Club Welfare Officer Minimum requirements for 2024-

All Open Age clubs MUST have a nominated Welfare Officer

All Welfare Officers MUST have completed the online

Player Welfare in Open Age Football Course



All Welfare Officers MUST have FA DRS where 16

How to meet the CWO Peguirements

• Club Secretary to Add Welfare Officer nominee to Club record on Portal.

Note: This could be the Club Welfare Officer of your junior section if you are connected with a junior club.

 Nominated Welfare Officer to complete the free online Player Welfare in Open Age Football Course:

• If 16/17 year old's are in team, nominated Welfare Officer to contact Durham County FA for DBS Guidance document to complete DES Application process Email safeguarding@durhamfa.com

Note: as appropriate, CWO in junior section can complete the DBS process with the nominee

Following On....

- 1. Club Secretary to check Welfare Officer nomination is showing on Club account in Club Portal
- 2. Club Secretary to check FA DBS details are showing on Welfare Officer FAN date of issue (within 3 years) and showing as 'accepted' (Note: DBS requirement only applies where 16/17 year olds are registered)
- 3. Club Secretary to check Player Welfare in Open-Age Football Course date is showing on Welfare Officer FAN

4. Welfare Officer to link to First Advantage Online Disclosures to Register become a DBS verifier for the Club and thereby be able to take Club volunteers

Coaches, Managers, First Aiders, Physio's and Assistants

- All Coaches, Managers, First Aiders, Physio's & any Assistants MUST complete the Player Welfare in Open Age Football Course which is FREE.

- FA DBS check is required for ALL Coaches, Managers, First Aiders, Physio's & Assistants
