CODE OF BEHAVIOUR

Covid-19 is a highly infectious and dangerous disease. A resumption of contact play is only achievable if those involved create and maintain a controlled environment that minimises the threat of infection.

Risk in sport cannot be completely eradicated but with caution and care these risks can be reduced.

Each player will need to decide when to return to contact football, based on their own circumstances and the arrangements that have been put in place for a safe return. This is particularly the case for players from BAME communities or those with underlying health conditions.

All those returning to competitive grassroots football must adopt the following code of behaviour:

- Be aware of your own personal health. If you show any of the Covid-19 symptoms you must stay at home, inform NHS Test and Trace and seek medical advice.
- **Be responsible**. Read the guidance provided by The FA and by your club so that you are aware of the changes to the game and what is expected of you. This will include things like being prepared to wash your own kit, bringing your own labelled water bottle and being aware of changes to meet-up times.
- Practise good hygiene. Wash your hands regularly and before, during and after a game.
- Where possible maintain social distancing. This won't always be possible in a competitive match environment (for example when tackling an opponent) and that is acceptable. However, before, and after a game you should maintain social distancing.
- **Support NHS Test and Trace**. You're likely to be asked to provide your details so that in the event of a Covid-19 outbreak those potentially infected can be traced. This is to everyone's benefit so please cooperate.
- **Do not spit**. Spitting and the rinsing out of mouths is now a recognised risk to health and must not be done. Avoid shouting or raising your voice if face to face with other players.
- After the game. Be aware that other users may be waiting to use the facilities. Changing rooms and showers are likely to be closed and any socialising must follow the Government's guidance on social distancing

Colin Denovellis told us ahead of the Final "Reaching the final is the result of 10 years hard work for these lads, and their families.


From where we started, to where we are today is a credit to how much the boys have wanted this, how much they've wanted to better themselves and how they've strived for excellence and success.

2019-20 COUNTY CUP FINALS

Given the current circumstances with regards to Covid-19 there have had to be a number of concessions made on the usual Cup Final experience in order that we can ensure social distancing, safety and most importantly the ability to play the game, in line with both government and FA guidance

Ben Snowdon, Cumberland FA CEO stated "It has always been our wish as a County FA to allow spectators into the final. However, this had to be done in a way that we can ensure that spectators always remain social distant whilst attending the final."

Following numerous discussions with our Health and Safety consultant we have reached a compromise that allows a limited number of spectators to attend the Final.

All details have been distributed to Clubs with regards spectator arrangements as well as the Test and Trace questionnaires to be completed prior to arrival at the Final.

As stated in previous guidance (which should be happening across grassroots football), the County Cup Finals will be adhering to:

- There will be no Pre-match handshake. Instead players will be asked to hand-sanitise before kick-off:
- Team talk huddles should not take place. Team talks can take place, if social distancing is observed and held outdoors;
- Warm-ups/cool-downs should always observe social distancing;
- Coaches, other team staff and substitutes are allowed, but must also always observe social distancing on touchlines. Social-distancing must also be observed during interactions when a substitution is being made;
- Match preparation meetings by officials should be held by video call, telephone call or outside;
- Set plays free kicks: referees and coaches should encourage players to get on with the game and not unnecessarily prolong set play set-up, such as defensive walls;
- Set plays corners should also be taken promptly to limit prolonged close marking
- Goal celebrations should be avoided;
- Interactions with referees and match assistants should only happen with players observing social distancing.



SPECTATORS

All spectators must adhere to Social Distancing on arrival and throughout the Finals.
