# **Chief Executive's Report**

It's been a successful 2018/19 season for Essex grassroots football, with a great number of achievements as we focused on continuing to develop and support the local game.

The 2018/19 season was the first season of delivery of our 'Moving Forward' Strategy 2018-2021. This strategy set's the overall vision, objectives and strategic direction up to 2021, combining targets from the FA National Game Strategy with local football priorities to help grow, sustain and improve the game. The full Moving Forward Strategy can be accessed on our website at www.essexfa.com/about/strategy.

At the heart of our strategy is our strapline: **"Creating a united grassroots football environment which delivers football opportunity for all."** As we move towards embedding this approach to delivery across the organisation, a number of key highlights were achieved, which you can see displayed in this report

The 2018/19 season also marked the first Independent Director appointment onto the Board of Directors. An open application process was conducted and Toyin Higgs was the successful candidate appointed.

Safeguarding continued to be an important theme across the season and Toyin brought excellent skills, experience and knowledge of safeguarding to the Board, which highlighted the progression and direction of travel in seeking to recruit specific skill sets to help strengthen the skills and knowledge at Board Level.

In February, we were also able to evidence some of the excellent inclusion work we've been involved with. Alongside the Muslimah Sports Association (MSA), we won the London Football Awards' first ever FA 'For All' Award, an accolade created for: "Recognising a project or club that supports inclusion and diversity for under-represented groups in football."

The award was presented to recognise a project which was put in place, in partnership with London Sport and Vision Redbridge, to understand any perceived barriers to football participation from BAME (Black, Asian and Minority Ethnic) women, and how to overcome these.

In addition, towards the end of the season in June, we picked-up an 'Insight & Data Award' at the inaugural County FA Recognition Awards for our 'League Review Packs' project, focussing on fostering better relationships and partnerships with competitions.

This was in addition to commendations for our activities in Football Development (Football Environment), Digital Engagement (#CelebrateEssex Awards) and Diversity & Inclusion (Muslimah Sports Association Level 1 Course).

The awards were introduced to recognise and endorse the best projects, products and services launched by County FAs over the past season, whilst sharing best practice and learnings. From the 50 County FAs operating across England, 39 entered over 150 submissions.



#### THE BOARD

#### We saw one change take place, with Toyin Higgs, the Essex County FA's first Independent Director, being recruited. Toyin joined in October 2018, following an open application process.

Toyin's appointment brought new level of skill and expertise onto the Board, with specific focus on continuing to support the important work around safeguarding within football.

Wayne Deller remained as Chairman, with Barry Fitzgerald, Andrew Chaplin, Dave Emerton and Toyin Higgs as Directors of the Essex County FA. The Board continued to oversee all matters of company operations.

#### **COUNCIL**

### Wayne Deller continued as Chairman of the Council. There were also number of elections held on Council as well as some new recruits to fill vacant positions.

The following individuals were re-elected onto Council: Danny Coyle (Group 1 Youth), Andy Chaplin (Group 2 Open-Age), Martin Berry (Veterans Football). Graham Hall also continued to serve as the Essex County Schools FA Representative.

In addition to these re-appointments, Craig Pullen was appointed as the Essex Referee's Association Representative, Micah Hyde was appointed as the Group 4 Youth Representative and Alan Dare was appointed as the Group 2 Youth Representative.

The volunteer Council Members again undertook their regulatory and management role and they were involved in many Council, disciplinary, refereeing, competitions and rules meetings throughout the 2018/19 season.

Sadly, the Essex County FA said goodbye to long-serving Life Member, Keith Miller, who sadly passed away. Keith was a respected and active member of the local football community, being particularly well-known in the area of refereeing.

He began his match official career over half a century ago in the Bishop's Stortford Stansted & District and Harlow & District Sunday Leagues, gaining his 'Class 1' status in 1973. Having risen rapidly through the ranks of the Hertfordshire Senior County and the Essex Senior Leagues, he was promoted to the 'line', and subsequently the 'middle', of the Football Combination. From there, Keith progressed to the line of the Football League and, ultimately, the middle of England's most senior competition. He additionally enjoyed several European trips on behalf of UEFA, a particular highlight being the European Championships Semi-Final between Spain and Denmark in 1984.

Keith qualified as an FA Assessor, as well as continuing a lengthy period of sterling work on behalf of his local societies at Epping and Harlow. At Epping, he became their Treasurer and Coaching Officer, before joining Harlow Referees Association in 1982 where he again took on the roles of Treasurer and Training Officer. Keith later became Chairman and, ultimately, President.

He put in a lengthy stint as the Referees Secretary for the Harlow & District Sunday League and received The FA's 50-Year Award for services to the game. During those five decades he worked hard to share his experience, expertise and enthusiasm for a game he clearly loved so much.

Keith joined the Essex County FA Council in 1993, becoming a Director in 2001, and he was named as a Life Member in 2014, having served on the Council for 21 years.

