What is Save Today, Play Tomorrow?

Just days after the annual celebration of World Environment Day, Birmingham County FA has launched its 'Save Today, Play Tomorrow' programme, its over-arching strategy for the next four years to create and support lower-carbon football in the West Midlands.

Save Today, Play Tomorrow is a series of planned initiatives, strategic partnerships and infrastructure investment that fall under four key themes - health and wellbeing, positive education, climate action and reconnecting football with nature.

As a governing body, Birmingham County FA (BCFA) recognises the need to take action now to ensure the beautiful game significantly reduces its environmental impact, whilst helping to educate those involved in football at all levels to make informed decisions that will shape how much future generations will be able to enjoy the game.

The aims of the initial four-year strategy are to stimulate conversations and positive action about the role football must play in addressing climate change. Furthermore, it is designed to engender innovation and partnerships, and goals include providing best practice guides, carbon literacy training, education and infrastructure support to the 1,200 football clubs, 4,780 teams, 1,100 match officials and almost 70,000 registered players that fall under its remit across all formats of the game, with the greater proportion falling under what is commonly known as 'grassroots'

"Our long-term goal with Save Today, Play Tomorrow is to play our part in protecting future generations' ability to enjoy this incredible game, which is such an important part of our community and identity for so many people. However, we also have a duty to support our current players; many of whose quality of life is already impacted by air quality issues, fuel poverty and environmental degradation"

"Carbon Literate individuals understand how climate change will affect them – both geographically and sectorally – and have acquired the knowledge and skills to lower their carbon footprint, with typical realised carbon savings of 5-15% per person" (Jacobs 2018).

#### **Plastic FREE July**

Its Plastic Free July! We can all make small changes to our daily lives to live with less plastic and help stop plastic water bottles and other single use items ending up in the sea and polluting our streets. It's easy to make simple switches that will make a big difference to our planet and we are proud to partner with city to see, a campaign an organisation campaigning to stop plastic pollution. Here are their top tips on simple changes you can make everyday to help you live with less plastic

- .1. Carry a reusable water bottle to training sessions and matches instead of buying a new bottle of water. Remember you can refill your bottle at most training grounds for free! So you'll save money and reduce plastic! Win win!
  - 2. If you like to enjoy a post-match cuppa of tea, coffee or hot chocolate, why not bring your own reusable coffee cup and ask for your hot drink to be served in that?
- 3. Starving after the game? Instead of getting takeaway food in lots of pointless plastic packaging, bring your own lunch box or tupperware and ask for your food to be put in that to take away.
- 4. <u>Download the free refill app</u> to find places you can refill your reusable water bottle, coffee cup, and lunch box. There are over 270,000 refill stations around the world so it's super easy to find one near you

## **Pledgeball**



Have your club signed up to the first Birmingham County FA Sustainability Pledge in partnership with Pledgeball?

Pledgeball is a charity that encourages football fans to make sustainable lifestyle choices in support of their teams and, with Birmingham County FA - the first FA to do so, this does not only involve the higher tiers of the football pyramid but also the grassroots clubs.

Alongside fellow fans and club members, we can have a huge impact through making small changes. For example, if the 70,000 Birmingham County FA-registered players simply reduced their shower time to 5 minutes, the amount of carbon emissions saved would be the same as taking over 4,900 cars off the road!

Each club who've signed up to the Sustainability Pledge will be given a personalised listing on the Pledgeball website under Pledgeball events. Over the course of the season, we will support each club to encourage their members, fans, parents and friends to make sustainable lifestyle pledges in support of the club. The amount pledged to be saved by each club will determine their place within the Birmingham County FA Sustainability League.

Planet Super League is a game for football fans who want to look after the environment for future generations.

Families play together, tackling green activities to protect the planet, win points for their football club and track the impact they're having on their carbon footprint.

Hundreds of families all over the UK are taking part, representing 33 football clubs. There are over 60 planet-protecting activities on our site and we're adding new ones all the time. They range from everyday actions like walking or cycling instead of driving to ingenious ways to upcycle clothes or use old packaging in simple craft projects. There are activities to get you out of the house and interact with nature as well as creative challenges for rainy days.
