



JOEL RICHARDS TRIBUTE

The Joel Richards Memorial Cup, formerly known as the Midweek Youth Cup, is dedicated to Joel Richards who tragically lost his life in the 2015 Tunisia attacks, along with his Grandad Patrick, and his Uncle Adrian.

Joel was an outstanding young man who dedicated a lot of his time to football, and volunteering with Birmingham County FA.

After qualifying as a Referee in September 2011 at just 16 years old, Joel was soon identified as a special talent. He was promoted to Level 6 in March 2013 before completing a double promotion to become a Level 4 Referee in June 2014 - one of only a handful of match officials in the County to be fast tracked to this level, highlighting his ability and commitment.

Joel was also a member of Birmingham County FA's Youth Council and was elected by his peers to become the inaugural Chairperson in 2012. During his time in this role, Joel demonstrated exceptional leadership abilities such as creating and directing an action plan, delivering events whilst leading by example and being a role model to all.

Kevin Shoemake, Chief Executive Officer at BCFA said: "Joel was a fabulous young man, a talented Referee and an inspirational first Chair of Birmingham County Football Association's Youth Council".

Joel is truly missed by everyone at Birmingham County FA, with the Midweek Youth Cup forever being dedicated to him.

BCFA were proudly accepted as participatory members of the UN's Sport for Climate Action Framework, the first County FA to do so, using the power of sport to normalise conversations, promote athlete advocacy at all levels, share best practice and implement innovative solutions to combat the increasing threat and negative impact of climate change on the beautiful game.

Project Lead Richard Lindsay says of the programme "Climate change is arguably the greatest challenge of our generation. While grassroots football is not the cause; most clubs are SME sized, often loss-making, volunteer led enterprises with a microscale carbon footprint, we know there is an appetite for change with 86% of BCFA clubs believing the game should do more to reduce its environmental impact.

Save Today, Play Tomorrow offers huge potential for engagement, as the scale on which people share a close affinity with their community club is perhaps unparalleled in any other sport".