#### FA Referee Courses

# This year we recruited and trained 362 trainee referees (formerly known as Level 9s) from across Essex, who all successfully qualified over the 16 FA Referee Courses held.

Detailed below is a short review of the total number of learners we trained from July 2018 to June 2019.

#### FA Referee Course

During the course of the 2018/19 season, 337 learners were trained to become a referee over the 16 FA Referee Courses we delivered across the county, utilising the following venues: University of Essex (Colchester), Writtle University College (Chelmsford), Lakeside Sports Ground (Thurrock), Wickford Town FC (Wickford), Forest Row Centre (Havering).

#### FA Futsal Referee Course

We delivered our first FA Futsal Referee Course in over two years. Ten learners were trained at the University of Essex (Colchester) in refereeing Futsal.

#### Refereeing Walking Football Workshop

Walking Football is a fairly new and fast-developing format of football. In partnership with the Essex Walking Football League, we delivered a Refereeing Walking Football Workshop, at which 15 learners attended Beauchamps High School (Basildon) to be upskilled in refereeing this format.

# **Essex Clubs in National Competitions 2018/19**

There was late-season drama for both of Essex's Football League teams at the end of the 2018/19 campaign but, ultimately, the status quo was maintained as Southend United dramatically ensured their League One survival with Steven Humphrys' 87th-minute winner in a televised fixture against Sunderland at Roots Hall on the final day.

**Colchester United** were seconds away from earning a play-off place in League Two after crushing champions Lincoln City 3-0 at Sincil Bank. However, Jamille Matt netted an 87th-minute equaliser for Newport County away to Morecambe and the Welsh club pipped The U's by a point.

There was little for the county's clubs to cheer in the National League. **Dagenham & Redbridge** completed the campaign in 18th position, whilst **Braintree Town**'s stay in the top tier of non-league football lasted just one season. Despite a late rally, the Iron finished six points from safety.

**Chelmsford City** qualified for the National League South play-offs for the third year in succession, but they were defeated 3-2 by Welling United in the semi-finals. **Concord Rangers** finished sixth, missing out on a play-off place due to ground grading regulations, with **Billericay Town** in eighth. The Blues failed to reach the play-offs by one point on the final day of the season.

**East Thurrock United**'s three-year life in the National South ended as they were relegated to the Isthmian League Premier Division, where **Brightlingsea Regent** had just enjoyed a best-ever finish of 13th. **AFC Hornchurch** placed two positions lower, but **Harlow Town** were relegated to the South Central Division, finishing bottom. Essex held a monopoly over the top North Division positions.

**Bowers & Pitsea** were crowned champions by twelve points, earning promotion to Step 3 for the first time. **Aveley, Maldon & Tiptree, Coggeshall Town** and **Heybridge Swifts** qualified for the play-offs, with Swifts defeating rivals Maldon on penalties in the final. However, due the reorganisation of Step 4 football, their 'points per game' record was insufficient to see them promoted.

At the opposite end of the table, **Romford** were handed a reprieve from relegation due to North Ferriby United folding at Step 3 during the campaign. They would be joined in the North Division by **Hullbridge Sports**, who won the Essex Senior League. Step 4 football in 2019/20 would represent the highest level they have ever competed at.

**Barkingside** and **Leyton Athletic** were relegated to Step 6 from the Essex Senior League, but there was promotion at the first time of asking for **Hashtag United**, who held off the challenge of **Coggeshall United** and **Halstead Town** to claim the Eastern Senior League title.

In The FA Cup, **Billericay Town** reached the First Round Proper, losing 3-1 to National League outfit Chesterfield in a replay at New Lodge. **Southend United**, who entered at that stage, were beaten 4-2 by Barnsley in the Second Round, whilst **Colchester United** lost 1-0 away to Accrington Stanley in the First Round.

**Dagenham & Redbridge** prolonged Essex participation in the FA Trophy to the Second Round stage before losing 2-0 at National League Salford City. **Brightlingsea Regent** reached the Third Qualifying Round but lost 2-1 in a replay at North Road against Hayes & Yeading United. Aveley progressed from the Extra Preliminary to the Second Qualifying Round before losing to Beaconsfield Town.

**FC Clacton** and **Hullbridge Sports** represented Essex in the Third Round Proper of the FA Vase, going out to Deeping Rangers and Newport Pagnall Town respectively. Step 6 side **May & Baker Eastbrook Community** enjoyed their first outing in the competition as they reached the Second Round Proper before losing 1-0 to Swaffham Town.

There were impressive runs to the First Round Proper of the FA Youth Cup for **Hullbridge Sports** and **Brentwood Town** before both were beaten by Football League opposition. Hullbridge were defeated 2-0 by Peterborough United at Lower Road, whilst Brentwood enjoyed a trip to Kenilworth Road, whey they lost 4-1 to Luton Town.

