Play Safe Weekend 2023 (Saturday 30 Sep)

DCFA worked in partnership with Derby County to highlight Play Safe during their match against Cambridge at Pride Park.

- A video featuring Paul Warne, Sam Griffiths, Derby County Academy players and Derbyshire FA Youth Board members was created and shown during matchday and on socials
- Junior players from our Club of the Year, Long Eaton United, were brought in as ball-retrievers and flag-bearers
- The LED boards showcased a Play Safe message
- All players from both clubs wore DCFA Play Safe t-shirts during warm-ups
- Matt McGibbon, stadium announcer, spoke about the campaign to the 26,000 in attendance







Play Safe Weekend 2023 (Sunday 1 Oct)

DCFA worked in partnership with our League of the Year, Derby Junior Football League, to spread awareness of Play Safe to the grassroots community

- Staff were spread across three venues (Uni of Derby, Lees Brook School & Racecourse Playing Fields)
- Staff spoke to parents, asking 'validation visit' style questions, such as "Do you know your CWO?"
- Staff conducted checks on all coaches, ensuring 2 are present for each team and taking their names
- Banners were erected at each venue asking players what they love about football. Staff were directing players to write their answers on the banners
- Staff handed out badges and captains armbands to teams






