





The Equality Standard: A Framework for Sport was launched by the UK sports councils in November 2004 to help address the inequalities that exist within the sports sector. All County FAs are required to achieve the Preliminary Level for the CFA Code of Governance.

In February 2021, DCFA submitted the Foundation Level assessment and the initial feedback received is that 'DCFA are in the best position they have ever been with regards to Equality, Diversity and Inclusion'.

One of the requirements of the standard was for the County FA to conduct an up-to-date audit of staff, board and council, to demonstrate the awareness of its current profile and position in terms of equality, relating to the 'protected characteristics' outlined within the Equality Act 2010.



At board on 10th February 2021, approval was given for:

- DCFA to progress towards the preliminary level of the standard in a timely manner;
- The new equality, diversity and inclusion policy to be signed off;
- An up-to-date audit to be circulated to staff, board and council members;
- A statement to be produced by board chairman and safeguarding and equality manager.



FUTSAL FEBRUARY

Project focused on the targeted promotion of futsal throughout February 2021, culminating with a 'futsal awareness evening' at the end of the month.

Key themes included:

- What is futsal?;
- Futsal provision in Derbyshire;
- Interview with chairman of the Chesterfield Futsal League, Oliver Couch;
- Interview with chairman of the Derby Futsal League, Alan Ure;
- Awareness evening guest speaker announcements, including Pete Sturgess and Mike Skubala;
- Interview with Glossop North End Community Club representatives Ben Mills and Ryan Williams.



SAFE SID'S MATCHDAY MADNESS

Throughout March we asked young people across the county to get involved in the 'Matchday Madness' project. We asked to see video submissions related to these challenges:

- Recreate your favourite goal;
- Soccer skill;
- Favourite goal celebration;
- Design a football kit.
 We selected a winner each week and posted their video on social media, gave them prizes, and made a compilation video at the end of the month.





Our new strategy follows a county-wide consultation with the communities involved in grassroots football in Derbyshire and promises to deliver on what participants most want and need.

After the enormous success of the England men's team at Euro 2020 this summer, interest in getting involved in grassroots football is starting to spike, and the new strategy aims to inspire people across Derbyshire to get involved in the game.