Southend United were knocked out in the Second Round by Charlton Athletic. Meanwhile, in the FA Women's Cup, there was a superb run to the Third Round Proper for **Billericay** Town Ladies before they were edged out by Loughborough Foxes, 4-3, at New Lodge. C & K Basildon, who entered in the Second Round Proper, were beaten 8-3 by Keynsham Town.



### **Coaches**

The 2018/19 season saw the largest and most varied Coach Education Programme to date, with record numbers of learners completing qualifications such as the FA Level 1 in Coaching Football and the FA Introduction to First Aid in Football.

Following a review of the previous season, changes and improvements to our course offer were made, in order to provide further flexibility for learners and to meet the ever-growing demand in volume. Feedback was positive from learners, with emphasis upon course content, delivery and organisation.

With a focus on supporting youth teams to have a qualified coach, the 2018/19 season ended with 89.7% of youth teams meeting these criteria. The target for the 2019/20 season is 95%.

#### **Coaching Support**

#### In addition to our formal qualifications, we also encouraged coaches to access a wide range of free resources and support. Face-to-face support was offered throughout the season via multiple workshops.

Events were aimed at coaches working within specific age phases and were well-attended, with over 600 individuals accessing these opportunities. Many clubs and leagues promoted the events and we plan to continue working with these key partners to raise both the profile and standard of coaching across Essex.

The 2018/19 season also saw a series of 'showcase' coaching events held across the county, aimed at engaging and supporting a wider audience. They linked closely to the 'England DNA' and the ethos being promoted throughout the new coaching pathway.

Guests included Pete Sturgess (FA Technical Lead - Foundation Phase), Ian Bateman (FA Youth Coach Educator - Futsal) and Tom Weal (Head of Academy Goalkeeping at Norwich City FC).

The FA Coach Mentor Programme continues to provide on-the-ground support to a wide range of coaches and clubs across Essex. Our twelve mentors were linked to Group Areas, allowing a more joined-up approach with Football Development Officers and creating stronger local relationships.

We have also introduced 'project leads' allocated to specific areas of the game such as women and girls, inclusion and post-course support. Over one thousand hours of support were provided in the 2018/19 season.

## Adult

### The landscape of adult football participation has mirrored the national picture, with the decline in the adult 11v11 game showing a 67-team decrease this season.

However, in contrary to the national picture, we have seen the decline slow over the 2018/19 campaign. Comparatively, season 16/17 saw a 115-team decline, before 17/18 witnessed a 75-team loss. The forecast for Essex over the coming seasons is to see the net loss slow, while alternative formats of the adult game continue to grow.

As with youth leagues, we worked with adult football providers across Essex to ensure they had an accurate and relevant report to continue to inform strategic decisions on their respective organisations. Key outcomes included an understanding of specific challenges and reviewing bespoke targets which are currently in-line with our 'Moving Forward' Strategy for 2018-21.

These started to be implemented across the 2018/19 season. Once again, additional funding has been allocated to reward sustainable adult clubs with two or more teams through the Football Foundation's funding scheme.

Previously known as 'Retain the Game', the newly branded grant 'Stay in the Game' saw a record 35 successful applications, meaning nearly £30,000 will be going to adult football in Essex over the coming season, supporting facility, equipment or course costs.

In addition, £300 support grants were awarded to 17 Mars Just Play centres, allowing for alternative ways to consume the game and retain more players. Furthermore, two flexi-football leagues have launched at Beauchamps High School in Wickford and the University of Essex, meaning even more opportunities to experience football in new and innovative formats.

# <u>Clubs</u>

The FA Charter Standard Youth percentage increased from 82.61 to 85.49%. Clubs, continued to ensure they were adhering to the criteria and that all teams within the club had an FA Level 1 Coach assigned to them, ensuring our children were in a safe, fun and inclusive environment while learning the game.

The demand from clubs for specific Annual Health Check Workshops reduced over the course of the season, which was seen positively that The FA's online Whole Game System was a user-friendly administrative tool and that volunteers were becoming more familiar with the process.

The Charter Standard Club criteria remained, and there have been no changes for the season. All Coach Education qualifications and the Annual Health Check now fall in-line with one another and Charter Standard clubs were still eligible for a bursary to reduce the price of coaching courses. The Charter Standard Adult percentage increased from 30.75% to 33.6%.

Some clubs who joined the accreditation scheme in general were FC Mexico, Academy Soccer, West Ham United Girls and Project 10. We continue to increase the number of Charter Standard Leagues across the county, too. Those listed below continue to put the accreditation at the forefront of their work and drive the core elements into the grassroots environments here in Essex:

- Southend & District Junior Sunday League
- Essex County Girls' League
- Essex Soccability League
- Colchester & District Youth League

The Development Team have worked proactively with several adult leagues, including: Mid Essex League, ProKit UK Essex Olympian League, Southend Borough Combination Veterans League. This has enabled the launch of Introduction to First Aid in Football (IFAIF) courses to support their non-Charter Standard Clubs with qualifications to meet the league criteria.

