

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COACHES #PlayYourPart

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As a coach, you can play your part to ensure that everyone has a positive experience on and off the pitch.

Put the players first, consider the environment that you create, and role model positive behaviours.



- Take time to understand individuals in the team everyone is different
- Value learning & development over the scoreline – consider the player's motivations for taking part
- Try to provide fair playing time give all players opportunities to reach their potential
- Be clear, consistent, and positive with the information you give to players
- Be consistent with your behaviours do you act differently at training and matchdays?
- BE THE REASON THAT A PLAYER STAYS IN THE GAME!

- Keep control of your emotions managers & coaches are responsible for creating a positive environment
- Players leave the game if the environment is negative, hostile, or intimidating
- Try not to focus solely on the scoreline this is not always a reflection of a team or individual's performance
- Your words, actions and behaviours will impact enjoyment of the game
- Negativity is unhelpful for everyone
- DON'T BE THE REASON WHY A PLAYER LEAVES THE GAME!

SPECTATORS #PlayYourPart

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Consider your interactions with the players, coaches and match officials.



- Always keep interactions positive – provide praise and encouragement to all
- Mistakes will happen remember that the players, referees and coaches are all trying their best
- Acknowledge that the coach is likely to be a volunteer and is giving up their free time
- You can support by: helping the coach with setting up, communicating important information to others, or volunteering to officiate
- Do you know what the players are working on? Is there a specific focus for that week?
- Do you know the laws of the game (relevant to the format being played)?
- BE THE REASON THAT A PLAYER STAYS IN THE GAME!

- Keep control of your emotions – your words, actions and behaviours will impact enjoyment of the game
- Players leave the game if the environment is negative, hostile, or intimidating
- Manage your expectations the game should and does look very different to the professional game
- Avoid coaching the players this is the role of the coach your communications could be conflicting
- Don't challenge referee decisions, regardless of whether or not you agree
- Negativity is unhelpful for everyone
- DON'T BE THE REASON WHY
 A PLAYER LEAVES THE GAME!

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WHY HOLD A COACHES WORKSHOP?

- Align coaches with the club's Mission, Vision & Values
- To introduce key club committee members and meet other coaches
- To prepare for the season ahead

WHAT COULD BE INCLUDED?

- Highlight positive coaching behaviours
- Signpost to learning and support opportunities
- Promote good practice and share coaching ideas

WHEN IS THE BEST TIME TO HOLD A WORKSHOP?

- Ideally before the season starts
- You could also arrange a mid-season & end of season get together
- Consult with the coaches, in order to maximise attendance

WHERE COULD YOU HOLD THE WORKSHOP?

- Club venue
- Local school hall
- Community centre

HOW COULD THE WORKSHOP BE DELIVERED?

- It could be led by your club's Chairperson, Secretary & Welfare Officer
- Keep it brief no more than one hour
- Try to engage coaches with a mixture of information giving & engaging discussion

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WHY HOLD A SPECTATORS WORKSHOP?

- This is an opportunity to welcome everyone to your club and the new season ahead
- Share the clubs Vision, Mission & Value's
- An opportunity to set expectations for the season what can they expect from you? What do you expect from them?
- Spectators to sign a code of conduct"

WHAT COULD BE INCLUDED?

WHEN IS THE BEST TIME TO HOLD A WORKSHOP?

- Ideally before the season starts
- You could combine it with player registration day or a club social
- Consider a time that would suit the majority of your members

WHERE COULD YOU HOLD THE WORKSHOP?

- Club venue
- Local school hall
- Community centre

HOW COULD THE WORKSHOP BE DELIVERED?

- The workshop should be delivered by the Club Committee so that key club messages are shared by those running the club
- Keep it brief no more than one hour
- Some clubs have made it compulsory for one parent/guardian per child to attend before player reg is signed off
- Having refreshments available on the day can be helpful

Many clubs have fed back that this is a great way to kick off the season. Spectators leave with more clarity regarding the part they play and the expectations of them.

REPORTING DISCRIMINATION #PlayYourPart



Creating a united grassroots football environment which delivers football opportunity For All

Essex County FA is determined to provide a safe, inclusive and positive football experience for anyone who wishes to participate in the game.

Discrimination has no place in football. It can be upsetting and hurtful. So, when you tell us about it, we listen and we act. If you've witnessed discrimination in football, there are a number of ways of reporting it to us (see below). We investigate every report on discrimination we receive and treat each one seriously, so you can be sure that you're being listened to.

Once you've reported an incident involving discriminatory behaviour, this is shared with The FA, who oversee the process. A County FA investigation takes place where the evidence is reviewed and a charge, if one is made, will be determined. Charges raised by the County FA are considered by a disciplinary commission appointed by The FA from their National Serious Case Panel, who will review the case.

The alleged offender will be asked for a response to the allegation, and all identified witnesses will be asked to make a statement too. This may take place in person (hearings are currently taking place online) or on correspondence. Once the disciplinary commission have completed the hearing, the offence is either proven or not proven. Any outcome would be subject to appeal.

DEALING WITH BREACHES OF CODES OF CONDUCT

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Guiding Principles for Clubs to deal with breaches of Codes of Conduct

No matter how well a club is run there is always the possibility of having to deal with complaints and discipline issues at a club. Dealing with issues of poor practice or misconduct from volunteers or parents/spectators can seem somewhat daunting at first however by following a clear process, matters can be dealt with both efficiently and appropriately.

Codes of Conduct

Ahead of any new season each member of the club should sign up to a Code of Conduct. The club should hold a hard copy or electronic register which can evidence that everyone has read and is committed to adhering to it. Each FA Code of Conduct has a number of sanctions that could be imposed following a breach.

Sanctions

Where the Committee find that the complaint is upheld/proven there are a number of sanctions available. Sanctions are incorporated into the Respect Codes of Conduct which all members at the club should have signed up to at the beginning of every season. Sanctions could include:

- A formal warning
- Request not to attend future games
- Asked to attend an FA Education Course
- Required to leave the club

Liaising with Essex County FA

Before starting a process we encourage you to contact Essex County FA to see if any investigation is underway linked to the complaint, if that is the case the club would then need to liaise with the Football Services Department and they may need to put their own process on hold until that has been heard.

Our Football Services and Safeguarding Departments are also on hand to reassure and guide clubs through the process.
