- **Title/Position:** Cornwall FA Advanced Coaching Centre-WHPFC Mentee Coach
- Location/Dates: The post is deployed with Cornwall FA in partnership with Marjon's FA Womens High Performance Football Centre. Sessions are at Brannel School 3G every Friday during school term time for 32 weeks. The sessions run from 17:30pm – 20:30pm (times for the menteeship may vary in this time slot).
- Purpose of post: 'The FA Women's High Performance Football Centre (FA WHPFC) ACC Coach Mentee Programme' has been launched to provide those coaches who aspire to coach in the Women's game an opportunity to gain an insight into an Elite environment whilst also developing their planning, delivery, observational and reflective skills across the Women's game. The programme will provide development opportunities through a range of experiences with the aim of supporting these coaches to transition into working roles within the women's game in the future.

The role of the individuals selected will be to support delivery of practical football sessions. Each coach will shadow a head coach to gain experience and insight into planning, delivery and evaluation to drive individual player development.

The candidate will be supported and mentored by Natasha Mills (Coach Development Officer). Across the season they will also have the opportunity to attend several internal and external workshops.