Eight clubs across the county have been identified to be part of the 'Middle Tier' club pilot which The FA are running to help support and shape the Club Improvement Programme which will be launching in season 2019/20. Also, as part of an FA Roadshow we, as a County FA, hosted an FA Club Improvement Workshop.

# **Women and Girls**

#### Essex County Schools FA Representative Football

#### One of the most prestigious highlights of the season was the immense pride everyone involved with the Schools Girls County Squads felt when the Under 14s Girls team lifted the National Cup.

The girls faced a strong Lancashire side who fought until the final whistle. The fixture went to extra time and penalties, which saw Essex lift the trophy for the second time in the competition's history. The Under 14s were also runners-up in the South-East England Schools FA (SEESFA) Competition, losing out to a committed Middlesex side at the new Rectory Park facility.

Meanwhile, the Schools' Under 16s Girls Squad made it to the English Schools FA's National Quarter-Finals, losing out to a strong Kent side. Unfortunately, the girls were also defeated by a talented Hertfordshire side within the SEESFA League. This was the first time they hadn't been victorious in eleven years!

# Essex can now boast 53 SSE Wildcats Centres. There are 33 new centres, and 20 were retained centres from Years 1 and 2. Credit must go to each programme for delivering a quality product for girls aged 5-11 for 16 weeks.

The affiliation figures for girls' mini-soccer continue to remain positive. Numbers continued to rise, peaking at 62 teams with the SSE Wildcats centres continuing to have a huge influence on these statistics. We have seen particular growth in the Under 7s and 8s age groups, with the number of girls' teams at this age playing within youth leagues increasing year-on-year.



#### **Player Development Centre**

The Essex County FA Girls' Player Development Centre (PDC) continues to be driven by She Can Play. The programme provides a great opportunity for aspiring female players, but also enables female coaches to access an environment to develop their skill set and gain the confidence to take the next step on their coaching path.

PDC trials took place at Noak Hill in Romford and attracted nearly 200 girls across four age groups: Under 10, 12s, 14s and 16s. The Girls' PDC is now in its ninth season. The technical programme runs sessions once a week over 30 weeks at Noak Hill. The programme attracts nearly 200 girls who attend the trial process, with 80 players being successful in obtaining a place.



#### **Regional Talent Club**

#### Essex's Regional Talent Club (RTC) is still a Tier 2 Licence of the Elite Female Player Pathway. RTC centres nationally remain at 34 clubs, across three tiers.

The programme will be in its seventh year at the start of the 2019/20 season, and the trials saw over 150 females attending. Our female coaching network continues to grow, with Carla Dickinson, Paige Wakefield and Krista Osman all supporting the development of female players and heightening their development within the game.

Throughout the season, the Centre had England Under 16s call-ups for both Maddie Biggs and Sara Smith Walter and, from the Under 14s, Ellie Moore, Mia Filipiak and Kelsey Moore were selected to play within the Under 15s camps and tournaments.

# **Disability**

Disability football continues to grow within Essex, with 66 teams affiliated around the county. There has been increased engagement from mainstream FA Charter Standard clubs looking to engage within disability and adding Soccability under their club banner.

As a result, there has been growth in Youth Soccability, which has also aided in the sustainability of these opportunities. 20 of the 66 sides participate in our countywide competition. The Adult Soccability League is run by the County FA, and has central venues in Colchester and Southend.

The Adult League has 20 teams across four divisions (Premiership, Championship, League 1 and League 2). Members of the Essex Soccability League entered the 11v11 South-East Regional Disability Cup. The Youth Soccability League has become independent, and each club hosts an event on a monthly basis catering for Under 12s to 16s, with five per age group.

Each season, we deliver a minimum of 16 Schools Soccability Events (four per Group Area), which have grown season-on-season and are open to mainstream schools, SEN departments. Overall, we engage with 175 young people.

We also launched our editable Mental Health Poster for clubs to download, add their name and place in their clubhouses, handbooks and websites featuring guidance and useful contacts. Plus, we launched three new Wellbeing Sessions across the county which have all been well-received.

College Soccability continues to grow, with Lancaster School Sixth Form attending for the first time and bringing two new teams. The events are all hosted at PlayFootball Southend and teams come from all over the countu.

We delivered an FA Level 1 Coaching Course in partnership with the Essex Soccability League where we had 13 individuals attend, either with a disability/impairment or with an interest in working in the disability game. The course was delivered on a bi-weekly basis, with support provided from the tutor and FA Coach Mentors throughout.

