Course Confirmation

 any activities of the Association. I also understand that I may not be able to receive a refund if I fail to
 notify WRCFA that I will not be attending the course.

Course Cancellations/Transfer

- If notification of a cancellation or transfer is received with more than 7 days notice, either in writing or by e-mail to Info@Westridingfa.com, a FULL REFUND or a FREE COURSE TRANSFER will be issued.
- The following charges will be made on course transfers:-

- If a cancellation/transfer is received within 7 days of the beginning of the course, NO REFUND will be issued.
- Candidates who have transferred to an alternative full course who then cancel, will not be entitled to a refund.
- If you fail to notify the West Riding County FA or fail to attend the course, then NO REFUND can be issued. However, in certain circumstances i.e. illness (upon receipt of a doctors certificate) a refund will be considered, at the discretion of the Head of Football Development (Joanne de Tute).

Practical involvement

Some courses may be physically demanding. Students will be required to participate in practical sessions. Students should come prepared and be physically fit when arriving on the course.

Please note that if a student has a disability that may prevent them participating actively in the practical sessions, then this should be made known to the course organiser at the point of registration. The course organiser will then take any necessary steps to cater for the student's requirements which may include bringing in footballers to ensure there are sufficient numbers of players.

Medical Information

If you have any medical conditions which limit/hinder your involvement or participation in coaching activities, you are obliged to declare any relevant, current or previous injuries/illnesses. If you are diagnosed as an asthmatic, diabetic or epileptic, or have any allergies that the course staff needs to be aware of, you must advise us accordingly. Please note, a declaration of injury or illness does not automatically preclude you from any course.

You should further be aware that if you are on a regular course of medication for any condition, you must have

sufficient medication to cover you throughout the course. Although first aid cover is provided (where applicable) during courses, no doctor is available to replenish regular medication, nor is there any facility to deliver medical treatment for chronic (longstanding) medical conditions.
