

Fred was immensely proud of his being a part of Cumberland FA and most latterly his role as Chair, to which he dedicated a large part of his life, time, and energy towards various aspects of the grassroots game.

This was certainly the case when it came to our County Cup Competitions. He loved the fact that these competitions brought teams together from across the county. He loved the Finals and the opportunity to attend different grounds to catch up with and have a good crack with their volunteers, some of whom became close friends of his through this association. He also loved the competitive element and would often be heard telling anyone who would listen, and even some who would not, of his success as manager in leading Mirehouse AFC to three Sunday County Cup victories in a row. However, as competitive as he was, ensuring that the game was played within the right spirit and, whilst he didn't always agree with their decisions, respecting match officials was integral to his philosophy and character.

So on Fred's behalf I would to congratulate the teams who have made it to the Final and thank all of the club officials, team coaches, parents and supporters who will have worked tirelessly behind the scenes to allow the players to have the success on the pitch.

I would also like to thank the volunteers of the host venue Carlisle City FC, who's support has enabled us to provide a suitable and fitting County Cup Final match day experience for this Final.

Finally, a special mention to the match officials who we wish to congratulate on their performances this season, which has led to their appointment to the final.

We hope all those in attendance have a good experience, although often this is very much dependent upon the result and play their part in ensuring that this year's finals are befitting of the memory of Fred.

As with most people his love of the game had been developed from his time playing.

Described as tenacious but talented player, his love affair with the game started when he began playing for the Boys Brigade before moving to Cockermouth Albion Under 18's where he won the Derwent Valley Junior League. His career then moved onto playing within the Wearside league for Marchon on a Saturday and he also had a successful spell at Calder Lions, and then Egremont Athletic in the Sunday League.

Well known for his strong opinions, he was never going to sit back quietly and let others lead, and so when, in the 1980s, an opportunity arose to join the Egremont & District Sunday League Committee he took it.



In the mid-80s Fred passed the basic referee course and registered as a referee. In the late 1990s Fred was elected onto the Cumberland County FA council and in 2004 he was nominated and subsequently voted in as Chair of The County FA.

It was his position as Chair of Cumberland FA of which he was most proud, and he would often be heard telling new members of the County that the Cumberland FA badge meant more to him than anything else.

He was unique, which is why he will be irreplaceable.

We are eternally grateful for all of your support, not only to the grassroots game as a whole, but also to those individuals within it and particularly the staff team at Cumberland FA.

And between you me and the gatepost, you didn't do bad, for how you commonly and tongue in cheek, referred to yourself, as 'a thick storeman'.

Mr Chairman. You will be missed but most of all, on behalf of grassroots football and Cumberland FA,