Prior to the course, a taster event enabled those interested in attending to meet each other, the tutor and FA Coach Mentors - reducing anxiety and enabling participants to ask relevant questions before committing. Also, tutors were able to assess participants ensuring they had the required skills and knowledge to attend under 1st4Sports criteria.

The course took place in Colchester and throughout the eleven-week programme participants built their confidence and abilities. The indoor venue provided good wheelchair access and created a better environment for those with a hearing impairment. All 14 learners successfully passed and are now working as coaches in their clubs.

Baddow Spartak have been one of the first mainstream clubs to incorporate disability under their banner and they have gone from strength to strength.

We additionally hosted the FA Disability People's Cup. 26 sides entered the competition on 24th February 2019 at PlayFootball Southend. There were four categories: Premiership, Championship, League 1 and Youth Under 16s. The event was well-attended and a great opportunity to showcase disability football.

Talent Identification Day was delivered in March, which progressed onto a Talent Hub delivered by Disability4Sport. The Talent Day was popular, with ten in the Under 16s age group and 15 in the Under 12s.

We also had two England Impairment Internationals attend and support on the day: Bailey Fleming and Grace Leavett. The hub has been very successful, with a number of players attending.

# **Football Futures and Youth Forum**

The 2018/19 season saw the Essex County FA Youth Forum continue to evolve, with Ciaran Whatley of Hawkwell Athletic FC as Chairperson and Gemma Stubbles as Vice-Chairperson.

Alfie Davidson of Frinton & Walton FC represented the Essex County FA at The FA's National Leadership Academy in July 2019 and has outlined several ideas within the Youth Forum. Gemma Stubbles was also in attendance as a Mentor for the Youth Leaders working alongside the FA National Game Youth Council.

As part of our plan for the season, seven County Cup Finals were supported by the Youth Forum, including fan engagement activities at the BBC Essex Senior Cup Final.

The Football Futures Programme, which is overseen by The FA, remains under review. We have, however, supported many young people with volunteering opportunities.




### **Recreational**

In 2018/19, we implemented The FA's Recreational Strategy to deliver a wide range of football opportunities across the county. These ranged from Walking Football sessions to Just Play Centres running countywide, the latter in partnership with Mars.

Throughout the season there were 13 Just Play Centres, three of which were Walking Football. In addition, the Walking Football Centres have aided the development of the Essex Walking Football League (EWFL).

As part of our partnership with the EWFL, we have looked to further develop participation by signposting players from the centres into competitive matches across three divisions: Over 50s, Over 60s and Over 65s.

### **Small-Sided**

Small-sided football has remained steady in the 2018/19 season, with a number of commercial providers operating across the county and new 3G pitches hosting leagues during off-peak periods.

We also saw a couple of our small-sided providers starting to look at developing female leagues, with a Ladies League launched at Basildon Sporting Village by Powerplay.

Work has continued to make sure all our small-sided football providers are affiliating their competitions, and our Referee Development Officers have ensured registered referees are aware of unaffiliated providers and the consequences of officiating in their leagues.

# **Youth Leagues**

Partnerships with youth leagues have strengthened throughout the 2018/19 season. Essex youth leagues continue to provide opportunities for young people across the county, raising standards and developing the game every season.

The youth leagues within Essex facilitate approximately 38,332 participants, and we've seen countywide growth of 26 teams, equating to a further 238 players enjoying the game.

Moving into the 2019/20 season, we will see the introduction of the first phases of the national 12-16 participation review, and we'll be working closely with all stakeholders to ensure as many young people across Essex get to have their say in influencing and shaping the future of their game.

As we enter the new season we will, once again, be holding a Youth League Forum for our leagues to share best practice, feedback and ideas. Last season's event, the first of its kind, saw fantastic representation from all our youth leagues.

With the landscape of youth football always evolving, innovative ideas and formats will be explored as we continue to see it develop. Optional rules such as 'Power Play' will be expanded from two of our youth leagues to a wider proportion of youth football across Essex, ensuring all young people are appropriately challenged and, ultimately, enjoy and love the game.

A big part of the responsibility of their enjoyment sits within the volunteer and coaching workforce who facilitate football. The 2018/19 season saw great attendance to our Foundation and Youth Phase Continuing Professional Development (CPD) events.

Nearly 200 coaches were engaged, continuing to develop their environments. Once again, we will ensure these free events are accessible countywide.

Finally, a nationally-recognised data and insight project saw staff from all areas of the organisation meet leagues across the county, producing a bespoke league report for committees to utilise and help shape the direction of their leagues.

# **Futsal**

The 2018/19 season saw Futsal continue to grow, and more football clubs adopting Futsal provision. In the 2017/18 season, 17 clubs offered either a bespoke or dual Futsal offer, with 2018/19 growing to a combined 36 clubs.

Educational teams were also included, with the University of Essex, Anglia Ruskin University and Writtle University College all offering Futsal as either a part of their educational programme or part of their sports participation programme.

