA Vase at White Hart Lane against pre-tournament favourites AFC Sudbury. The side won the Hellenic League title in 2005/06, obtaining 105 points, scoring 124 goals, and losing only three matches to win promotion to the Southern League.

A narrow defeat to Oxford City in the 2008 play-offs denied Didcot promotion the following season. They didn't have too long to wait as a late run at the end of the 2008/09 season saw the club sneak into the play-offs and promotion to the Southern Premier Division was achieved following a 2-1 extra-time victory at AFC Totton.

Auzzie Pervais

Key player throughout the season who has proven his status as a full back, shows great ability going forward and has a eye for key passes in the opponents half.

Bradley Morton

A player who is versatile, hardworking and offers a lot at both ends of the pitch. His energy alone can win games and gives every defender a problem.

Casey Groves

Solid defender who is hard to beat and thrives at 1v1 situations. On the ball finds key passes, and has the ability to create goal scoring opportunities through crosses and driving runs into the box.

Charlie Herbert

A player who loves to get on the ball and has high expectations of himself. Has great vision and ability to find key passes, this is his first year with us and you'd think he's been here for a lot longer.

Dom Maxwell

A player who has worked his way into the squad through his attitude and it's shows when he's playing. A defensive midfielder who does not give any opponent time to breathe on the ball.

Ethan Bones

A young keeper who is developing all the time under the influence of first team keeper Leigh Bedwell and goalkeeper coach Matthew Crowther. A very good distributor of the ball.

Fin Baker

The teams captain, a leader on and off the pitch. A box to box midfielder with an eye for goal and a key member of the squad.

Freddie Kennedy

A player the team look to get on the ball as much as possible. Capable of winning games on his own with goals or assists from nothing.

George Christian

A player capable of playing in different positions. Physically strong player with good technical ability to help the team play.

George Rushton

No nonsense central defender who enjoys defending for the team. He is a leader when on the pitch and sets high standards for the players around him.

Harris Kilburn

High work rate for the team both with and without the ball. Creates chances for the team with his dribbling ability. Has represented a number of the squads across the programme this season.

Josh Hedges

Excellent attacking ability which has been proven by the number of goals scored this season. A player the team rely on in an attacking sense.

Kieran Day

Another player who is an attacking threat for the team. Excellent delivery of crosses from wide left which has created numerous goals this season. Has scored plenty of goals himself this season from different areas of the pitch.

Lewis Carrigan

A tall committed centre half who has grown throughout the season. He is also comfortable on the ball and has played in various positions throughout the season.

Lewis McKirnan

Lewis has grown into the side this season largely due to his incredible work rate and determination. He is a technically good footballer who is good from set-pieces.

Lucas Harry

Lucas has struggled with a long term injury this season but his attitude to get back fit and playing has been second to none. He works incredibly hard while playing and can link up the play well.

Noah Parsons

A midfielder converted to a centre half and has flourished this season. A naturally technical player with an eye for a pass. He has also scored a fair few goals from set-pieces.

Owen Dore

Dorey has an absolute wand of a left peg. His dead ball deliveries are excellent and has provided many assists this season. Another player who can comfortably play in several positions.

Robbie Gallagher

Scholesy has an incredible desire to win the ball.

His hold up play is exceptional and has chipped in with several goals this season. He has gotten better and better as the seasons gone on.

Ryan Jones

A tenacious and tricky forward player who has a lot of ability on the ball. He can create a goal out of nothing and enjoys the attacking aspects of the game.

Timmy Mungall

Great shot stopper, with excellent distribution from both the floor and his hands which contributes towards goals/assists. His presence in the goal settles the team and he's been a huge character both on the pitch and in the changing room.

WINSLOW UNITED



The club was formed in 1891. Originally games were played at Great Horwood Road before moving to the current ground, Elmfields Gate, in 1948.

The club joined the South Midlands League in 1968 following success in the North Bucks Football League and were Berks & Bucks Junior Cup winners in the preceding 1967-68 season. United won the SML Division 1 in 1974-75 and enjoyed many successful seasons in the SML Premier Division, recording fifth placed finishes in 1981-82 and 1986-87 as well as reaching the 2nd Round of the FA Vase in 1983-84. The club went into decline in the early 90's and were relegated in 1991-92 having won only 2 games out of 42.

In 2009 the club withdrew from Spartan South Midlands football having suffered a number of 11th hour resignations from management but were back in Division 2 for the 2010-11 season under the management of Damien Wiffin and Kevin Marsden and the season ended well as United lifted the Division 2 Cup, defeating The 61FC 2-0 at Ampthill.

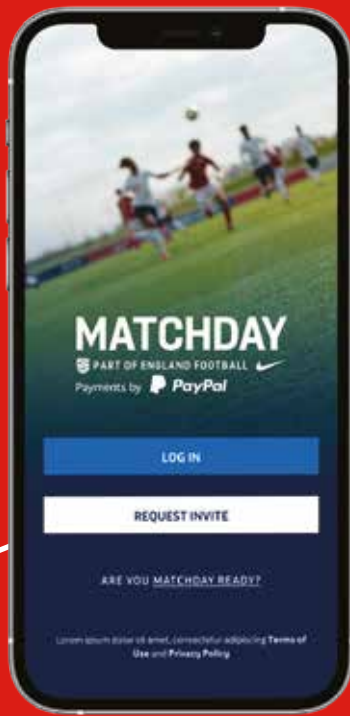

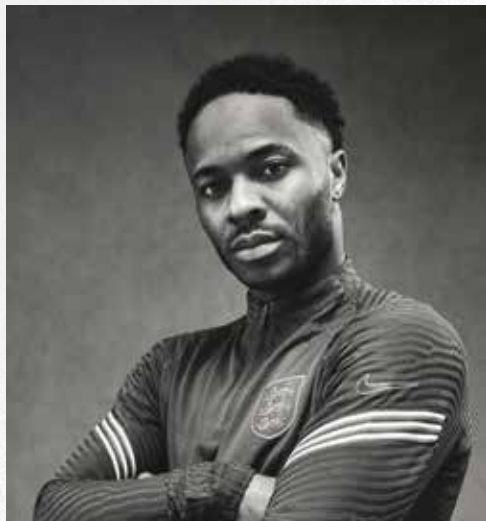