The increase in participation highlights the countywide appetite to create alternative offers and explore different formats of the game. The Southend & District Junior League continued to offer Futsal as an alternative to football during winter months, whilst the Brentwood Community Football Alliance Youth League embedded it as part of their Foundation Phase offering.

Similarly, more Foundation Phase opportunities were offered in North Essex, with Braintree Futsal utilising the University of Essex's fantastic arena to host Under 8s, 9s and 10s Boys' and Girls' provisions.

Eight FA Level One in Coaching Futsal Courses engaged 168 learners and continued to support and develop the growing workforce. Plus our County Futsal Competition for Under 10s through to 16s was open to schools and grassroots clubs this year. Each Group Area held specific qualification rounds before progressing to finals held at the University of Essex in Colchester.

The average number of players the competitions and affiliated game affected (based on an average of ten players, approximately taken from the FA National Game Strategy), was 3,600.

Finally, for the first time, The FA released the 'Fast Forward with Futsal' Strategy, something we have aligned with our the existing 'Moving Forward' countywide strategy. It sets out ambitious targets, ensuring every young person can experience both football and Futsal, not having to choose one over the other.

By 2024, we want a network of venues, structurally-sound leagues and a workforce to accommodate Futsal both as a stand-alone game and a key development tool for football.



# **Facilities and Funding**

County Development Manager, Nick Emery and Football Foundation Manager, Graham Turner, continued the work of developing Local Football Facility Plans (LFFP) for each local authority (LA) in Essex alongside Sports Consultants Kavanagh, Knight & Page (KKP).

A series of meetings were held with LAs across the county to establish the needs of grassroots football across four investment pillars: 3G Pitch Provision, Changing Rooms/Pavilions, Grass Pitch Improvement and Small-Sided Football.

The plans will act as an investment portfolio for each LA, reflecting the National Football Facilities Strategy requirement to develop a sustainable network of quality facilities and drive participation across all parts of the game.

Alongside the LFFP, work continued to support LAs through their individual Playing Pitch Strategy (PPS) assessments. These are important strategic documents aiming to identify the future needs for football facilities within each LA by assessing the qualitative and quantitative impact of their football pitches.

They assess current participation rates, future population and housing growth, as well as future team generation rates. This process also includes assessments on the current and future need of 3G Artificial Grass Pitches (AGPs) for training and match play purposes.

During the 2018/19 season, four projects were submitted to the Football Foundation (FF) panel with all three successfully approved for a grant. Details of these projects can be found in the table below.

#### FA 3G Pitch Register

#### There has been a growth in the number of 3G pitches listed within Essex on the FA 3G Pitch Register during the 2018/19 season. It requires that all 3G Football Turf Pitches used for affiliated match play should meet the standards set in the FA 3G Pitch Performance Test.

This ensures there is a high-quality standard across all 3G pitches. There are now 42 pitches (of varying sizes) within Essex listed on the register (up from 30 during 2015). This has ensured that football matches continue to get played in adverse weather conditions.

#### **Protection of Football Facilities**

### The protection of existing football facilities is a key priority for football. Housing growth is playing a significant factor in the development of future facilities.

Disused football facilities can be at risk of being lost or reallocated for other purposes as part of LA Local Plans to identify key sites for housing growth, with submission to the Government for approval. PPSs are an important assessment tool in the process. A lot of time and effort is invested into protecting football sites.

We work closely with Sport England to comment on, and provide evidence in regard to, any sites which could be lost to football to ensure they are not lost or to ensure replacement facilities are developed to offset any potential loss of pitch stock. Over the course of the 2018/19 season, we commented on 42 different planning applications.



#### FA Pitch Improvement Programme

Pitch maintenance continued to be a challenge to the development of the grassroots game in the 2018/19 season. Local authorities are under increasing budget pressures and constraints, which are beginning to filter into the quality of pitches at the grassroots level.

Subsidies are being cut and pitch maintenance programmes are being reduced in cost-cutting measures, impacting on the price of pitches, as well as their quality. The FA Pitch Improvement Programme (PIP) has had a positive affect within Essex.

The programme is a partnership with the Institute of Groundsmanship to provide specific advice and guidance to football clubs on pitch maintenance and improvement. The Regional Pitch Advisor visited 31 new sites (159 new pitches), producing a detailed report for the operator.

As well as this, we organised two workshops (In-Season and Out-of-Season Pitch Maintenance) at Concord Rangers FC and Maldon & Tiptree FC respectively.

#### FA 'Parklife' Programme

### The London Borough of Barking & Dagenham (LBBD) have been continuing to develop a Parklife development at Parsloes Park.

The current plan for the site is to develop three 3G pitches (one of which will be a stadium development) and an eight-team changing ancillary build, which will also include a gym and a studio. The project has currently secured the following funding pots:

A funding application has been submitted to the Football Foundation for  $\pounds$ 6,388,062 which may rise, with a decision expected in March 2020. The development has now received planning permission from the local authority, and through the Greater London Authority.

The next stage for the programme is to go out for construction tender and operator procurement - for which the Football Foundation are aiming to source a National Operator. The timeline is scheduled for an opening from September 2021.

#### Essex County FA Small Grants Scheme

The Small Grants Scheme was launched in January 2016. It is designed to provide funding support to organisations who are having difficulty securing funding for capital projects.

More than  $\pm 6,000$  was reinvested back into grassroots football during the 2018/19 season, as set out below:

#### Football Foundation 'Grow the Game' and 'Stay In The Game' Funding

We identified, and supported, the allocation of funding through the Football Foundation's 'Grow the Game' Scheme, which provides money towards new football activity, with funding being used towards kit, equipment, facility hire, coaching qualifications and affiliation fees.

The Football Foundation (FF) changed their criteria for 2018, with a greater emphasis on the direct support of the creation of new women's, girls' and disability teams. In previous years, criteria also looked to aid the creation of new adult male teams.

However, a new funding stream called 'Stay in the Game' now has a greater emphasis on supporting existing teams, rather than the creation of teams. A £1,500 grant per new team was awarded to each of the following clubs during 2018/19. This was a total investment into Essex of £112,500 for the development of new teams and participation.

# Association of Colleges Sport Funding: English Colleges FA College Football Hubs

The FA have partnered with British Universities and Colleges Sport (BUCS) and the English Colleges FA (ECFA) to support the development of grassroots football across England through the introduction of 'FA College & University Grassroots Hubs'.

All college football hubs will be expected to engage and retain new players from the college and the community (30% female, 10% disability, 10% BAME), retain baselines and grow community and student football by a minimum of 5% each year, as per funded targets.

- retain and grow male and female, adult and youth participation
- develop inclusive playing pathways for football and Futsal which offer a wide variety of flexibility, including playing opportunities for the local community
- embed student leadership programmes at every college and university hub, ٠ which generate more and better coaches, referees and volunteers to service the grassroots game
- open up facilities to support grassroots football clubs to gain access to sustainable • use of new and existing sports facilities
- this is achieved via a collaborative approach, involving a wide range of football • stakeholders such as the education sectors (schools, colleges and universities), County FAs, affiliated clubs and local charities

The College Grassroots Hub pillars are: Operating Standards, Community Football, Student Football, Collaborative Working and Developing a Workforce. Colleges funded include: Palmer's College (Tier 3), South Essex College (Tier 3), Barking & Dagenham College (Tier 3), Sir George Monoux College.

### **University of Essex**

# The University of Essex (UoE) continued to grow their partnership with The FA and ourselves, through the investment into higher education by holding a hybrid Tier 1 status.

Significant football development success has taken place at the hub site, with the appointment of a full time development officer in-post from October 2018.

The new state-of-the-art sports arena is utilised as a fantastic hub site for Futsal at the UoE. with our club Under 10s, 12s, 14s and 16s Futsal Club Qualifiers, plus all female county events, staged at the site. In addition to the club finals, the Under 13s and 15s boys' and girls schools events were also hosted at the venue, supported by students who took the FA Referee Futsal gualification.

A new Foundation Phase weekly Futsal offer launched from November 2018, offering Under 8s and 10s and female-only mini-soccer groups the opportunity to learn about Futsal in a festival-based programme, delivered in partnership with Braintree Futsal Club.

The site has become a key hub for coach education, with an FA Level 1 Course delivered to 18 students from the Sports Coaching & Performance Degree, along with an FA Level 1 Futsal qualification plus County Futsal CPD.

Moving forward for the 2019/20 season, there is a significant coach education offer: 7 x FA Level 1 Courses, 2 x FA Level 1 Futsal, 1 x FA Level 2 Futsal, 1 x Introduction to First Aid, 1 x FA Level 2 Blocks 1, 2 and 3.

# **Equality and Inclusion**

We continue to promote equality and inclusion throughout the organisation and the wider workforce, including promotion of a number of religious occasions and international days through our social media accounts.

We continued to work with Stonewall and The FA to support the Rainbow Laces Campaign (for the second season). This campaign was even bigger and better than the season before. We worked with three leagues - Essex Corinthian, Essex Alliance and Pope & Smith Chelmsford Sunday - as well as our County Cup games to see over 25 matches dedicated to the campaign.

Following on from the Level 1 Coaching Course which was delivered in partnership with the Muslimah Sports Association (MSA), the project was nominated for the first ever For All Award at the London Football Awards, alongside the London and Surrey County FA's.

The project with the MSA went on to win the prestigious award. We also continue to support various projects across the county, including working alongside the African Nations Cup, Braintree Mosque and the Southend Mosque.

# **Safeguarding and Welfare**

In April 2019, the Essex County FA were assessed for the second time by an independent company appointed by The FA to measure the compliancy and effectiveness of safeguarding. The assessment covered many aspects of the game, and now includes Adults at Risk.

Inspectors assess against stringent targets, to ascertain that measures have been met. The County FA passed this assessment, with the assessors commenting on the strengths within the county. These included the excellent support Club Welfare Officers receive and the Parent Workshop offered to support clubs.

One of the assessors' comments was: "with the strong teamwork shown within Essex County FA, we believe that the children and young people in Essex will be able to play and enjoy football in a safer environment."

The department is also proactive in communicating with individuals who require to renew their FA DBS (Disclosure and Barring Service) Check. This not only supports individuals and clubs, but also allows the County FA to take appropriate steps for non-compliancy.

To support the safeguarding workforce, training events were offered throughout the season. This included a Safeguarding Conference in April 2019. As with previous conferences, it was well-attended and feedback was very positive, highlighting the dedication the volunteer workforce displays to implement and support safeguarding in football.

We conducted safeguarding visits during the season, meeting coaches, parents and committee members. Part of this process was to check compliancy with DBS requirements, reassuring parents/carers that their children are participating in a safe environment.

It also gives staff the opportunity to meet clubs and participants. New for the season was speaking to the players, asking them questions about the game with the overall message that under 18s participate in football "to have fun."

In delivering the department strategy, the we introduced the new Fair Play Awards. The revised scheme was operated via Facebook, encouraging participants to nominate incidents displaying fair play and respect which went beyond the normal expectations. This proved very successful, with the public voting for the overall winner being Hedingham United Under 12s (Hawks).

To meet the increasing needs of a large county, Chloe Hookins (Safeguarding Support Officer), has now joined the team. Managing cases is also a major aspect of the department and, in-line with FA policies and procedures, concerns are reported and logged.

To further support Welfare Officers, a newsletter was created and shared, detailing forthcoming events. Included was the integration of the DBS within the Whole Game System, along with a resources section on our website.

# **Press, Publicity and Marketing**

#### <u>Website</u>

essexfa.com is the central information point for grassroots football stakeholders. The wide range of pages are regularly updated, with ongoing section reviews. News stories are the most regular additions, with maintenance of existing pages and other new ones being added.

177 articles were published in 2019/20, which was up on the 144 the previous season, and we met or exceeded our strategy target of 16 stories every month in 2019. These are also picked-up by other newspapers and websites, which has led to additional external coverage on websites such as TheFA.com and bbc.co.uk.

As well as supporting our own strategy targets across the organisation, our website promotes a number of FA campaigns and projects such as the SuperKicks app for youth activity, the #WeOnlyDoPositive initiative for Respect, the FA Matchday admin app and the Boot Room coaches' portal.

### Referee

The website is attracting increasing visitor numbers, with 174,952 unique website visitors recorded across the campaign, which was higher month-on-month in 2019 compared to the corresponding months in 2018. This is of additional appeal to our partners, such as Replay Maintenance.

### Social Media

Twitter and Facebook remain as key mobile engagement and promotional vehicles for County FA information and news. We're interacting with stakeholders and evolving our social media presence every minute of every day, growing our audience and network.

During 2019, our audience of Twitter followers grew to 21,222 (a growth of 2,375), with 8,893 tweets being dispatched (this was 6,345 the previous season). These tweets generated 16,950,000 impressions and the account's profile was visited on 214,231 occasions. On Facebook, the number of likes grew from 8,155 to 8,971, meaning there were 816 new likes compared to 404 in 2017/18.

An enhanced refereeing and coaching presence has been achieved on Twitter through the @EssexReferees and @EssexCoaches accounts, while the #SquadBooster hashtag has continued to provide huge support to the player-to-club matching service on our website, with 871 submissions from teams using the improved online form.

In addition, Twitter was used to facilitate the #CelebrateEssex volunteer awards and 104 nominations were made during 2018/19, attracting 8,703 votes. A new Fair Play Awards format was introduced on Facebook and a League Social Media Workshop took place during the summer, which was very well-received by the competitions who benefited from attendance.



Meanwhile, our most focussed FA Grassroots Football Survey ever was completed by a wide range of stakeholders.

Our GDPR-compliant, monthly branded newsletter was published to keep people informed via E-Mail. In terms of publications, our best ever Annual Report document was published, as were the seasonal County and Schools Handbooks and a brochure to details the targets and aims of the Essex County FA 'Moving Forward' Strategy 2018-21.

#### **Branding & Commercial**

It's important to maintain a defined image to help us achieve specific, strategic goals. In partnership with a branding partner we've produced and displayed infographics to use online and in hard copy, as well as signage for events such as the Senior Cup Final, the Awards Evening and County Cup Finals. We're also delivering commercially alongside companies such as Vesey and Replay.
